On January 04, 2023, Trooper Blake A. Bearden #3533, Tpr Jason Beausoleil #3914, and I responded to 59 Chestnut St. in Cambridge for a fatal shooting investigation and the following items were returned to the Maynard Crime Lab for examination:

- 1-1 One (1) 9mm Luger caliber Sig Sauer P320 semi-automatic pistol serial number 58A169548
- 1-2 One (1) magazine inserted into item 1-1.
- 1-3 Eleven (11) 9mm luger caliber live cartridges with HS "WIN 9mm +P" from item 1-2. caliber
- 1-4 One (1) 9mm luger caliber live cartridge with HS "WIN 9mm +P" from the chamber of item 1-1.
- 1-5 One (1) 9mm luger caliber discharged cartridge casing with HS "WIN 9mm +P" next to CSSS placard #3 recovered from the ground in the backyard of 59 Chestnut St.
- 1-6 One (1) 9mm luger caliber discharged cartridge casing with HS "WIN 9mm +P" next to CSSS placard #4 recovered from the ground in the backyard of 59 Chestnut St.
- 1-7 One (1) 9mm luger caliber discharged cartridge casing with HS "WIN 9mm +P" next to CSSS placard #5 recovered from the ground in the backyard of 59 Chestnut St.
- 1-8 One (1) 9mm luger caliber discharged cartridge casing with HS "WIN 9mm +P" next to CSSS placard #6 recovered from the ground in the backyard of 59 Chestnut St.
- 1-9 One (1) 9mm luger caliber discharged cartridge casing with HS "WIN 9mm +P" next to CSSS placard #7 recovered from the ground in the backyard of 59 Chestnut St.
- 1-10 One (1) 9mm luger caliber discharged cartridge casing with HS "WIN 9mm +P" next to CSSS placard #8 recovered from the ground in the backyard of 59 Chestnut St.

On January 06, 2023 Tpr Beausoleil recovered the following items from the ME Office Boston:

- 6-1 One (1) spent projectile received from OCME.
- 6-2 One (1) spent projectile received from OCME.


As recovered the weapon is a 9mm caliber Sig Sauer, Model P320, semi auto pistol, SN# 58A169548 with a barrel length of 3 ¾ inches and a general rifling system consisting of six lands and six grooves with a right hand twist. Item 1-1 was test fired using two live 9mm caliber cartridges from item 1-3, no malfunctions were noted.

After physical and microscopic examination of items 1-5 through 1-10 and 6-1, 6-2 against the test fires from item 1-1, my findings are the following:

A/ The discharged cartridge casings mentioned in items 1-5 through 1-10 above were fired from the Sig Sauer pistol described in item 1-1 above. **Identification.**

B/ The projectiles mentioned in items 6-1 and 6-2 above were fired from the Sig Sauer pistol described in item 1-1 above. **Identification.**

This report reflects the test results, conclusions, interpretations, and/or the findings of the analyst as indicated by the signature below. Reported results relate only to the items tested, sampled, certified, calibrated, or data processed. Information regarding any items which the laboratory collected or created and preserved for future testing is available upon request.

Any barrel or overall length measurement stated in this report, as applied to Mass General Law Chapter 140 Section 121, has an associated estimated uncertainty at a 95.45% coverage probability, which can be provided upon request.

FIS Terminology:

Identification • A sufficient correspondence of individual characteristics to conclude that both items “questioned” evidence and “known” tests originated from the same source.

Exclusion • A disagreement of class or individual characteristics to conclude that both items “questioned” evidence and “known” tests did not originate from the same source.

Inconclusive • An insufficient correspondence of individual characteristics but a correspondence of class characteristics to conclude that both items possess similar rifling or similar markings and could have originated from the same source but there is insufficient information for identification.

Unsuitable • A lack of suitable microscopic characteristics to conclude that the items are not suitable for comparison.
