SUBJECT: INTERVIEW OF [REDACTED]

1. On July 2, 2013, I, along with other State Police Officers, conducted a canvas of the area around 13 Metropolitan Avenue in Ashland. During this canvas, I had occasion to speak to a subject who provided the following identification information:

2. Ms. [REDACTED] began by stating that she had been home with her husband when she heard [REDACTED], the neighbor from 13 Metropolitan Avenue, screaming. [REDACTED] stated it was very common to hear [REDACTED] yelling and causing a disturbance, but that on this occasion she was very loud and yelling things similar to, "You're not coming in my fucking house!" [REDACTED] stated that she couldn't make out everything [REDACTED] was yelling, but that she was yelling lots of things with the word "Fuck!" Hearing the commotion, Ms. [REDACTED] looked outside from a second floor window of her home, but couldn't see [REDACTED]. However, she saw several police cruisers parked at [REDACTED]'s home. As she looked outside, even though she couldn't see [REDACTED], Ms. [REDACTED] stated she could still distinctly hear her yelling and swearing. Ms. [REDACTED] saw several police officers around the house. At first the officers did not have guns drawn, but after a period of time they drew weapons. [REDACTED] couldn't clearly hear everything that was occurring, because her husband had a television on, and was watching it with the volume raised. However, she said that she heard "two popping sounds." After the popping sounds, she saw officers going in and out of the house, and then an ambulance arrived.

3. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED]'s boyfriend, who she knew as "Andy," had warrants for his arrest. She stated that [REDACTED] had told her he had a warrant about 1 ½ weeks ago when he came to her home and asked to borrow her lawn mower. She had mentioned to him that she hadn't seen him around much lately, and he stated to her that he couldn't go outside because the police were looking for him.
