SUBJECT: INTERVIEW OF [REDACTED]

1. On March 23, 2012, Malden Police Department Detective JP Kelly and I conducted an interview of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] provided the following identification information:

FBI Special Agent Lisa Baillargeon assisted with translation, as [REDACTED] spoke Spanish, and little English. The interview was conducted on the street near 475 Broadway, Malden.

2. [REDACTED] explained that he was employed at JRM Recycling, and was riding home from work in the backseat of [REDACTED]'s car. Another co-worker, [REDACTED], was also in the vehicle, and was in the front passenger seat. As they were stopped at a red light on Broadway near the entrance of Cliffside Commons a guy suddenly came up to the car and pointed a gun at all three of them. Just before this guy had approached the car, [REDACTED] heard what he thought was the sound of gunshots nearby. When the shots were fired, everyone in the car had ducked down because they sounded so close. [REDACTED] heard at least two shots fired, and his friends in the car started yelling "Get down!" [REDACTED] stated the male with the gun had come up to the car on the passenger side. He was pointing the gun at them and yelling "Get out! Get out!" He was a white male, with short hair, "fat" and "pretty tall," but [REDACTED] couldn't describe him more specifically than that. He stated that he didn't see the male clearly, and wasn't sure what he had on for clothing.

3. After [REDACTED] and his co-workers exited the car they all ran behind a fence that ran alongside the property at 475 Broadway. They immediately got on the ground and remained lying down there until the shooting stopped. While on the ground, [REDACTED] heard a lot of gunfire being exchanged. He stated he couldn't tell who was firing, nor could he differentiate the sounds of the shots, but assumed the "police and the bad guys" were shooting back and forth at each other. [REDACTED] didn't hear any screaming as this all occurred, except for the sound of a woman screaming when he was first fleeing [REDACTED]'s car. He thought the woman who was screaming was in another vehicle across the street from them. On the ground, [REDACTED] kept his head down and covered.

4. [REDACTED] indicated that when the shooting stopped, he saw police officers both in uniform and plain clothes around [REDACTED]'s vehicle, which had moved from where it had originally been while he had his head down. About 6-7 police officers were also in front of [REDACTED]'s car, and had guns out and pointed at the vehicle.
