25	THE COURT: All right. And just before

we begin, I just want to maybe put a few things on the record.

And just so, for the people that have never been involved in an inquest or aren't familiar with the procedure, this is not a confrontational exercise, meaning it is not a -- a trial where there are different sides.

The purpose of an inquest is to provide the fact finder, me, with information from which I can determine whether there's probable cause or not to believe that a crime occurred in connection with the events of February 12, 2022.

So, to that end, while there is -- there may be questioning of various witnesses, cross-examination of the witnesses is not allowed and not permitted under the rules.

A further thing, and I think the lawyers are aware of this, but to the extent that other people are not, we were out at the scene this morning looking at the -- doing a view.

I kind of disclosed to everybody beforehand I'm from Lexington. I graduated from Lexington High School. I grew up about 100 yards away, 200 yards away from where the incident took place.

I grew up on Liberty Avenue, so I'm very familiar with the scene, I'm very familiar with the area.

I don't know any of the parties involved.

I haven't been back to Lexington since I graduated.

Well, my parents sold the house in 1987.

I graduated college in 1985. I haven't been back to Lexington since right around then, other than to drive through on the highway and occasionally just driving through.

But I just wanted everyone to understand that I am very familiar with the area around where this all took place.

I have no vested interest in anything that happened. I don't know any of the parties.

So with that -- and, also, just one other thing, I apologize.

I notice that there are people that are wearing masks. If anyone prefers to wear a mask, that is totally fine with me, so whatever your comfort level is; and that goes for any of the witnesses that are going to come in.

Anyone that wants to wear a mask should feel completely comfortable wearing a mask. All

right?

MR. VAN EPPS: Your Honor, I just wanted to address a couple housekeeping matters before we call the first witness.

Prior to the proceedings today, there have been three discovery notices. There was a fourth sort of rolling discovery that was kind of leading up to today.

I brought hard copies of the materials, and I've given them to the clerk. I'll have an inventory of them, an actual notice, for the Court a little bit later.

Most of them are transcripts of things like that. There's also the training materials the Court wanted me to get.

THE COURT: Yes.

MR. VAN EPPS: There are -- there is a new State Police interview report in there involving a -- a juvenile that the Court can read over. We can talk about that later.

I also did disclose to counsel ahead of time, Officer Charles DiChiara is -- you know, we expect to call on January 4th as a -- for background -- on use of force and training and things like that.

1 He was apparently disciplined in 1998 by 2 the Waltham Police for conduct unbecoming. 3 Essentially, he -- he used foul language 4 during booking. 5 He essentially was -- took over the 6 booking of a very argumentative and hostile 7 arrestee, who had been threatening a female 8 officer -- essentially threatening to rape her 9 and all these things. 10 And when the guy challenged DiChiara to a 11 fight, DiChiara referred to him as a coward but 12 also referred to him using foul language 13 referring to a woman's genitalia -- the P word, 14 not the C word. 15 And he was later disciplined for that and 16 served a suspension. So I don't know that it has 17 a lot of value, but I just want to bring it up --18 THE COURT: Okay. MR. VAN EPPS: -- out of an abundance of 19 20 caution. 21 THE COURT: Sure. Okay. Whenever you're 22 ready. 23 MR. VAN EPPS: Commonwealth calls Kim 24 Hine. 25

- Q. Good morning, ma'am. Can you please
- 15 introduce yourself to the Court and spell your
- 16 first and last name for us?

- 18 My name is Kim, K-I-M, Hine, H-I-N-E.
- 19 Q. All right. Is Kim a nickname, or is that
- 20 your full name?
- 21 A. Kimberly.

- 25 Q. Ma'am, how old are you currently as you sit

- 12 Q. Okay. Do you currently work?

But I couldn't, so I kind of went one extra turn around the rotary after the incident.

- Q. Okay. The rotary you're talking about --

- Q. -- is that the rotary near the Diamond Middle
- 14 | School?

- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. Are you familiar with that rotary?
- 17 A. Very much. My kids went to school there.
- 18 Q. Your kids went to Diamond Middle School?
- 19 A. Correct.
- 20 Q. Okay. How many -- how frequently would you
- 21 say that you go through that area on a regular
- 22 basis?
- A. Oh, probably only once a week.
- 24 \ Q. All right. But it's fairly frequently?
- 25 A. Yeah, yeah. Probably about once a week or

1 so.

- Q. Okay. So what street are you taking to approach the rotary that day?
- A. Hancock.
- O. Hancock?

You said that you couldn't go through the rotary.

Can you please describe to us what you observed as you approached the rotary from Hancock Street?

A. Sure.

So the rotary has four roads plus the driveway to Diamond, which is kind of like a road because it's a really long driveway.

And when you come up to the rotary, you're supposed to stop before you merge on, which is what I did.

And when I stopped -- it all happened really quickly -- but I saw pretty much straight across from me, so when I was on Hancock, then there's the Diamond driveway, then there's -- I think that's called Burlington Street.

So on whatever that street is called, I saw a man lying perpendicular to the road, and there was about, like, six cops around him.

- And I saw what looked like the -- the cops
 were holding what looked like rifles, like, long
 guns, but I -- I'm now assuming they weren't
 actually rifles, but, like, those bean bag -- I'm
 going to say the wrong here, like, bean bag guns.
 - Q. I'm going to ask you a few more questions --
- 7 A. Um-hum.

- Q. -- about that --
- 9 A. Um-hum.
- Q. -- but first I'm going to show you a document and ask you if you recognize this. Okay?
- MS. GEMMILL: Your Honor, may I approach?
- 13 THE COURT: Yes.
- MS. GEMMILL: Okay.
- 15 BY MS. GEMMILL:
- Q. Ms. Hine, can you just take a look at this
- 17 | image and -- oh, I'm sorry.
- 18 A. Um-hum.
- 19 Q. Tell me if you recognize what's depicted in
- 20 this image.

- 23 A. The rotary and the five roads.

- 6 Q. Okay. And then the next road around the
- 7 rotary is Burlington Street, correct?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. All right. I'm going to bring you Exhibit 1,
- 10 and I'm just going to ask if you can mark for us
- 11 where you saw the man who was laying on the
- 12 roadway.
- 13 A. Okay.
- 14 (Inaudible discussion.)
- 15 BY MS. GEMMILL:
- 16 Q. If you can just draw a little oval for us in
- 17 the approximate area of where you saw the man
- 18 laying.
- 19 A. (No audible response.)
- 20 Q. Okay. Thank you.
- 21 MS. GEMMILL: I'm just going to publish
- 22 Exhibit 1 again.
- BY MS. GEMMILL:
- 24 Q. So that little dark mark you made up here on
- 25 Burlington Street is where the man was laying?

- 1 A. Yes.
- 2 \ Q. So you mentioned that there were cops around
- 3 this man; is that correct?
- 4 A. Yes.
- 5 | Q. And that's police officers, right?
- 6 A. Yes.
- 7 Q. And how many did you think you saw?
- 8 A. I'm quessing, like, six.
- 9 Q. Okay. What did you observe about the man who
- 10 was lying in the roadway?
- 11 Like, could you see from your position
- what color his skin was, that kind of thing?
- 13 A. Only thing I really remember, I think he had
- a hoodie on, but, and he was white, that's all I
- 15 remember, really.
- 16 Q. Okay. You mentioned that you noticed some of
- 17 | these officers holding what looked like long
- 18 | rifles.
- Do you know how many of those long rifles
- 20 you saw?
- 21 A. No.
- 22 Q. Did it appear that only one officer was
- 23 holding a rifle like that or more than one
- 24 officer?
- 25 A. No, it was more than one. I would guess

