SUBJECT: INTERVIEW OF [REDACTED]

1. On March 24, 2012 at approximately 2345 hours, Malden Police Department Detective JP Kelley and I conducted an interview of [REDACTED] in the stairway of her home at [REDACTED], East Boston. [REDACTED] had been informed about the death of William Ekasala prior to our arrival, and was upset and visibly emotional about the incident. She provided the following identification information:

2. She stated that she lived with Ekasala in the third floor apartment of 36 Bennington St. He was her boyfriend, and the father of her child. She had not seen him all day on this date, or on the day prior, as she had slept at her mother's home. She stated that Ekasala was very depressed and "down" lately over his inability to earn any money to support her and their child. She described that he had been "obsessed" with trying to make money lately because "he didn't feel like a man because we were broke." She had expected that Ekasala would be staying home all day on this date and sleeping because he had not been sleeping very well lately.

3. [REDACTED] stated that Ekasala doesn't drive at all, and that he was a "terrible driver." She stated that he had never gotten a license, and definitely wouldn't know how to drive a standard "stick" shift vehicle.
