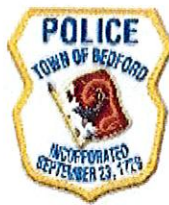
On 2-1-12 at 07:05 hours, Officer Cook, Officer Reid and I (Officer Vitale) responded to Toxicon, 15 Wiggins Avenue, on a report of a suspicious male who had exited the wooded area behind the building. The caller had related that the male appeared to have cuts on his arms and torn clothing. The caller related that the male claimed that he was fishing at the river, however, he did not have any fishing equipment. The caller related that the male was near the dumpster located at the rear of the building. The caller related that he was in a white pick up truck at the rear of the building. While en route, Emergency Communications contacted the Lexington Police Department regarding a breaking and entering suspect that they had been searching for during the overnight hours, see Bedford Police Incident 2012,1028. It should be noted that Sergeant Wardwell had related information from the previous shift that Lexington Police Department had been searching for a suspect near the area of Bedford Street and Valley Road which is easily accessible to Town of Bedford and Wiggins Avenue by the Minuteman Bikeway.

Upon arrival I observed a W/M, approximately 20-25 years old, wearing a gray t-shirt, green colored cargo pants, with short hair that had been colored lighter on top, standing near some storage containers speaking to a person in a white truck. I exited my marked cruiser and was in full uniform with my badge conspicuously displayed on my uniform. I asked the male to come over to me so that I could speak with him regarding the Lexington Police investigation. As I began to speak the male quickly looked to his right and then turned to his left and began to run south along the tree line for the property. I began to pursue the male, later identified as Brendan Reilly, on foot through the parking lot. I notified Emergency Communications and the responding officers of the description and the direction of travel. After approximately 75 yards Reilly turned east and entered a small wooded section adjacent to the southeast corner of the parking lot. Upon entering the wooded area I advised Reilly to stop and he continued to run down a small embankment and into the Elm Brook. Reilly crossed through the water and onto the east bank of the brook into the wooded area between Wiggins Avenue and Westview Street.

Sergeant Barbieri arrived on scene. I notified the responding officers and Emergency Communications and a perimeter was set up with the assistance of the Lexington Police Department. Emergency Communications notified Sergeant Barbieri that a K-9 from the Veteran's Affairs Police Department was available to assist. Sergeant Barbieri requested that the K-9 respond to 15 Wiggins Avenue to begin the search. Officer Beagle and his K-9 Nero arrived on scene. As Officer Beagle and I began to enter the wooded area to conduct the search Sergeant Barbieri related that he could see Reilly standing near a tree, north of where we had entered the wooded area. Sergeant Barbieri advised Reilly that we were deploying a police K-9 into the woods and ordered Reilly to come out of the woods. Sergeant Barbieri related that Reilly ignored his orders and continued to move east towards the Westview Cemetery in the Town of Lexington. Officer Beagle and I continued to move east through the woods where it appeared that Nero (K-9) had acquired a scent and began to move faster through a series of dense thorn bushes.

While we were still moving east through the wooded area, Emergency Communications related that they had received a 911 call from [REDACTED] reporting a male on the screen porch on the back of the house. Curve Street is located northeast of where we had entered the woods and is located on the far end of the wooded area. Patrol units were dispatched to [REDACTED] and Officer Beagle and I continued to track northeast to the rear of several houses. We were able to determine from the caller that we were currently

