2 THE CLERK: We are on the record with the inquest matter.

3 Judge, just for the record that we have sealed the recording on
4 it.

5 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. Have we posted at the door, --

6 THE COURT OFFICER: Yes.

7 THE COURT: -- Madam Court Officer, that the hearing room is
8 closed?

9 THE COURT OFFICER: It is.

10 THE COURT: Okay. So, the first thing that I want to do is --
11 First, I'm Judge Fortes, for the record. I want to make sure that
12 everybody in the room is an interested party, is part of this
13 inquest matter. So, maybe we could just have people identify
14 themselves for the record.

15 MS. LYNCH: Thank you.

16 THE COURT: Yeah.

17 MS. LYNCH: Good morning, Your Honor. Adrienne Lynch,
18 Assistant District Attorney for the Commonwealth.

19 THE COURT: Good morning.

20 MR. PASCIUCCO: Good morning, Your Honor. Peter Pasciucco,
21 attorney for police officer Erik Drauschke.

22 THE COURT: Good morning.

23 MR. KOUFMAN: Good morning, Your Honor. Victor Koufman and
24 Melissa Garand. We're attorneys for Catherine Rawson, who is the
25 mother of Alan Greenough; and also we have Anthony, who's here,

1 Anthony Perrotti, who's the brother.

2 THE COURT: Okay.

3 MR. KOUFMAN: And then, there are three other individuals who
4 I can introduce to you --

5 THE COURT: Please.

6 MR. KOUFMAN: -- or they can introduce themselves. We have --
7 Let's see. We have Alan Greenough, the father, --

8 THE COURT: Yep.

9 MR. KOUFMAN: -- and Michael Sweeney [phonetic], a
10 stepbrother. And then we have Victoria McLean [phonetic], who I
11 believe is a significant other to Michael Sweeney.

12 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

13 MR. KOUFMAN: Thank you.

14 THE COURT: So, good morning to all of you. Today's purpose
15 from the Court's perspective is a scheduling hearing and also to
16 set the ground rules and explain what the Court's understanding of
17 is -- of this inquest matter and how we plan to go forward.

18 An inquest -- The purpose of the inquest is to investigate
19 the circumstances of the death of Mr. Greenough in this matter.
20 And any -- And then the Court at the conclusion of this matter
21 would issue a report setting forth conclusions on several specific
22 issues. So, this is an investigatory procedure to obtain
23 information as to whether or not a crime has been committed. My
24 role as the judge is investigatory. And I see -- I will see that
25 all relevant evidence is presented and that all relevant witnesses

1 are heard in this matter.

2 So, first the Court -- we want -- I want to get a sense of
3 how many witnesses the District Attorney's Office plan to call in
4 this matter and some sense of scheduling, A.D.A. Lynch.

5 MS. LYNCH: Well, Your Honor, it was my understanding that
6 the Court would determine what witnesses would be called.

7 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

8 MS. LYNCH: I have put together a list of potential witnesses
9 in the case and would be prepared to call several of them.

10 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

11 MS. LYNCH: With regard to those witnesses, --

12 THE COURT: And maybe, Ms. Lynch, just for my understanding,
13 I just want to make sure that I'm clear. My understanding, just
14 going over the inquest rules, was that the Court has an ability to
15 limit certain witnesses but it was the District Attorney's Office
16 who determined which --

