NARRATIVE

On January 7th at approximately 5:03 PM, Ofc. Ham and I were dispatched to 98 Hancock St for a report of property damage. On arrival we made contact with [REDACTED] and Brendan Reilly. It is important to note that 98 Hancock St is a group home for struggling individuals, maintained by the Elliot services.

Mr. [REDACTED] identified himself as the reporting party and stated that he had called because his roommate Brendan had opened his amazon package and had damaged its contents. Upon viewing the package, I identified the item as a motherboard computer chip with significant damage to its underside. Priced approximately at \$350.

Mr. Reilly admitted to opening the package because there wasn't a name attached to it but stated that he did not damage the contents.

After speaking at length with both parties as well as Elliot services, Mr. Rielly agreed to pay for the damaged property as well promised not to open any packages that did not have his name attached to it in the future. Mr. [REDACTED] was happy with this outcome and was assured that Elliot services would assist him with any other issues.