- three maybe. I don't know.
- 2 I -- like, they were around the guy, so I
- 3 think some of the cops were kind of blocked, you
- 4 know, blocking the others.
- But I would say at least three maybe. It could be more.
- Q. Did you notice anything about the color of those rifles?
 - A. If you made me pick a color, I'd say brown.
- 10 Q. Okay. Could you see whether or not the man
- on the ground was moving around at all when you
- 12 | first observed him?
- 13 A. I saw him, like, try to get up.
- 14 Like, he was lying like this and he -- if
- 15 you're lying like this, kind of pushed himself
- 16 up, but he didn't -- I don't remember him getting
- 17 all the way up.
- 18 Q. You're kind of making a movement with your
- 19 body where you sort of put your hands behind
- 20 you.

- Is that what the man was doing, is putting
- 22 his -- putting his hands behind him?
- 23 A. Well, I remember his torso, like, coming up a
- 24 little bit, and I would imagine unless -- I mean,
- 25 unless you have a really strong core, you don't

- usually get up without some sort of leverage, so...
- Q. Okay. So was he in, like, a seated position at that point?
- A. I don't even remember him getting all the way up to seated, to be honest.
- Q. All right. What was happening with his legs when you're observing him putting his hands
- 9 behind him?
- 10 A. I don't remember anything about his legs.
- Q. Okay. Could you see whether or not this man had anything in his hands?
- A. I don't, but I was -- I mean, if you remember
 the -- remember the picture, I'm, like, pretty
 far away, so I don't remember anything in his
 hands.
- He could have, but I don't remember it.
- Q. Okay. We'll get back to that in just a second.
- 20 So you are -- are you kind of stuck at the 21 intersection of Hamilton and this rotary?
- 22 A. Hancock.
- 23 Q. Excuse me, Hancock and this rotary?
- A. I'm basically where I would normally stop to get on to the rotary; I just -- I stopped. I

- didn't move any -- I'm still -- I'm not in the
- 2 rotary yet.
- 3 | Q. Do you have a sense about how long you stayed
- 4 in that particular spot?
- 5 A. Total? Maybe five minutes.
- 6 Q. Okay. So a matter of minutes?
- 7 A. Yeah.
- Q. All right. Did you ever observe the male on
- 9 the ground move into a different position from
- 10 that sort of leaned back position that you were
- 11 describing?
- 12 A. I mean, most of the time he was flat.
- 13 Q. Okay. When he wasn't flat, can you describe
- 14 what you saw him do, if anything?
- 15 A. Again, like, he -- all I remember is that
- 16 he kind of got up; but he didn't get all the way
- 17 up.
- 18 Q. Okay. Could you see whether he got his feet
- 19 underneath him to stand?
- 20 A. I don't remember the feet.
- 21 Q. All right. Could you see what the police
- 22 officers were doing, if they were moving around
- at all while this man was on the ground?
- 24 A. Not that I can remember.
- 25 Q. Okay. From your vantage point, could you

- 1 hear any sounds?
- 2 A. Well, I heard gunshots.
- 3 Q. We'll get to that in just a second.
- 4 But prior to hearing a sound of possible
- 5 gunshots, did you hear any other sounds, like
- 6 voices?
- 7 A. I think I heard some type of yelling; but,
- 8 like, my window was up and I'm sure my radio was
- 9 on.
- I know my radio was on, because I remember
- 11 turning it down.
- 12 So there was, like, some shouting, but I
- did not discern any words because, again, my
- 14 radio was on and my window was up. It was cold.
- 15 It was winter.
- 16 Q. At any point during your observations in the
- 17 rotary that day, did you hear any words that were
- 18 being said by the folks --
- 19 A. No.
- 20 Q. -- that you could see?
- 21 A. No. Just some shouts.
- 22 Q. Could you tell where the shouting was coming
- 23 from?
- 24 A. No.
- 25 Q. Okay. So you couldn't discern if the

- shouting was coming from the man on the ground or from the police officers or from both?
 - A. No.

