THORN: 17 **TPR. GAGNE:** Sure, you know -I don't understand. 18 MS. THORN: 19 TPR. GAGNE: We're trying to establish the 20 background. 21 Yeah. Naturally. Yeah. MS. THORN: 2.2 TPR. GAGNE: Given the situation, and the fact that 23 you were together. 24 MS. THORN: He was just my best friend.

4 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. So how long have you -1 MS. THORN: I've known him -2 3 TPR. GAGNE: Known him? 4 MS. THORN: Think I met him when I was 16? 15? 5 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. MS. THORN: Pretty much known him all my life. 6 TPR. GAGNE: 7 In - In -8 MS. THORN: In High School. My middle sister is two 9 years older than me. **TPR. GAGNE:** 10 Okay. 11 And, so, naturally when you have older MS. THORN: 12 sisters, you just meet older people. 13 **TPR. GAGNE:** Yeah. Kind of goes along with it. 14 MS. THORN: And I met him when I was 16, he was probably 17, 18, yeah. 15 16 TPR. GAGNE: Mhm. 17 MS. THORN: And we've just been friends, for 20 18 years. 19 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. You stayed in contact through the 20 years? 21 MS. THORN: Yeah. I talk to him, if not every day, 22 every other day. 23 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. Alright. 24

1 MS. THORN: He had trouble with his roommate's 2 girlfriend. 3 Okay. What kind of trouble? **TPR. GAGNE:** 4 MS. THORN: Just totally piss him off completely. 5 They'd smash the apartment up, wreck the apartment, all the 6 time. He tried to get them to be kicked out, numerously. 7 Everything always turned around on him and made it look like he 8 was the bad guy, because Alan has a temper, and Alan - had a 9 temper. And he found her going through his stuff, he called me at 3 o'clock yesterday, after I dropped him off. He was so mad, 10 11 he was just like "That crazy psycho bitch is - I catched her 12 going" - coming out of his room when he came home. 13 TPR. GAGNE: Came home from where? 14 MS. THORN: I dropped him off. 15 Alright. So let's back it up. We'll get **TPR. GAGNE:** 16 to that. 17 MS. THORN: Yeah. 18 TPR. GAGNE: I don't want to be skipping around. 19 MS. THORN: Oh, yeah. 20 TPR. GAGNE: So, you have a mutual friend that 21 passed away. 2.2 MS. THORN: Right. So we went to the wake together. 23 TPR. GAGNE: Okay.

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7 MS. THORN: Him and I went to the wake together, 1 2 on Friday -3 TPR. GAGNE: And how -4 MS. THORN: So we left around 5, and we went to the 5 wake, and I dropped him off - because my dad was watching my 6 daughter. 7 **TPR. GAGNE:** What time did you drop him off? 8 MS. THORN: 6:30? Maybe? 9 **TPR. GAGNE:** Did you stop anywhere on the way back from the wake or did you just kind of go to the wake and -10 11 MS. THORN: No. Yeah. No, we just went to the wake 12 and came back. 13 **TPR. GAGNE:** So 5 to 6:30. So I went home and got my daughter. 14 MS. THORN: 15 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 16 My father had left to go see my nieces MS. THORN: 17 in Boston. 18 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. 19 MS. THORN: It's a long story. So I picked Abby up, 20 and he called me, and said, "I need to get out of the house 21 now", and I went, and picked him up. 2.2 You went back, Friday? TPR. GAGNE: 23 Friday night. MS. THORN: 24 **TPR. GAGNE:** At what time was that?

8 He said the cops were being called -1 MS. THORN: there was, you know, all I know is that I picked him up and he 2 was irate, he was totally pissed off. And, I mean, he was 3 4 totally fine when I dropped him off. And probably not even forty 5 five minutes later I came back and picked him up. What time did you drop him off 6 DET. HOLMES: 7 initially, you said, after the wake? 8 MS. THORN: Yeah, I picked him up at five to go to 9 the wake and we're there probably until 6:30. And then I dropped him off. My father left around 7:30, maybe? I don't know. The 10 11 time is -12 DET. HOLMES: Right. 13 **TPR. GAGNE:** Well you went back from that house, you 14 dropped Alan off, and went back to your house? 15 MS. THORN: Right. 16 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 17 MS. THORN: And got my daughter. 18 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 19 MS. THORN: And then I went back and picked Alan 20 up. Because my father had to leave, I needed somebody to watch 21 Abby. 2.2 **TPR. GAGNE:** Alright. 23 And, my father had to leave, so I put MS. THORN: 24 Abby in the car, and I went and got Alan.