17 MS. LYNCH: Okay.

18 THE COURT: That was my understanding. So, that's -- Okay.
19 So, you prepared a list, you said, of witnesses.

20 MS. LYNCH: I have prepared a list of potential witnesses in
21 the case.

22 THE COURT: Okay.

23 MS. LYNCH: And -- because it was my understanding that the
24 Court is the party that actually sends out the --

25 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

1 MS. LYNCH: -- notices to the witnesses.

2 THE COURT: Okay. Well, then, we have different
3 understandings. But go ahead.

4 MS. LYNCH: Okay. Well, I -- Well, that was just based upon
5 --

6 THE COURT: Okay.

7 MS. LYNCH: -- my reading of the --

8 THE COURT: Yep. Mm-hmm.

9 MS. LYNCH: -- inquest rules.

10 THE COURT: Yep.

11 MS. LYNCH: I'm happy to --

12 THE COURT: Yep.

13 MS. LYNCH: I'm happy to facilitate --

14 THE COURT: Yep.

15 MS. LYNCH: -- that. So, I don't know if the Court wants me
16 to submit a list to you --

17 THE COURT: I'm happy to --

18 MS. LYNCH: -- or if I can recite --

19 THE COURT: Sure.

20 MS. LYNCH: -- the names for --

21 THE COURT: No.

22 MS. LYNCH: -- the parties here --

23 THE COURT: Yeah.

24 MS. LYNCH: -- to hear.

25 THE COURT: Why don't you recite the names --

1 MS. LYNCH: Okay.

18 THE COURT: Thank you. Okay. So, my understanding, I should
19 say then to counsel, was both from the rules with regard to an
20 inquest and with judges who have conducted inquests. And so, the
21 judges -- other judges, Judges Kogan and others who have conducted
22 them, indicated to me that the District Attorney's Office does the
23 summoning of the witnesses, which was my understanding. So, --

24 MS. LYNCH: I was relying, Your Honor, on the only material
25 that I could locate, which were standards for the District Court --

1 THE COURT: And that's what I have in front of me.

2 MS. LYNCH: -- [Indiscernible at 10:12:22 a.m. - simultaneous
3 speech].

4 THE COURT: And I understand that, Attorney Lynch, which -- I
5 took these standards and then, as I said, I called Judges Kogan
6 and others who had conducted them before to get some more guidance
7 and asked who's --

8 MS. LYNCH: Sure.

9 THE COURT: -- responsible for summoning the witnesses.

10 MS. LYNCH: Sure, I'm happy to do that.

11 THE COURT: Okay.

12 MS. LYNCH: I just wanted to --

13 THE COURT: Yep. No, I --

14 MS. LYNCH: -- indicate --

15 THE COURT: -- understand. We're --

16 MS. LYNCH: -- the resource.

17 THE COURT: No, absolutely. I have the same resource.

18 So, in terms of everybody's schedule, then, going forward?

19 MS. LYNCH: The one time that I found a problem, Your Honor,
20 is that what is referred to as school vacation week --

21 THE COURT: Yes.

22 MS. LYNCH: -- I did note when I was trying to get up-to-date
23 addresses for people that there were a number of particularly
24 police and law enforcement witnesses that have that week for
25 vacation --

1 THE COURT: Okay.

2 MS. LYNCH: -- plans, which is the Washington --

3 THE COURT: Sure.

4 MS. LYNCH: -- [Indiscernible at 10:13:15 a.m. - simultaneous
5 speech].

6 THE COURT: Yeah, which was --

7 MS. LYNCH: The 18th, I think.

8 THE COURT: Would've been the best week here. But --

9 MS. LYNCH: Well, --

10 THE COURT: Just in terms --

11 MS. LYNCH: Well, --

12 THE COURT: -- of other business. But that's fine because
13 one of the other things that I understand is important is, once we
14 start hearing from witnesses, to keep things moving. So, maybe a
15 block of time if it was -- if everybody's schedule was such that
16 we could just block out here and I could talk to Judge Hinkle
17 about other business in Woburn. I don't know if we're
18 anticipating a week's worth of witnesses or a longer --

19 MS. LYNCH: I don't know that it will necessarily be that
20 long. All --

21 THE COURT: Okay.

22 MS. LYNCH: -- of those witnesses obviously would not be
23 called.

24 THE COURT: Right.

25 MS. LYNCH: Most of those, the civilian witnesses as well as

1 the police witnesses that were present that night, have recorded
2 interviews that I would offer --

3 THE COURT: Okay.

4 MS. LYNCH: -- at the --

5 THE COURT: All right.

6 MS. LYNCH: -- inquest.

7 THE COURT: Okay. So, I don't know; did you all have any
8 preliminary discussions about scheduling with attorneys?

9 MS. LYNCH: I did not. I'm -- I am available for --

10 THE COURT: Okay.

11 MS. LYNCH: -- whatever dates.

12 THE COURT: What about the rest of you?

13 MR. PASCIOCCO: I do have a list of weeks where I sort of
14 have the week wide open.

15 THE COURT: Okay. Why don't we start there.

16 MR. PASCIOCCO: Nothing is in the --

17 THE COURT: Okay. And I'll --

18 MR. PASCIOCCO: -- immediate future.

19 THE COURT: -- see if it works for me.

20 MR. PASCIOCCO: But beginning of March --

21 THE COURT: Okay.

22 MR. PASCIOCCO: -- and April.

23 THE COURT: Beginning of March and --

24 MR. PASCIOCCO: Or --

25 THE COURT: -- April.

1 MR. PASCIUCCO: -- beginning in March. I have -- I really
2 don't have much availability remaining in February.

3 THE COURT: Okay.

4 MR. KOUFMAN: Yes, just on behalf of the family, I know that
5 they just want to have it heard as soon as possible.

6 THE COURT: And that's the Court's intention, too, to have it
7 heard as soon as possible. But -- Okay. What about -- Let's see.