- 4 Q. Okay. All right. So you're watching this
- 5 man who's -- who's on the ground; he's trying --
- 6 it looks like he's trying to get up.
- 7 Can you describe for us what you saw 8 happen?
 - A. I mean, that's really what I saw happen.
- 10 Q. Okay. You said that you heard gunshots.
- 11 Can you describe to us what you were
- 12 seeing at the time you heard what sounded like
- 13 gunshots?
- 14 A. It was basically all at the same time of what
- 15 I just explained.
- 16 Q. Okay.
- 17 A. And I heard, like, maybe five gunshots maybe,
- 18 I don't remember exactly, but there were several,
- 19 a handful.
- But it all happened kind of at the same time.
- Q. Did you notice what happened to the man after
- 23 you heard those gunshots?
- Like, did his body move or anything like
- 25 | that?

- 1 A. Well, he -- after he tried to get up, he
- 2 ended up back in the same position that he was,
- 3 like, prone.
- 4 Q. Okay. Could you see what the police officers
- 5 did after you heard those shots?
- 6 A. I don't remember them doing anything --
- 7 Q. Okay.
- 8 A. In particular.
- 9 Q. -- at some point did you decide to document
- 10 what you were seeing?
- 11 A. I did.
- 12 Q. How did you do that?
- 13 A. On my phone.
- 14 Q. Okay. Did you take photographs or video?
- 15 Both of those things?
- 16 A. A video.
- 17 Q. Okay. And were you able to provide a copy of
- 18 that video to investigators in the course of this
- 19 investigation?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 Q. Okay. What part of your observations were
- 22 you able to film?
- 23 A. It was after what I just described.
- 24 Q. Okay. After you heard the shots?
- 25 A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. Did you notice whether any of the police officers attempted to help the man on the

- 25 But, like, he -- he was, like -- and he

was, like, obviously, like, impossible to talk
to, because I don't -- I don't have his
medication and stuff.

And I've never done anything to make it seem like I want his medication or anything. I don't even know what he was on.

But, like, he -- and he -- but he refused to believe I -- I didn't take it, so...

- Q. Before this day --
- 10 A. Yeah.

- Q. -- what was your relationship with Brendan like?
 - A. I think -- I was -- I would -- like, order a slice of pizza; other than that I didn't -- for everyone, James and him, like, I'd get a pizza, like, just have a slice.

But, like, at the most, I didn't talk to him, but I think he was threatening me.

I think he might have wanted to hurt me and may have used the drugs as excuse because he had been, like, Oh, hey, what's up, buddy, buddy, and stuff like that, and, like, I -- in my experience, being Asian, when, like, white people who are hoodish or lower-class white people, they just call me buddy or things out of nowhere and

- try to infantilize me, they usually end up trying to hurt me later, to pick a fight.
- 3 Q. Okay.
- 4 A. Or try to control me or something.
- Q. Did you hear any noises besides yelling from the rotary while Brendan and the police were over
- 7 there?

- A. I heard when the gunshots came.
- 9 Q. Do you have a memory of how many you heard?
- 10 A. A few.
- I don't remember exactly how many.
- Q. And do you -- could you see what happened after you heard the shots?
- 14 A. I saw him on the ground. I think I might
- 15 have saw him get hit by them and fall down, yeah.
- Q. Okay. Can you describe any of the movements
- of the officers or Brendan before the shots?
- 18 A. Yeah. He -- Brendan was running. He's not very fast.
- 20 He ran down the rotary and, like, they 21 circled him, and that's it.
- 22 They were just -- he was just trying to 23 get out the circle with the knife, and then he 24 got shot much.
- They were sort of circling for, like, I