9 1 **TPR. GAGNE:** When you get back to the - let's talk about that - when you get back to the house, to pick Alan up, 2 3 did you go inside the house? Did you stay outside the house? 4 MS. THORN: I stayed outside the house. 5 **TPR. GAGNE:** Okay. MS. THORN: I walked into the house, and 6 7 immediately turned around, and he came back, with me. 8 TPR. GAGNE: Alright, so explain the scenario when 9 you walked in, what you saw. Screaming, yelling. The dining room 10 MS. THORN: table - the black kitchen table -11 12 TPR. GAGNE: Mhm. 13 MS. THORN: Was smushed to bits. 14 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 15 MS. THORN: He tried to tell me that Devin did it. 16 And then Saturday morning, he said "I know, Amy, I lied. I did 17 that." 18 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. So he told you he broke the table-19 20 MS. THORN: Yeah. 21 TPR. GAGNE: But that was the next morning. 2.2 MS. THORN: Right. 23 TPR. GAGNE: So when you pick him up -

10 1 MS. THORN: Right. TPR. GAGNE: He says - so he calls you - so when you 2 3 left him -4 MS. THORN: Yup. Were you coming back anyway, or did he 5 **TPR. GAGNE:** 6 call you to come back? 7 MS. THORN: I was going to come back anyway. 8 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. 9 MS. THORN: So, my intention was to drop him off, 10 go get my daughter, and -11 TPR. GAGNE: Come back and hang out? 12 MS. THORN: No, bring him back to my house. 13 **TPR. GAGNE:** Oh, bring him back to your house. Yeah. And that's what we did. 14 MS. THORN: **TPR. GAGNE:** 15 Now why did you bring him - why didn't 16 you go straight to your house? If you were going back anyway? 17 MS. THORN: Because my father was there. **TPR. GAGNE:** 18 Oh, alright, you wanted to wait for 19 your father to just leave. 20 MS. THORN: Right. 21 Okay. Yeah. Alright. **TPR. GAGNE:** 2.2 MS. THORN: I came home, and I believe I was in bed at 11 o'clock with Abby. 23 TPR. GAGNE: 24 Okay.

11 1 MS. THORN: He slept on the couch upstairs. **TPR. GAGNE:** So you came back to the house, he's 2 3 upset, you heard yelling, mutual yelling, one person yelling-4 MS. THORN: Yeah. 5 In particular, or just - ? **TPR. GAGNE:** 6 MS. THORN: No, just yelling at everybody. **TPR. GAGNE:** 7 Did he say anything was physical? 8 MS. THORN: No. 9 TPR. GAGNE: Or becoming that way? 10 MS. THORN: No, no, no. 11 TPR. GAGNE: Police maybe have been there before? 12 MS. THORN: Yeah. He's constantly yelling at those 13 two. 14 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 15 MS. THORN: At Devin and his girlfriend. 16 So this is an ongoing -TPR. GAGNE: 17 MS. THORN: It's been going on for about six 18 months. TPR. GAGNE: 19 Okay. 20 MS. THORN: And then we got up, Saturday morning -21 TPR. GAGNE: Well, let's - I don't mean to -2.2 MS. THORN: Alright. 23 TPR. GAGNE: Let's slow down. 24 MS. THORN: Yeah.

| 24 | MS. THORN: | No. Actually, he's been pretty clean. |

13 1 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. MS. THORN: 2 Yeah. 3 TPR. GAGNE: And you picked him up, he's upset, 4 given the circumstances -5 MS. THORN: Right. 6 TPR. GAGNE: And he told you at that point that they 7 smashed up the table. You saw the table, and discussed it, and he told you. You go back to the house, is he still talking about 8 9 it, or was it -10 No, no he was just pissed. MS. THORN: 11 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. So -12 MS. THORN: He was just mad. He was just pissed. 13 TPR. GAGNE: He cooled down. MS. THORN: 14 Yeah. 15 You guys hang out, you go to bed. You **TPR. GAGNE:** 16 wake up. Let's talk about Saturday now. 17 MS. THORN: Saturday, we got up. I made breakfast. 18 He slept on the couch until like 10 o'clock; he said he wasn't 19 feeling good. He felt like he was getting a cold. 20 TPR. GAGNE: Mhm. 21 And I said, "Well, no offense buddy, MS. THORN: 22 but if you're getting sick, I can't have you around my 23 daughter". 24 TPR. GAGNE: Yeah. Right.

