## NARRATIVE

On the above date and time and while assigned to patrol in Sector 3, this officer was dispatched to the intersection of Grove and Dudley Street for a bicyclist who had taken a fall. Upon arrival, Sgt. Flynn and Fire personnel were already on scene attempting to administer first aid to a party known to me as Brendan Reilly. Two parties, and and stated they

unsuccessful. stated that he and Reilly v	were riding their bikes
side by side and Reilly hit a parked car.	

Reilly was unable to answer questions such as "what is the day of the week" or "where do you live". This officer informed the paramedics that from past dealing with Reilly he was normally slightly alltered but this was far worse than I had ever encountered him. Reilly was persistently denying medical attention to the point of being combative. It was the opinion of Armstrong Paramedics that if he did not voluntarily go that he would have to be forcefully restrained. After much convincing Reilly finally placed himself on the back board and was transported to Lahey Clinic by Armstrong ALS and BLS.

Upon arrival, at the station for my afternoon shift I was informed by Sgt. McNamee that he spoke with the Head Nurse of the Emergency Room of Lahey Clinic, name unavailable. The nurse stated they still did not have the identity of the party that had been transported this morning and that they needed to notify family of his medical situation. Sgt. McNamee provided them with Reilly's information and was told by Lahey that he had suffered serious, life-threatening injuries. Inspector Fitzpatrick was able to reach Reilly's father.

Reilly, by cell phone and inform him of his son's situation and stated that he was on his way to the hospital.

This officer contacted Lahey clinic and was informed that Reilly as under the care of Dr. Wei in the Surgical Services Unit. No other information was released. Additionally, this officer placed calls to both and without success. While working on this report, I received a telephone call from Reilly. Mr. Reilly stated that Brendan is still sedated and they are still running tests, however, his

injuries were no longer life-threatening. Mr. Reilly thanked us for getting his son medical attention.