- 1 think it was, like, 15 minutes or something it
- 2 seemed like -- I didn't have a watch or
- 3 anything -- but, like, they were just circling
- 4 him, and, like, telling him, Put down the knife,
- 5 then they shot him.
- 6 Q. Do you have a -- as that's happening, do you
- 7 know whether Brendan was standing? Sitting?
- 8 Laying down?
- 9 A. Ah...
- 10 Q. Do you remember?
- 11 A. He threw the knife. I think he -- I don't
- 12 know. Because I -- I remember throwing the
- 13 knife, I remember him falling down, and I
- 14 remember him getting shot. I don't remember the
- 15 order.
- 16 He might have fallen down and threw the
- 17 knife, or he might have tripped and threw the
- 18 knife, like, or he might have thrown the knife,
- 19 got shot, and then fell down.
- I think that's what happened, but I'm not
- 21 sure.
- 22 Q. Understanding that your -- your eyesight at
- 23 distance is not great --
- 24 A. Yeah.
- 25 Q. -- a couple times you've said that you

1 thought Brendan threw the knife.

- 22 THE COURT: All right. Before I -- do
 23 you have any questions, Mr. McDonald?
- MR. MCDONALD: No, your Honor.
- THE COURT: Mr. Heineman?

1	MR. HEINEMAN: No.
2	THE COURT: Mr. Chang, let me just ask
3	you this.
4	You said that you're pretty sure that
5	Mr. Reilly threw the knife.
6	THE WITNESS: Yeah.
7	THE COURT: Do you recall what order
8	things, like when did things happen when you
9	say that he threw the knife?
10	THE WITNESS: He was down in the rotary
11	getting circled by the cops when he they were
12	telling
13	THE COURT: So once he was down, was he
14	standing, seated, or lying down?
15	THE WITNESS: I don't remember if he
16	was if he had tripped or not. I think he was
17	trying to run.
18	I think he tried to throw the knife and
19	then run off.
20	THE COURT: So when you say "he tried to
21	throw the knife," did you actually see the knife
22	leave his hand?
23	THE WITNESS: Yeah. I saw the knife
24	leave his hand and fall on the ground
25	THE COURT: Okay.

1	THE WITNESS: before he got shot. I
2	think that's what happened.
3	THE COURT: All right. Do you know where
4	the knife ended up?
5	THE WITNESS: On the ground.
6	I know that the he threw the knife
7	before the cops shot him.
8	THE COURT: Before the cops shot him?
9	THE WITNESS: Yeah.
10	THE COURT: All right. And when he threw
11	the knife, did it go far?
12	Did it go a distance, or was it just
13	right next to next to
14	THE WITNESS: Right next to him
15	(inaudible) so
16	THE COURT: Right next to him.
17	Did he drop the knife or did he throw the
18	knife?
19	THE WITNESS: He threw it, he threw it
20	for sure, but, like, it didn't go very far.
21	THE COURT: Who did it throw it at? Or
22	did he throw it at nobody?
23	THE WITNESS: The cop to the right of
24	him.
25	THE COURT: So he did throw it you say

1	he threw the knife at a police officer?
2	THE WITNESS: Yes, yeah.
3	THE COURT: All right.
4	THE WITNESS: Because he admitted it.
5	Because I said the day before, he had
6	been talking about wanting to stab a police
7	officer with a knife. I think he really wanted
8	to.
9	THE COURT: Okay.
10	THE WITNESS: So
11	THE COURT: All right. Anything on any
12	of that?
13	MR. VAN EPPS: No, I don't have anything
14	further.
15	MR. HEINEMAN: Nothing, your Honor.
16	MR. MCDONALD: No, your Honor.
17	THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Chang, thank you
18	very much.
19	(Witness excused.)
20	MR. VAN EPPS: Your Honor, I'm just going
21	to (inaudible) our next witness.
22	Your Honor, the Commonwealth calls James
23	Hanify.
24	THE COURT OFFICER: Stand right here.
25	Raise your right hand.