8 [Pause]

9 THE COURT: What about the week of March 25th?

10 MR. PASCIUCCO: That's fine with me.

11 THE COURT: March 25th?

12 MS. LYNCH: That would be available.

13 THE COURT: Okay.

14 MS. LYNCH: I have time.

15 THE COURT: I could also do March 11th -- do that week, too.

16 MR. PASCIUCCO: Unavailable that week.

17 THE COURT: You are?

18 MR. PASCIUCCO: I am unavailable.

19 THE COURT: You are unavailable that week.

20 MR. PASCIUCCO: Yeah.

21 THE COURT: Okay. Those are the only two weeks the Court has
22 available in March. So March 25th, yeah?

23 MS. LYNCH: That's fine.

24 THE COURT: Okay. All right. And, again, because I want to
25 be able to make sure that -- check with Judge Hinkle here and --

1 Do we think one, two, three days we should block off?

2 MS. LYNCH: I think the potential for three is there.

3 THE COURT: Great. Okay.

4 MS. LYNCH: But I would hope that it would be more --

5 THE COURT: Okay.

6 MS. LYNCH: -- concise.

7 THE COURT: So, we could -- 25th, 26th, 27th, and potentially
8 the 28th. Why don't we just block off the whole -- just in case.
9 So that's four days. Okay.

10 MS. LYNCH: Does the Court anticipate that we would be in
11 this courtroom? And the reason that I ask is because of the
12 audio-visual needs --

13 THE COURT: Yes.

14 MS. LYNCH: -- that I would have to arrange for.

15 THE COURT: Okay.

16 MS. LYNCH: I think, you know, we have the setup here but I
17 want to make sure that --

18 THE COURT: Sure.

19 MS. LYNCH: -- this is what we're --

20 THE COURT: I'm --

21 MS. LYNCH: -- using.

22 THE COURT: I'm sure Judge Hinkle would accommodate if we
23 wanted to be here.

24 THE CLERK: And, Judge, as far as the audio-visual equipment,
25 it's on wheels. You can bring it --

1 MS. LYNCH: Oh, okay. Good.

2 THE CLERK: -- either --

3 THE COURT: All right.

4 THE CLERK: It's fine.

5 THE COURT: All right. Okay.

6 THE CLERK: And the D.A.s have had success in hooking their --

7 THE COURT: Hooking up.

8 THE CLERK: -- laptops up --

9 MS. LYNCH: Sure.

10 THE COURT: Okay.

11 THE CLERK: -- to the --

12 MS. LYNCH: I will have somebody --

13 THE COURT: Okay.

14 MS. LYNCH: -- that can do that available.

15 THE COURT: All right. What other issues?

16 MR. PASCIUCCO: Other issues I see are witnesses for my
17 client.

18 THE COURT: Yeah.

19 MR. PASCIUCCO: I think the only foreseeable witnesses would
20 be himself --

21 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

22 MR. PASCIUCCO: -- testifying --

23 THE COURT: Yeah.

24 MR. PASCIUCCO: -- as well as a use-of-force/defensive
25 tactics expert.

1 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

2 MR. PASCIUCCO: So, I just wanted to bring that to the
3 Court's attention. I'm happy to provide name, curriculum vitae,
4 whatever the Court needs --

5 THE COURT: Okay.

6 MR. PASCIUCCO: -- in advance.

7 THE COURT: All right. Ms. Lynch, anything on that?

8 MS. LYNCH: No, that's fine. Just if I could get the name of
9 --

10 THE COURT: Sure.

11 MS. LYNCH: -- the individual --

12 THE COURT: Sure.

13 MS. LYNCH: -- in advance.

14 THE COURT: Sure.

15 MS. LYNCH: The other thing that I wanted to ask is: given
16 that there are a number of recorded interviews, in terms of
17 witness prep for the hearing will the Court allow the witness to
18 look at their prior recorded statement, or?

