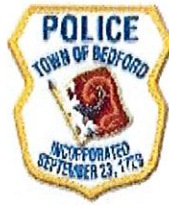

On 8/21/13 I, Officer Dineen responded to the parking lot of the station for a man requesting to speak with the police about his son. I was at the station at this time and was advised it was Mr. [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] is known to me and the department to be the father of Brendan Reilly. Brendan has a long history of violent acts against his family, domestic calls, destruction of property, threats, drug use, B&E involvements. Upon approaching Mr. [REDACTED] at his truck he related that he was afraid for his life as well as his wife's. He pointed to the truck where he related his son Brendan was sitting in the passenger seat.

[REDACTED] went on to say that he is afraid for his life and for Brendan's life. [REDACTED] explained that he just came from Arlington and that Brendan had started a fire and "burnt the place to the ground". [REDACTED] related that Brendan was at his Grandmother's home at [REDACTED] Arlington Massachusetts. [REDACTED] related that Brendan had left yesterday, see incident #2013-8045, and went to his grandmother's house after 10:00pm and lit candles and curled up in a blanket on the back porch. A fire was started and it burnt the porch off the house and the homes had to be evacuated. [REDACTED] related that [REDACTED] Brendan's grandmother who is 90 years old lives on the second floor. On the first floor is [REDACTED] his Aunt. The house was infested with smoke damage and no one was allowed in there. [REDACTED] related he drove to the station because Brendan refused to go to the hospital and get the help he needs. [REDACTED] related that Brendan was refusing him while in the car and threatened to throw the transmission in reverse if he, his dad [REDACTED] did not let him out of the car. [REDACTED] was concerned of Brendan's well being.

Brendan is diagnosed with Bi-Polar and potential schizophrenia. He is supposed to be watched and medicated but refuses to do so. Brendan is also a drug addict and utilizes an assortment of prescription drugs, as well as heroin and other narcotics. Brendan is known to be volatile and violent as well as unpredictable and a flight risk.

At this time I approached Brendan and asked him to put out his cigarette. Brendan was sitting in the passenger seat, he had soot all over his face, soot coming out of his nose, his eyebrows and eye lashes had visible fire damage to them, his pupils were extremely constricted, his hands were burnt, his nails long and yellow consistent with cigarettes and drug use, his mouth was layered in a film and he spoke "cotton mouthed" and slurred speech. Brendan refused to seek voluntary medical attention and he denied speaking to anyone voluntarily for mental assistance.

Due to Brendan's obvious condition of being under the influence of drugs, the concerns for his health with burn indications, the long history of domestic incidents, drug use and mental diagnosis I deemed Brendan to be a threat to himself and to his father. Brendan had run from his parents home yesterday and went to his grandmother's where he lit the fire. Brendan is not capable of taking care of himself in this condition and could cause harm to others. Brendan stepped from the car where I patted him down for safety. Officer Waite and Abajian on scene. Brendan had a pocket full of batteries and change, one prescription bottle with [REDACTED] (Brendan's mother) name on it proscribed for Lorazepam, two bottles of Ibuprofen Market Basket Brand, cigarettes and sunglasses. Brendan was advised that due to the fact he is a flight risk and his unpredictable behavior that he was going to be handcuffed for my safety and his. Brendan was handcuffed, DL, and advised that he was going to Lahey Hospital where his doctors are under a section 12.

Officer Abajian transported Brendan with the Bedford Fire Department to Burlington Lahey without incident. A section 12 was filled out and faxed to the ER at Lahey. I spoke with the charge nurse and advised her of the history.

I spoke with [REDACTED] further upon Brendan being transported. [REDACTED] related that he is "at his breaking point, this is it" he understands that Brendan is going to kill himself or end up in Jail. [REDACTED] related he wanted a restraining order immediately for he and his wife and do not want Brendan in the home any longer. [REDACTED] explained that he has spent hundreds of thousands of dollars on therapy, placement at Massachusetts and New Hampshire clinics, outpatient,

inpatient, intervention etc. [REDACTED] related that he has a daughter, son and law and grandchild and Brendans addictions and inability to get assistance for his mental issues has caused extreme hardship and turmoil on he and his family.

I explained to [REDACTED] that a restraining order would be beneficial as well as suggested a section 35, involuntary evaluation and commitment with drug or alcohol abuse.

[REDACTED] related that Brendan sleeps at the house, gets up each morning, where he is given \$20.00 for the day and he leaves. Then to sleep at the house again. Brendan breaks personal and valuable home items and threatens to kill his father and mother weekly if not daily. [REDACTED] relates that he has to stay up late to keep an eye on Brendan and he and his wife sleep in different rooms to manage the situation. Brendan has broken each door in the house and breaks things daily. [REDACTED] provided me with Brendans Psychiatrist information, Dr. [REDACTED] at Lahey Burlington, [REDACTED]. Brendans primary doctor Dr. [REDACTED] is also at Lahey. In speaking with Dr. [REDACTED] he related that he has never met Brendan Reilly and does not feel he can help the situation much.

Contact to Dr. [REDACTED] was made. I explained the seriousness of what was occurring with Brendan. Dr. [REDACTED] related he would be in touch with the ER to follow the situation.

Detective Hunt was advised of the situation and spoke further with [REDACTED] about obtaining a restraining order as well as a section 35 for involuntary commitment for drug and alcohol addiction. Mr. [REDACTED] was instructed on how to proceed to the Concord District Court and petition for both requests.

Contact was made to Arlington Police Department and I received a copy of the report and photos of the fire that occurred in Arlington. See attached.

Contact to Mr. [REDACTED] will be made in regards to the pills that were on Brendan's person.

A CMAST form to be completed. I will be following up with [REDACTED] on my next shift 8/22/13 for further information.

I contacted Mr. [REDACTED] on 8/22/13 at approximately 9:24 am. I had been advised that he did not receive the restraining order or section 35 yesterday as intended. In speaking with [REDACTED] he related that he was exhausted yesterday and took some time to think. He did not know if he was going to proceed with the orders.

[REDACTED] related that his son Brendan was transported to Arbor Hospital in Brookline under the section 12. [REDACTED] believes they will hold him until tomorrow. I explained a Refrain from abuse order to [REDACTED] instead of a restraining order and he related that he will consider it.

[REDACTED] wanted to clarify that the fire was an accident and not intentional. I explained to [REDACTED] that the fire was a direct result of his sons condition and that during his day to day life after they give him his "\$20.00" he continues to be involved in drugs, and illegal activities that they don't see.

[REDACTED] will contact me if he is interested in further assistance. The CMAST form was not able to be filled out because I was not able to sit and ask the parents the questions. Brendan should be considered a threat with his mental status and drug involvement.

Upon having Brendan exit the truck, he was patted down for safety. In his pockets were two Ibuprofen bottles and one prescription bottle for [REDACTED] for Lorazepam. The pills were small white pills, with M on one side and 321 on the other. The pills were verified Lorazepam .5 Mgs, in the Physicians Desk reference.

Contact to [REDACTED] was made. [REDACTED] related that Brendan had broken in to the master bedroom the day before, incident #2013-8045 and had gotten the pills at that time to his knowledge. Due to the circumstances with Brendan being in the Hospital under a section 12 I will not be seeking charges for him having the prescription. [REDACTED] will pick up the medications.