14 1 And, so, I made breakfast, we get up, MS. THORN: blah, blah, blah. And we decided to go for a hike at Mount 2 3 (indiscernible). 4 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 5 MS. THORN: And I -TPR. GAGNE: The three of you? 6 7 MS. THORN: The three of us. Yup. 8 **TPR. GAGNE:** Alright. 9 MS. THORN: We decided - we went - I don't know, (indiscernible) Park Town Road? We went and we were outside for 10 11 about two hours, maybe. And then we went to McDonalds, had 12 lunch. 13 **TPR. GAGNE:** Okay. 14 MS. THORN: And I dropped him off. He said "I don't 15 want to go home." I said "I know, but, you know, I got other 16 stuff to do." 17 **TPR. GAGNE:** When does he tell you that he smashed 18 the table? 19 MS. THORN: In the morning. 20 **TPR. GAGNE:** In the morning? 21 MS. THORN: Yeah. 2.2 **TPR. GAGNE:** You just, you woke up, and -23 MS. THORN: Yeah. 24 Started talking about it again? **TPR. GAGNE:**

15 Oh he's just - "Fucking Devin, you 1 MS. THORN: know" - he's known Devin for another 25 years. 2 3 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 4 MS. THORN: And it's this girlfriend, he just could 5 not stand the girlfriend at all, and he just tried to get her 6 out of the house constantly, and it just never happened. And in 7 the morning, I was just talking - yeah, because the cops were 8 called on Friday night, I think? Anthony, his brother Anthony, 9 called him when I picked him up. 10 DET. HOLMES: When you picked him up on Friday night? 11 MS. THORN: Friday night. 12 DET. HOLMES: You were going from - to go to the 13 wake, or after? 14 MS. THORN: No, after. After I dropped him off. And 15 then I gone and got my daughter, and then I came back and got 16 him. And he was on the phone with his brother. 17 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 18 MS. THORN: And he said that the cops had been 19 called. But Alan wasn't there, I picked him up. 20 **TPR. GAGNE:** You picked him up and brought him 21 there, right? 2.2 MS. THORN: There were no cops when I got there. 23 TPR. GAGNE: Okay. 24 DET. HOLMES: Right.

16 1 MS. THORN: I mean he was pissed, and the table 2 was in a pile. 3 DET. HOLMES: Mhm. 4 MS. THORN: But, that was it. That was the end of 5 that conversation. During the screaming and yelling, did 6 DET. HOLMES: 7 you hear that roommate or girlfriend say that they were involved 8 with the -9 MS. THORN: I didn't hear anything. No. 10 DET. HOLMES: Okay. Honestly. Honestly, I didn't hear 11 MS. THORN: 12 anything cause Abby was in the -13 DET. HOLMES: Okay. And the brother was not there? 14 MS. THORN: No, not that I know. Abby was in the 15 car. I left the car running. I ran inside, I said "Let's go. 16 Now." 17 DET. HOLMES: Okay. 18 **TPR. GAGNE:** Okay. 19 MS. THORN: And that was it. 20 DET. HOLMES: Right. 21 MS. THORN: And then we got back to the house, he 22 was talking to his brother. 23 **DET. HOLMES:** On the phone? 24 MS. THORN: On the phone.

17 DET. HOLMES: 1 Yeah. When you picked him up for the wake -2 **TPR. GAGNE:** 3 So they called the - yeah - mhm -MS. THORN: 4 TPR. GAGNE: Was he having any issues with the 5 roommates? 6 MS. THORN: He always had issues. 7 TPR. GAGNE: I mean specifically then, though. 8 MS. THORN: No. 9 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. So the issues didn't happen 10 until he got back in that span when you were gone to pick up 11 your daughter, that's when they had an altercation. 12 MS. THORN: On Friday night. 13 **TPR. GAGNE:** So when he started to tell you about the table, does he tell you anything else about the altercation? 14 15 MS. THORN: No. 16 He just admits that he -**TPR. GAGNE:** 17 MS. THORN: He said "Sorry, Ame, I lied to you." 18 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. 19 MS. THORN: Kind of like, "My bad". 20 TPR. GAGNE: Yeah. Okay. 21 MS. THORN: "Sorry, I shouldn't have lied to you". 22 More like that. Because I said "Who did that to the table?" And 23 he said "Fuckin' Devin did it." And in the morning he said "Oh, 24 sorry, I did that."

