Impoundment Order

In connection with the above-referenced inquest, the Commonwealth is represented by Carrie Spiros, Esq. and Caroline Evans, Esq., the target of the inquest, Officer Liam McMahon, is represented by Kenneth Anderson, Esq., and the family of the deceased, Sayed Arif Faisal, is represented by Marsha Kazarosian, Esq.

Now before the court is the Commonwealth's Motion Regarding Impoundment Matters.

In its motion the Commonwealth asks this court to impound only what is required to be impounded by law. The target and the family of the deceased have no objection to the Commonwealth's request.

After a hearing this date, the court finds that good cause for impoundment has been demonstrated. See <u>In re Globe Newspaper</u>, <u>Co.</u>, <u>Inc</u>. 461 Mass. 113 (2011).

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that the Clerk of this Court immediately impound the following material related to this matter. Such material shall be kept separate and apart from the material to which the public has access:

- 1) Autopsy report and photographs, per G. L. c. 38, § 2; 505 C.M.R. 1.00, G.L. c. 4, § 7 (26);
- 2) cellular phone records, per G.L. c. 4, § 7(26), and 18 U.S.C. §§ 2701-2712; and

3) personal addresses, dates of birth, and phone numbers, per G. L. c. 4, § 7(26)(c).

The parties have not requested impoundment of medical, health and hospital records, mental health records, personal medical information, school records, and video purporting to depict the deceased harming, or attempting to harm himself.

Otherwise, the case file and docket for this matter shall be made available to the public.