1 THE CLERK: Do you solemnly swear or 2 affirm the testimony you will provide the Court 3 today will be the truth so help you God? THE WITNESS: Yes. 4 JAMES HANIFY, SWORN 5 6 THE COURT: Mr. Hanify, before we begin, 7 my name is Judge Brennan. I'm presiding over the 8 inquest here. 9 I can't order you not to tell people what 10 you're testifying to; but at some point I'm going 11 to be issuing a report as to what happened and 12 findings that I'm making, which is going to be 13 based upon the testimony of the witnesses, so 14 what I'd ask you to do is just hold off on 15 talking to anybody until you know that that 16 report's been issued. All right? 17 THE WITNESS: Okay. 18 EXAMINATION 19 BY MS. GEMMILL: 20 Q. Good morning, Mr. Hanify. 21 Good morning. Α. 22 Q. Can you spell us your first and last name? 23

- 1 Q. How old are you, Mr. Hanify?
- 2 A. Forty-five.
- 3 \ Q. Can you tell us what your date of birth is?
- 4 A. 5/13/77.
- 5 Q. What town do you live in right now?
- 6 A. Woburn.
- 7 Q. How long have you been in the Woburn area?
- 8 A. Since six months.
- 9 Q. Six months.
- 10 Where were you living before you moved to
- 11 Woburn?
- 12 A. I was in an extended stay in -- let's see --
- 13 | Waverley -- or in Watertown -- Watertown. And,
- 14 then, before that, Lexington.
- 15 Q. Okay. Were you living at a house in
- 16 Lexington?
- 17 A. No, I was living at a hotel in Lexington, and
- 18 then previous to that, I was at a house.
- 19 Q. All right.
- 20 A. So it's been hotel, hotel, and now Woburn
- 21 | since I was living in Lexington, and that was
- 22 with Brendan.
- 23 | Q. Gotcha.
- 24 Sir, do you remember having a conversation
- 25 with myself and Attorney Van Epps, Graham Van

- 1 Epps, the other day?
- 2 A. Yes. Thank you, yes.
- 3 Q. Yes. And during that conversation, did you
- 4 tell us a little bit about why you were living at
- 5 the house in Lexington with Brendan?
- 6 A. I -- I only said that I had nowhere to live
- 7 and I enrolled myself into Eliot Community
- 8 Services.
- 9 Q. Can you share with us a little bit about why
- 10 you work with Eliot?
- 11 A. Let's see -- well, I -- I had nowhere to
- 12 live.
- I was a homeless guy kind of for a while,
- 14 and that works good, and I lived nice, and then,
- 15 eventually, I got enrolled with Eliot Community
- 16 | Services, and that's easier -- I'm trying to
- 17 remember where they posted me.
- 18 I'm having trouble with that, remembering
- 19 that.
- 20 Q. Let me ask you another question, if I can.
- 21 Did we talk a little bit about your mental
- 22 | health during that conversation?
- 23 A. No.
- 24 Q. Okay. Sir, do you take any medications
- 25 regularly?

- 1 A. Yes.
- Q. And the medications that you take, does that
- 3 | make it hard for you to understand anything that
- 4 we're doing here today?
- 5 A. No.
- 6 Q. Okay. And you heard the court officer and
- 7 the clerk swear you in earlier, right?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. Okay. And you understand what it means to be
- 10 telling the truth at this proceeding today,
- 11 right?
- 12 | A. Yes.
- 13 Q. Okay. Great.
- So I want to talk to you a little bit
- 15 about your time when you were living with Brendan
- 16 | at the house in Lexington.
- Was that at 98 Hancock Street?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. How long did you live at that house for?
- 20 A. Two years.
- 21 Q. Two years.
- 22 Did Brendan live there with you?
- 23 A. Yes.
- 24 Q. How long did he live there with you?
- 25 A. Same period of time.

