SUBJECT: INTERVIEW OF [REDACTED]

1. On July 2, 2013 I conducted an interview of [REDACTED] at her residence. She provided the following identification:

2. [REDACTED] stated that she was employed as a hair stylist at Hair 101 at 382 Union Street in Ashland, and was working on July 2, 2013. Earlier during the day at about 0930 hours, [REDACTED], who lived in a house next door to the salon had asked to borrow [REDACTED]'s car, which was a common occurrence. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] stated that she needed the car to do some errands such as purchasing groceries, and picking up some prescription medication. Around an hour later, possibly 1030 hours, [REDACTED] came running into the salon while [REDACTED] was coloring a customer's hair. She said "the fucking cops are here" which [REDACTED] knew to mean the police were after Andrew Stigliano, who lived with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] asked to use and [REDACTED] let her use a cell phone. [REDACTED] went behind a curtain that separated the customer area from a back area of the salon. [REDACTED] could hear [REDACTED] talking on the phone, but could not hear the discussion because [REDACTED] was busy attending to her customer. [REDACTED], another employee of the salon went over to [REDACTED] to console her, as she apparently had become upset. After about five minutes, [REDACTED] left the salon, however [REDACTED] stated that since she was working with her customer still, she didn't see [REDACTED] actually walk out the door. After approximately 25 minutes [REDACTED] finished with her customer and went outside the salon. She

walked over towards [REDACTED]'s home, and stated she observed a chaotic scene, with numerous police officers present and an ambulance pulling up. [REDACTED] was told by an unknown bystander that some gunshots had been fired, but [REDACTED] indicated that she had not heard gunfire herself.

3. I requested and received from [REDACTED] consent to search her cellular telephone in relation to this case. The phone had previously been secured as evidence.
