SUBJECT: INTERVIEW OF [REDACTED] RE; ASHLAND POLICE SHOOTING

1. On Tuesday July 2nd, 2013 officers from the Ashland Police Department were involved in a shooting at 13 Metropolitan Ave, Ashland which resulted in the death of Andrew Stigliano at that residence. Through the course of the investigation it was revealed that Stigliano's girlfriend;

was with Stigliano prior to his contact with police and was subsequently arrested at that address for disorderly conduct. On this same date at approximately 1530 hours I met with Ms. [REDACTED] at the Ashland Police Department in the office behind the dispatch area with Ashland Officer Brian Jewett. The following is synopsis of our discussion;

2. I asked [REDACTED] if she wanted to speak me about the incident and her first question was "Is he dead?" I informed her that Mr. Stigliano was dead and that I was very sorry for her loss. [REDACTED] briefly cried and then said she wanted to talk to me. I informed her she didn't have to speak to me if she didn't want to and she insisted "Yes, I want to talk to you."

3. [REDACTED] stated she lives at 13 Metropolitan Ave with her four year old son, [REDACTED] who is also the son of Stigliano. She stated that Stigliano didn't really live there but stayed at his parent's house in Newton most of the time which is where she said he was the evening of July 1st. On the morning of July 2nd [REDACTED] stated she was picked up approximately 9:00 a.m. by Stigliano at 13 Metropolitan Ave and they drove to Framingham where she had an appointment with a Dr. [REDACTED] to receive her [REDACTED] prescription [REDACTED]


She further stated Stigliano also is on Suboxin and Adderall

4. After the appointment in Framingham they returned to Ashland and when Stigliano reached Summer Street at Union Street he noticed a police cruiser pass them and then turn around behind them. [REDACTED] stated Stigliano then accelerated to 13 Metropolitan Ave which was a short distance away and pulled into the driveway. According to [REDACTED], Stigliano then exited the driver's side, leaving the car running and ran through the house into the backyard. I asked [REDACTED] if she saw Stigliano run into the backyard and she stated "No, but that is where he always goes." I asked where in the backyard and she stated it's the property at #15 Metropolitan Ave which is adjacent to #13 which they own as well. She stated she assumed that is where he went after watching him run into the front door.

5. After Stigliano ran into the house, [REDACTED] stated she turned the car off and went to the Hair Salon on the corner of Metropolitan Ave and Union Street, "Hair 101", where she met her friend, [REDACTED], [REDACTED] 74, [REDACTED], Ashland, MA. [REDACTED] originally stated she met [REDACTED], a hair dresser there, but corrected herself and said it was [REDACTED], also a hair dresser. She stated [REDACTED] only handed her [REDACTED]'s cell phone. [REDACTED] used [REDACTED]'s phone to contact Stigliano because he had her phone which he used all the time. [REDACTED] further stated the car Stigliano was driving, a 2004 gray Volkswagen Golf, Ma reg# [REDACTED] belongs to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] often lets Stigliano borrow it. [REDACTED] stated she texted Stigliano asking if he was home and he replied that he wasn't in the house. She stated she texted him "I luv you" and soon afterwards was told that police were surrounding her house. I asked [REDACTED] why Stigliano ran from the police and she stated "He ran because he didn't want to go to jail."

6. [REDACTED] stated she went over to the house and confronted police officers there yelling "Get off my property!" She further stated "I was probably being rude because I've had problems with them before." [REDACTED] stated officers were asking her where Stigliano was and she said she yelled at them that he wasn't in the house. She stated she yelled at them again and then they placed her under arrest. [REDACTED] stated she was handcuffed in the back of a cruiser and observed officers getting guns out of their trunks. According to [REDACTED] after approximately forty-five minutes in the back of the cruiser she heard three gunshots that sounded like they were coming from outside. She stated an officer then said to another officer "get her out of here" and they brought her to the police station to be booked.

7. I asked [REDACTED] if she knew Stigliano to possess any firearms and she stated he used to have an antique rifle or shotgun. When asked to describe it she stated it had a double barrel, one small and one large on top of each other. She further stated police confiscated it during a "raid" on February 11th, 2011 at 13 Metropolitan Ave. I asked what the "raid" was for and she stated the police were looking for a friend of Stigliano's who was living there at the time, [REDACTED] who had warrant. The interview was then concluded.