- 1 Q. Okay. Was there ever a time that you were
- 2 | living at the house that Brendan wasn't living at
- 3 the house prior to him passing away?
- 4 A. No.
- 5 Q. Okay. And we're talking about Brendan
- 6 Reilly; is that right?
- 7 A. Yes, miss.
- 8 Q. Did anybody else live at that house with you,
- 9 besides you and Brendan?
- 10 A. Yeah.
- 11 There was a couple roommates there,
- 12 dorm-mates; Jenna, a woman, nice, beautiful
- 13 woman, and then she left.
- 14 Then there was Johnny Chang -- or Johnny,
- 15 they call him.
- 16 Q. Johnny Chang?
- 17 A. Johnny, yeah.
- 18 I think you just met him.
- 19 Q. Do you remember how long Johnny lived at the
- 20 house with you?
- 21 A. It must have been four months. Maybe eight
- 22 months.
- 23 Q. Okay. Was he living at the house with you
- 24 and Brendan in February of 2022?
- 25 A. February?

- Well, which month is that, according to his death?
- Q. So -- so the same month that Brendan passed away, was Johnny living there with you?
 - A. Obviously, yes. Yes, he was.
- Q. Was anybody else living at the house with you and Johnny and Brendan during the month that
- 8 Brendan passed away?
- 9 A. No.

- 10 Q. Okay. Can you tell us a little bit about
- 11 what your relationship was like with Brendan,
- 12 like, how did the two of you get along?
- 13 A. Sure. We were pals.
 - We were -- we're kind of near the same age group, and we both like -- we both like hip-hop, rap music, gangster talk, I like to understand and listen to.
 - And he offered a lot of kind of gangster enthusiasm, and had hip-hop pouring out of his room a lot, and we were just kind of -- kind of providing nice to one another.
- We were just kind of friends, you know.
- Q. Would it be fair to say that you guys got
- 24 along pretty well?
- 25 A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. Do you remember how Brendan was, how he seemed, the day before he passed away?
 - Did anything unusual happen?
- A. Well, he seemed riled up. Like I said, I don't think he slept that night.
- 6 Q. Okay.

- 7 A. So he -- he was wound. He was -- he was wound up.
 - Q. What makes you think that Brendan didn't sleep the night before he passed away?
- A. Because I went to bed very late; and he was still active, very active.
 - I saw him -- his door open, shut, out of the side of my vision here when I went to the bathroom, and it was very late, and then he played music all night.
- And I woke up earlyish and then I saw him again.
 - Q. Did that seem normal for how Brendan usually was at nighttime?
- A. No, no, it seemed pretty bad to me that he had been awake because it seemed like he had been complaining about his medicine the day earlier.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. To answer your question, I think he was angry

- 1 about medicine, so -- so he stayed awake, and
- 2 | who knows what that could have done to him
- 3 psychologically, I guess.
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. Delerism or fatigue, maybe. I don't know.
- 6 Maybe upset.
- 7 Q. Did Brendan ever talk to you about what kind
- 8 of medicine he needed, what he was using?
- 9 A. Not really.
- 10 Q. Okay. How do you know that he --
- 11 A. It looked like cocaine to me.
- 12 Q. Okay. How did you know that he was missing
- 13 medication?
- Can you remember things that he was
- 15 | saying, if anything?
- 16 A. Yeah.
- 17 I'm not sure what his discussion was with
- 18 the nurse but -- oh, about his missing
- 19 | medication.
- 20 O. Um-hum.
- 21 A. Well, he had somehow acquired some pills,
- 22 maybe -- maybe enough to feed a small platoon, I
- 23 don't know, and he had been yelling at Johnny,
- 24 Where's my pills? Where's my pills? So then I
- 25 knew he had lost his pills.

- 1 Q. All right. When was he yelling about the
- 2 pills to Johnny?
- 3 | Was that the day that he died?
- 4 A. The morning.
- 5 Q. That morning?
- 6 A. Yeah.
- 7 Q. Okay. I'm going to ask you a couple
- 8 questions about how the house was set up.
- 9 It's a two-story house, right?
- 10 A. Yeah.
- 11 Q. Where were your bedrooms located?
- 12 A. They're on the second floor. Go up the
- 13 stairs, take a left, and there's a corridor.
- 14 And on this corridor there's two bedrooms
- 15 on the left, and there's one straight ahead.
- 16 \ Q. Okay. Where was your room?
- 17 A. My room's the second door on the corridor as
- 18 the two doors are on the left.
- 19 Q. How about Mr. Chang's room -- Johnny's room?
- 20 A. John's the first room.
- 21 Q. And where was Brendan's room?
- 22 A. Brendan's down the corridor at the end.
- 23 Q. Do you have -- did you have a window in your
- 24 room?
- 25 A. Yes, miss, yes. There's three.