behind her home. The home is a 2 story dwelling with a set of stairs located near the middle of the rear of the residence. To the left at the top of the stairs there appeared to be an enclosed 3 season room with a door accessible from the stairs. To the right at the top of the stairs there appeared to be a door which led to a section of the home that did not appear to have any windows facing the rear of the property. Officer Beagle and I entered the back of the fenced in property through a gate. Officer Beagle allowed Nero more room on his leash and Nero immediately ran up the back stairs to the door on the left side and jumped up at the door with his front paws. Officer Beagle pulled Nero back and advised that Nero was indicating that the suspect had been tracked to the 3 season room. I advised Emergency Communications and the other officers that had arrived on scene at 15 Curve Street. Sergeant Barbieri arrived in the back of the residence and I removed my firearm from the holster and walked up the stairs. As I got to the top of the stairs I observed Reilly standing in the 3 season room next to the sliding door which appeared to lead into the rest of the home. I pointed my firearm at Reilly and ordered him to exit the door. Reilly lifted up both of his hands and stated, "What, are you going to shoot me." Once I observed that Reilly did not appear to be armed I returned my firearm to the holster and removed my expandable baton. Sergeant Barbieri and I opened the door to the 3 season room and ordered Reilly to step outside and get on the ground. Reilly moved to the doorway and stood at the threshold. Reilly then moved back inside of the room and shut the door. Reilly was advised to come outside or the police K-9 would be sent into the room. Reilly returned and opened the door. Sergeant Barbieri took control of Reilly's left arm and I took control of Reilly's right arm. Reilly began to actively resist by attempting to pull his arms back towards his body. Reilly was pulled from the threshold and placed onto the ground face down. At this time I controlled Reilly's right arm and Officer Waite took control of Reilly's left arm. Reilly was handcuffed in the prone position. During the handcuffing Reilly continued to actively resist attempting to pull his left arm away from the small of his back while being handcuffed. I was unable to double lock the handcuffs due to Reilly's continued resistance. It was at this time that Sergeant Barbieri asked Reilly his name and he informed us that he was Brendan Reilly from Bedford. Reilly had several visible and bleeding scratches along his arms and face that appeared to have been caused by the thorn bushes. Reilly's clothing was wet and torn and it appeared that Reilly had defecated in his pants. Reilly was not wearing any shoes at this time and had only 1 sock. Reilly was escorted to marked cruiser number 3 by myself and Officer Waite. While escorting Reilly to the cruiser it became immediately apparent that he was quivering and shaking. I advised Sergeant Barbieri of this condition and he requested that the Bedford Fire Department respond to the Bedford Police Department for a medical evaluation. Reilly was transported to the Bedford Police Department in marked cruiser number 3 by Officer Reid. Reilly was subsequently transported to the Emerson Hospital for treatment, see Sergeant Barbieri's report. Captain Ferro of the Lexington Police Department was on scene at 15 Curve Street.

I then went and spoke with the residents of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] related that she was downstairs inside the home when she heard what sounded like a conversation. [REDACTED] related that she looked around and did not observe anything and continued to copy some items. [REDACTED] related that she heard the conversation again and related that she became aware that it was an adult talking and not one of her 3 children. [REDACTED] related that she then observed an adult silhouette on the porch at the sliding glass door. [REDACTED] related that she could not see the person due to the draperies covering the sliding glass door. [REDACTED] related that she went upstairs and observed that her husband was in the shower and contacted 911. [REDACTED] related that after calling 911 she remained upstairs with the children, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] related that just prior to the police arrival she related that she could hear knocking at the door downstairs. [REDACTED] related that the exterior door to the 3 season room was closed and not locked, however, she normally keeps sliding glass door locked. [REDACTED] checked and confirmed that the sliding glass door

had been locked.

viewed the area of the 3 season room with me and directed me to a pair of wet socks that were on the floor near a chair at the back part of the room. Upon inspection the carpet near these socks appeared to have blood on the carpet. I viewed the sliding glass door that separates the 3 season room from the rest of the home and I observed several areas of what appeared to be mud covered fingerprints that had been smeared on the window and sliding glass door frame. Several of these smears appeared to have blood mixed in with the dirt and mud. The handle to the sliding glass door had mud on the handle as well as mud and blood on the side of the sliding screen indicating that Reilly had opened the sliding screen and had attempted to pull open the sliding door. Upon further inspection I observed a black Nike sneaker on the floor next to the sliding glass door. The shoe appeared to be wet and covered in dark mud. confirmed that this shoe did not belong to any of the residents at the home. We also observed that the door to the right at the top of the exterior stairs had several areas with what appeared to be blood and mud smeared fingerprints. The door knob on this door also contained mud covered smears indicating that Reilly had attempted to open this door. related that this door leads to a mud room which is located between the garage and the kitchen. Detective Sergeant L'Heureux responded and took photographs of the scene.

After receiving treatment at the Emerson Hospital, Reilly was transported back to the Bedford Police Department in marked cruiser number 5 by Officer Reid and Officer Waite. Reilly was booked, photographed and fingerprinted by Sergeant Barbieri. Reilly is being charged with 266/17, breaking and entering in the daytime with intent to commit a felony (person being placed in fear).

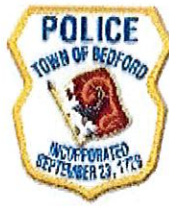