19 THE COURT: I don't have any objection to that, no.

20 MR. PASCIUCCO: I don't have any objection to that.

21 In terms of discovery, --

22 THE COURT: Yes.

23 MR. PASCIUCCO: -- again, the rules aren't quite clear on
24 what my client is able to see prior to the inquest.

25 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

1 MR. PASCIOCCO: I don't know if there could be a motion filed
2 or a -- an understanding between the parties, as well as my
3 ability -- I know this is not an adversarial process, but -- my
4 ability to cross-examine or question the witnesses. Sort of those
5 ground rules I'm a little unclear of, so --

6 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Does it make sense -- Maybe I
7 should send out something to the parties with the Court's
8 understanding of what the ground rules will be, --

9 MR. PASCIOCCO: Yes.

10 THE COURT: -- based on the inquest procedure as written out
11 and then based on some information that I do have from other
12 judges who are conducting these proceedings. Does that make
13 sense?

14 MS. LYNCH: Yes, Your Honor.

15 THE COURT: Ground rules? Okay. So I'll send that out in
16 writing. Now, one of the things -- And this is really
17 focused/targeted towards you, Ms. Lynch. And this is the Court's
18 own fault -- is that I was advised to have all of the documents, a
19 copy sent to me in the lobby in Lowell, but also there should be a
20 separate copy here that goes to the District Court in Woburn. And
21 that would be -- I already did a letter indicating that that would
22 be impounded here.

23 MS. LYNCH: I will make a copy for that.

24 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

25 MS. LYNCH: Does the Court have a docket number for this --

1 THE COURT: Yeah.

2 MS. LYNCH: -- in Woburn?

3 THE CLERK: Yes, Judge, I believe that you have the file in
4 front of you.

5 THE COURT: Yep.

6 THE CLERK: I believe it's -- Is it 19IN or 18IN? It is
7 18IN01.

8 MS. LYNCH: Do you think, Your Honor, it would suffice to
9 have it filed solely electronically? I did provide hard copy and
10 electronic for the Court. I can do it but --

11 THE COURT: Yep.

12 MS. LYNCH: -- it's just --

13 THE COURT: Yeah.

14 MS. LYNCH: -- room for --

15 THE COURT: Room. Yeah.

16 MS. LYNCH: -- the --

17 THE COURT: I think that that would suffice, electronically.

18 [Reviewing document.] I'm just seeing what else is in here.
19 Okay, so I did -- I just wanted to make sure I did send an order
20 requesting an order of impoundment, that the Clerk Magistrate
21 shall establish an inquest file and segregate the file from that
22 of any other files and only permit the District Attorney's Office
23 and counsel for any person having possible responsibility for the
24 decedent's death access to the file. So, that's here. And just
25 the letter authorizing me to conduct the inquest. Thank you.

1 All right. So, I'll send out a -- send out information to
2 the attorneys with regard to the ground rules. What other
3 questions?

4 MR. KOUFMAN: If I may, Judge.

5 THE COURT: Sure.

6 MR. KOUFMAN: Just a couple of things. Number one is: if the
7 Court's going to consider a motion or a sequestration order or
8 something --

9 THE COURT: Yes.

10 MR. KOUFMAN: -- before the testimony.

11 THE COURT: Yes.

12 MR. KOUFMAN: And I'd just ask that if you're also going to
13 consider hearing from some of the family that you might consider
14 calling them first so they can hear the remainder of the
15 testimony, --

16 THE COURT: Okay.

17 MR. KOUFMAN: -- just because they're very interested in
18 this, obviously.

19 THE COURT: All right.

20 MR. KOUFMAN: And second is, as far as the discovery goes, --

21 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

22 MR. KOUFMAN: -- will we only have an opportunity to view it
23 in the Clerk's Office or not at all?

24 THE COURT: The family members?

25 MR. KOUFMAN: Correct.

1 THE COURT: Whether they might be able to view it?

2 MR. KOUFMAN: Well, specifically Catherin Rawson and Anthony
3 Perrotti.

4 THE COURT: Okay.

5 MS. LYNCH: Your Honor, I would have an issue with --

6 THE COURT: Yep.

7 MS. LYNCH: -- Mr. Perro --

8 THE COURT: Yeah. Why don't -- I'm going to address all of --
9 Why don't address all of that when I sent out the letter.

