On 3 January 2006 at approximately 01:11hrs, Sgt. Towle/car4, Ofc. Grey/car3 and I (Ofc. Henckler/car5) responded to 17 Reeves Road for a report of a (non-physical) domestic between father and son.

Upon arrival, Sgt. Towle and I met with the father [REDACTED] Reilly and mother, [REDACTED] Reilly. [REDACTED] related that his son, Brendan has become very agitated and he was afraid that it would turn into a physical confrontation. [REDACTED] stated that Brendan has seen a therapist in the past and is currently on medication for anxiety and depression. [REDACTED] said within the past couple of weeks Brendan has been coming home at night agitated and confrontational. [REDACTED] mentioned that Brendan gets like this when he smokes marijuana while on his medication. [REDACTED] would like Brendan to see a doctor tonight to be evaluated.

I then met with Brendan, he was very agitated and rambling on about not being respected in his home. Brendan related that he wanted to talk to his parents about his sister's boyfriend that he did not like. Brendan said that [REDACTED] would not give him the respect he deserved and would not discuss the matter with him anymore. Brendan refused to answer any additional question's. My observation's of Brendan as follows: Brendan appeared to be extremely agitated, confused and was repeating himself constantly while pacing all over. Brendan would stare down anybody that was in his close proximity and act like he was going to challenge us. Brendan would not listen to our discussion in regards to him being seen by a doctor. Brendan would go on a rant about going to the funny farm or loony bin. Ofc. Grey and I explained that he would see a doctor at Emerson Hospital, it would be in his best interest that he would go on his own. Brendan after a lengthy debate decided that he would go with his father to Emerson for the evaluation.

Brendan's primary psychiatrist is Dr. Cluett of the Outpatient Department at Mcleans Hospital. Dr. Cluett's Staff would not assist the family and the Bedford Police with obtaining a section 12 and recommended that we take him to the local Emergency Room.

[REDACTED] and Brendan drove in their own vehicle to Emerson Hospital with Ofc. Grey and I followed from behind in car3,

Dr. Weatherbee was the attending doctor. Dr. Weatherbee requested that Ofc. Grey and I remain until he felt that Brendan would pose no threat to the hospital staff.

Dr. Weatherbee was unable to conduct the evaluation because Brendan was very uncooperative Emerson Hospital Staff. Dr. Weatherbee and [REDACTED] decided that it would be best to have Brendan go home and see his regular doctor.

No further Police action, the domestic was only a verbal and no sign's of any physical confrontation.
