### NARRATIVE

While assigned to sector 6 this officer investigated a report of a residential breaking and entering at 781 Concord Turnpike. [REDACTED] states sometime between 08:00-16:00 hrs on 02/12/2004 (while she was at work) her home was entered through a basement window that faces the street

(south). She observed the damage this morning but waited until this evening to report the incident.

Taken from her first floor bedroom mattress was five \$100 dollar bills. She also discovered that her bureau drawer where she normally keeps her money had been disturbed. Ms. [REDACTED] also believes the suspect left her home via the kitchen door due to the dead bolt being found in the unlocked position. [REDACTED] believes a possible suspect may be Brendan Reilly (#79 Glenburn Rd. DOB [REDACTED]/1986 Tel# [REDACTED] who is friends with her son [REDACTED] Reilly has been in the house many times in the past and would have known that money is kept in the bedroom bureau.

This officer observed a 2 foot by 4 foot basement sliding window damaged (point of entrance). Several footprints (sneaker type shoe) were observed by the front walkway for which [REDACTED] said were not there the day before. Four Photographs were taken by this officer (see attached). Ms [REDACTED] was advised that there may be an attempt to retrieve fingerprints from the basement window and bureau drawer. The shoe print near the front walkway is being protected by a large trash barrel in case an impression needs to be created . This Officer questioned neighboring residents about this incident with negative results.
