On 7-24-12 at 1039 hours, I (Officer Reid) was dispatched in marked cruiser #3, along with Officer Henckler in marked cruiser #11, to 7 Old Billerica Road for a reported burglar alarm activation. Upon arrival, Officer Henckler was already on scene, and reported that the rear slider had been broken. I went to the rear of the house, and observed the rear sliding door on the deck was broken and there was glass on the ground. Most of the glass was inside the house. The door was broken in the area of the locking mechanism.

Officer Henckler and I checked the interior of the residence. We did not locate anyone inside of the home. Nothing in the house appeared to have been touched. Sgt. Barbieri and Officer Cook arrived on scene. We requested a K9, and were told that Officer Begeal from the VA Police was responding. Detective Busa and Detective Sgt. L'Heureux arrived on scene, and processed the house. (See Detective Busa's report) Lt. Graham and Chief Bongiorno also responded, and began to canvas the area.

Officer Begeal arrived on scene with his K9 Nero. Nero was able to acquire a scent on the rear deck. Nero tracked the scent through the back yard, and down to the Shawsheen River. Nero then tracked the scent to Page Road. We then went to Hemlock Lane, Hilltop Drive, Wilson Road, and back to Page Road. Nero then tracked the scent up Page Road and onto Reeves Road. Nero tracked the scent down the driveway of 15 Reeves, through the backyard of 17 Reeves, and then to the front door of 19 Reeves.

I then knocked on the front door, and spoke with the homeowner [REDACTED]. I informed [REDACTED] of why we were at his home. [REDACTED] related that he has been at the house all morning with his 19 year old daughter. I asked [REDACTED] if anyone had come to his door, and he related that nobody has been to the house all day.

The resident of 17 Reeves Road, Brendon Reilly, is well known to this department, and has been involved in residential breaking and enterings in the past. Brendon's mother, [REDACTED] was in the back yard when the dog tracked through, and I informed her why we were there. Chief Bongiorno told me that he had spoken with [REDACTED] and she had told him that she was with Brendon at court this morning. [REDACTED] told Chief Bongiorno that they arrived home around 1100 hours, and that Brendon has been inside sleeping ever since. Officer Cook then told me that she saw someone that looked similar to Brendon outside of Stop&Shop around 1045 hours, but was not 100% sure it was him.

We then went to 17 Reeves Road, and I spoke with [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] if we could speak with Brendon. Once [REDACTED] was informed that Brendon was a suspect, she became very defensive and told us that she needed to speak with her husband, Kenneth Reilly, and her attorney first. [REDACTED] then related that she went to court with Brendon, and stopped at McDonald's on the way home around 1100 hours. [REDACTED] told me that they went straight home, and Brendon has been inside sleeping ever since. [REDACTED] related that she has been outside gardening, and if Brendon left the house and came back he would have to be "Houdini."

[REDACTED] then arrived at the house, and was apprised of the situation. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] spoke with Brendon and he agreed to speak with us at the house, but did not want to go to the station. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were inside the house with Brendon for several minutes, and had ample opportunity to tell him what she had told us. Brendon spoke with me and Sgt. Barbieri in the driveway. I asked Brendon to tell me what he did today. Brendon related that he went to court with mother, then McDonalds, and then went home. Brendon told

me that he changed, and went to sleep on the couch. I then told Brendon that there was a house break and that the dog tracked a scent through his back yard and to his neighbor's house. Brendon told me that he did not break into any house, and offered to take a lie detector test. Brendon appeared clean, and not out of breath or sweaty. I asked Brendon if I could see his arms and legs, because the suspect ran through some thick brush with thorns. Brendon showed me his arms and legs, and did not have any fresh cuts. Brendon told us several times that he did not do anything wrong today, and that he was upset that he was a suspect. I explained to Brendon that it was too much of a coincidence with his history that the dog brought us right near his house. Brendon related that he understood why we were speaking with him. I then told him that detectives were processing the scene for fingerprints. Brendon told me that if they find any prints that they would not be his.

This case is being forwarded to the Detective Division.

On 07/24/12 at approximately 11:39 Hours, Detective Sergeant L'Heureux, Detective Vitale, and I (Detective Busa) responded to 7 Old Billerica Road regarding a past breaking and entering to the residence. Upon arrival, the responding patrol units cleared the residence and we made contact with Officer Reid and Sergeant Barbieri. Officer Reid briefed us of this incident, and a request for a K-9 response was initiated. See Officer Reid's initial report.

██████████ the caretaker of the residence, was notified by the alarm company and arrived at the residence. I made contact with ██████████ and apprised him of the situation. Detective Sergeant L'Heureux, ██████████ and I entered the residence through the front door, and conducted a walk through of the interior of the residence. ██████████ related that the home has been vacant for approximately two years and that his wife's late parents used to reside there. ██████████ related that nothing appeared to be disturbed by the suspect(s), and that nothing was missing from the residence.

I then began to process the crime scene for evidence. I first captured digital photographs of the exterior of the residence; as well as, the point of entry. The point of entry was a rear exterior sliding door located on the rear first floor deck. The sliding door connects the master bedroom to the deck. I observed that the glass window (double pane) located on the locking mechanism side of the slider was completely shattered. There was a large amount of glass fragments on the ground below. There were glass fragments located inside the residence and on the surface of the deck. There was no indication of the method/instrument used to break the glass. The sliding door was made of vinyl material, and was the color white. I applied traditional black fingerprint powder the surface of the door handle and locking mechanism. I developed a series of three fingerprints on the inside of the exterior door handle. The prints are in a downward angle. The orientation of the fingerprints were consistent of those made by the fingers on a left hand. I captured digital photographs of

the fingerprints. I then lifted the fingerprints by use of clear fingerprint lifting tape. I lifted the fingerprints and placed the clear tape on a white backing card. I labeled the backing card with the letter "A." I initialed, dated, and placed the incident number on the surface of the backing card as well.

It appears that the suspect(s) of this incident left the residence as soon as the audible alarm was activated. [redacted] related that the alarm in the master bedroom is activated by motion only. It did not appear that any other items in the residence were manipulated. I provided [redacted] with my contact information prior to departure.

I downloaded the digital photographs that I captured on scene, and attached them to the incident in PAMET. Fingerprint backing card "A" was placed in the case file.

On 07/25/12, I was able to access Brendan Reilly's fingerprint card from his arrest on 02/01/12 by this department. The fingerprints that I recovered on scene are those of the middle portion of the series of fingers (3). The detail in the prints transferred to the fingerprint card on 02/01/12 do not clearly capture the detail needed for comparison. I placed a call to the Reilly residence on 07/25/12, and spoke with Kenneth Reilly. I asked K. Reilly if his son would be willing to submit elimination fingerprints. Reilly related to me that we (Bedford Police Department) were harassing his son and he would be contacting his attorney. K. Reilly related that B. Reilly would not be submitting elimination fingerprints at this time.

On 07/26/12, I drafted an informational bulletin regarding this incident, and it was distributed it to the NEMLEC Detective's E-mail List. The bulletin will be placed in the case folder.