18 1 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. MS. THORN: And that was -2 3 So you go on a hike. TPR. GAGNE: 4 MS. THORN: Yeah. Go to McDonalds. 5 TPR. GAGNE: Then you drop him off. You go to 6 McDonalds, and then you drop him off. 7 MS. THORN: Yup. 8 TPR. GAGNE: What time do you think you dropped him off? 9 2:30. 10 MS. THORN: 11 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. 12 MS. THORN: Because Abby was asleep. I talked to 13 him on the phone at 3. 14 DET. HOLMES: That was the last time you spoke to 15 him? 16 MS. THORN: Yeah. 17 **TPR. GAGNE:** When you pick him up on Friday night -18 MS. THORN: Yup. 19 TPR. GAGNE: And he leaves - comes out and you say 20 "Let's go". Does he come right out with you and follow you out, 21 or does he - do you head back to your car to meet you in the 2.2 car? 23 He was right behind me. MS. THORN: 24 **TPR. GAGNE:** He was right behind you?

20 1 MS. THORN: Hi Mom. I'm at the Reading Police 2 Station. Yes, I'm talking about Alan. A Detective and a State 3 Trooper. Detective. Because I was the last one to see him. Okay. 4 I got to go Mom. No. Okay. 5 (MS. THORN ENDS PHONE CALL) MS. THORN: 6 Sorry. 7 TPR. GAGNE: No. It's okay. 8 MS. THORN: She's now -9 TPR. GAGNE: She's got your daughter -10 MS. THORN: Really worried. 11 TPR. GAGNE: No, I just don't want her to be nervous 12 where you were. So, what does he say to you when -13 MS. THORN: He was pissed. He said that when I 14 dropped him off, he caught Devin's girlfriend coming out of his 15 room. 16 DET. HOLMES: And this was at 2:30? 17 MS. THORN: Yeah. On Saturday. 18 DET. HOLMES: Okay. 19 MS. THORN: And I said "Alan, don't do anything 20 stupid." That was the last thing I said to him. And he said "No 21 Ame, I won't, I might just get arrested." That's the last thing 2.2 Т-23 **TPR. GAGNE:** So the conversation was brief. When you 24 dropped him off, do you know if anybody was home?

21 MS. THORN: I don't know. When I dropped him off 1 2 Saturday -3 Right. Right. TPR. GAGNE: 4 MS. THORN: His brother had come out. His brother 5 came out, was in the parking lot, when he was getting out of the 6 car. 7 **TPR. GAGNE:** Okay. So he saw his brother? 8 MS. THORN: Yeah. He saw his brother. 9 TPR. GAGNE: Alright. 10 MS. THORN: What they talked about, I don't know. Well, that's -11 **TPR. GAGNE:** 12 MS. THORN: They were definitely talking -13 TPR. GAGNE: Sure. 14 MS. THORN: But, I just, got in the car, and went 15 away. My phone is starting to blow up. 16 And he calls you, the conversation is TPR. GAGNE: 17 just about her being in his room? 18 MS. THORN: Right. Anything specific about -19 **TPR. GAGNE:** 20 MS. THORN: No. 21 Anything in the room? **TPR. GAGNE:** 2.2 MS. THORN: That's the darndest thing. No. I said 23 "What was - what was she doing in your room?" And he said "I 24 don't know. I just caught her coming out when I was walking into

22 the" - because he lived down - they pissed him off so bad. They 1 would fall asleep - or have sex or whatever - and leave the TV 2 3 blaring upstairs in his room. So, he moved his bedroom 4 downstairs. 5 DET. HOLMES: Right off the kitchen? MS. THORN: Right off the kitchen. 6 7 DET. HOLMES: Right where that table was smashed. 8 MS. THORN: That was his bed. 9 DET. HOLMES: Was that was his TV, his couch, his bed? That was his area? 10 11 MS. THORN: Yes. He moved all his stuff, he just 12 had clothes that were upstairs in the bedroom. 13 DET. HOLMES: And the roommate and the girlfriend lived in the -14 15 MS. THORN: Upstairs. 16 Right above him, in that other bedroom. DET. HOLMES: 17 MS. THORN: He couldn't sleep - like - blaring -18 DET. HOLMES: Yeah. 19 MS. THORN: It's just like total disregard for a 20 roommate, you know. 21 DET. HOLMES: Right. It was a constant, constant, constant 2.2 MS. THORN: thing. He just was so mad and there wasn't anything he could do. 23 24 They wouldn't leave.

23 Right. Did he pay rent there? 1 DET. HOLMES: MS. THORN: Not really. 2 3 DET. HOLMES: Okay. 4 MS. THORN: What's his name - the owner of the gas station - is, you know, so - Anthony, is Alan's brother. 5 6 DET. HOLMES: Mhm. 7 MS. THORN: Anthony is like the Manager -8 DET. HOLMES: That works at the gas station 9 MS. THORN: Of the gas station. 10 DET. HOLMES: Yeah. 11 MS. THORN: So when Alan needed a place to live, a 12 couple years ago, they hooked him up. 13 DET.