10 MR. KOUFMAN: Thank you.

11 THE COURT: Ground rules, okay? All right.

12 So, understanding that I am going to send out a specific
13 letter with regard to some of the issues that have been raised,
14 anything else in terms of scheduling that we need to address
15 today?

16 MR. PASCIOCCO: I guess my only thought is maybe to have a --
17 after you set out the ground rules to have a final scheduling
18 conference just in case there's any issues and -- we don't waste
19 the first day of the inquest, or --

20 THE COURT: Do you think we need a final scheduling
21 conference?

22 MR. PASCIOCCO: I don't know if we do. I just don't know --

23 THE COURT: I mean, I'd be happy to address -- If there are
24 any issues, we can address that on the first day, --

25 MR. PASCIOCCO: That could be fine.

1 THE COURT: -- just to keep things --

2 MR. PASCIOCCO: Yeah.

3 THE COURT: -- moving along.

4 MR. PASCIOCCO: Yeah.

5 THE COURT: And we could, you know, start early enough hat we
6 could address them on the first day rather than have another
7 scheduling conference, which -- we may not get much done. And we
8 want to make --

9 MR. PASCIOCCO: Yeah.

10 THE COURT: -- sure we're expediting the --

11 MR. PASCIOCCO: There very well --

12 THE COURT: -- process.

13 MR. PASCIOCCO: -- may not be any if Your Honor just --

14 THE COURT: Right.

15 MR. PASCIOCCO: Without knowing the ground rules, I didn't
16 know what --

17 THE COURT: Okay.

18 MR. PASCIOCCO: --- other issues.

19 THE COURT: All right, all right. And I certainly -- I'll
20 send out the ground rules in enough time that if anybody wants to
21 be heard on them then we could set a date, a scheduling date. How
22 -- Does that make sense?

23 MR. PASCIOCCO: That's fine.

24 THE COURT: Okay. All right. I may have said once we have a
25 list of who all the witnesses are -- plan to be, in addition to

1 dealing with issues with regard of sequestration, I'm going to
2 make sure that the -- whoever the Court Officer is on those days
3 has a list of the witnesses so that we know who should and should
4 not be in the room.

5 Okay. I don't know. Nobody can think of anything else.
6 Everybody knows the traditional Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rules
7 of Evidence don't apply at these hearings.

8 I don't anticipate any other counsel other than the counsel
9 that are in the room to be at the inquest. So, -- [Reviewing
10 document.]

11 All right. It is the Court's intention once we get started
12 on the 25th to move quickly and to expedite the matter and to
13 issue a report in a timely fashion. I can't think of anything
14 else. Nobody else can. No? Okay. All right.

15 MR. KOUFMAN: Just one quick question. Is it possible I --
16 that we could at least get a list of the witnesses? I tried to
17 write them all down.

18 THE COURT: What's your --

19 MS. LYNCH: Well, --

20 THE COURT: Yeah?

21 MS. LYNCH: I think that if this is not an adversarial
22 proceeding --

23 THE COURT: Yeah.

24 MS. LYNCH: -- and an investigatory one that until the
25 inquest is completed --

1 THE COURT: Complete.

2 MS. LYNCH: -- that that should not be -- the names and
3 addresses --

4 THE COURT: Yeah.

5 MS. LYNCH: I mean, --

6 THE COURT: Okay.

7 MS. LYNCH: -- the names, I think, are known pretty much.

8 THE COURT: Right.

9 MS. LYNCH: But the --

10 THE COURT: Okay. No, I'm not going to allow that, counsel,
11 for the reasons that I think Ms. Lynch just stated, this not being
12 an adversarial proceeding. So the Court's not going to allow
13 that.

14 Okay. Thank you all very much.

15 THE CLERK: Thank you. So, --

16 MR. PASCIOCCO: Thank you.

17 THE CLERK: -- Judge, this matter will be continued to March
18 25th, 2019, --

19 THE COURT: Yes.

20 THE CLERK: -- at 9:00 a.m.

21 THE COURT: And I'll send out something in writing so
22 indicating. I'll also set out -- send out something with regard
23 to the ground rules in writing for the inquest, with an
24 opportunity -- enough time so if there are any issues that counsel
25 can bring those to the Court's attention and we can mark it up for

1 a quick hearing before the 25th. Okay? All right. Thank you.


