On February 13th, 2022 at approximately 1515 Hours, I spoke with Kimberly Hine over the phone. Hine had called the Lexington Police after hearing the news story the night prior in which witnesses were asked come forward.

Hine informed me that she was driving on Hancock St and approaching the rotary. She could see at least four Police Officers on the other side of the rotary and a male party wearing a gray shirt that was seated on the ground. Hine observed the male party get up and move towards where she could see one of the officers standing and then heard what she thought were five to seven gun shots. Hines took out her phone and started video recording approximately 20 seconds after the shooting.

Hine subsequently sent me the video. Hine described an Officer who was putting gloves on. She said the Officer rendering treatment to the person on the ground in the video was the one she saw putting gloves on previously. The video ended prior to treatment commencing.

Hine described the area during the incident as cars pouring out of the street that the Diamond School was on, and there is one lady who can be seen on the video walking her dog in the area as the shots were being fired.