- 1 Q. Three windows?
- 2 A. Yeah.
- 3 Q. Do you know if Johnny had windows in his
- 4 room?
- 5 A. Yes, he does, yes.
- Q. Do you know where those windows looked out
- 7 onto?
- Like, if you were in Johnny's room, what
- 9 could you see?
- 10 A. I guess the front yard, the driveway, the
- 11 sidewalk, the -- the street.
- 12 Q. Okay. Do you know if Brendan's room had any
- 13 windows?
- 14 A. Yes.
- 15 Q. What would his windows have faced out onto?
- 16 A. The side of the yard, the house next to us;
- 17 and I guess the door he owned had a window in it,
- 18 and it looked out back.
- 19 Q. Okay. Did the house have a backyard?
- 20 A. Yes, ma'am.
- 21 Q. Did you have any place that you usually kept,
- 22 like, your trash barrels outside the house?
- 23 A. Yeah. We keep them on the side of the steps
- 24 as you go out the back.
- 25 | Q. Okay.

- 1 A. So they're in the driveway area.
- Q. Okay. So if you were going out the back door
- 3 of the house, what side would you see the barrels
- 4 on?
- 5 A. Well, they're immediately on the right.
- 6 Q. Okay. Okay. So the -- so the morning of the
- 7 12th, the morning that Brendan passed away, tell
- 8 me -- tell me what you first remember noticing
- 9 about Brendan that morning.
- 10 A. I guess -- I guess I was right, he seemed
- 11 dysfunct, psychologically, he seemed a little
- 12 messy, he had welts on his eyes, messed up hair,
- 13 kind of un -- un -- untidy.
- 14 He was untidy from -- from living a day
- 15 awake, you know, and besides that, I guess that's
- 16 all I can say, kind of.
- 17 Q. Did he seem to look different to you from how
- 18 he normally looked?
- 19 A. Yeah. He was disheveled.
- 20 Q. Okay. Where were you and he when you saw him
- 21 | first that morning?
- 22 A. I went downstairs and he was upstairs, and I
- 23 heard him banging on Johnny's door.
- 24 And I was in the kitchen. I actually went
- outside, went out front, and that's -- that's

- when I saw him more formally that day by the trash barrels, yes.
- Q. Okay. So you heard him first that day before you actually saw him more clearly?
 - A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. So tell us about what you heard when you were in the kitchen.
- You could hear Brendan banging on Johnny's door.
- 10 Tell us about that.
- A. I think I heard Johnny scream out the window,
 Help, help, there's a madman trying to kill me.
 - I think he yelled that -- Johnny yelled that.
 - And he yelled, You get out here, open this door, open this door, what's the code. He wanted to know the code to the door.
 - It was very kind of traumatic to think that someone would ask for the code, banging on the door, you know what I mean?
- 21 Q. Let me ask you a question about the code.
- 22 Did the doors to each of your rooms have,
- 23 like, a keypad with a code you could put in?
- 24 A. Yes, miss, yes.
- 25 Q. Okay. And was that so that you could, you

- 1 know, keep your own room locked?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. Okay. Was it normal for you guys to share
- 4 the codes with each other?
- 5 A. No.
- 6 Q. All right. So, as far as you know, did
- 7 Brendan have the code to Johnny's room?
- 8 A. No, I don't know.
- 9 Q. All right.
- 10 A. I don't think so --
- 11 Q. Okay.
- 12 A. -- because he couldn't get in, and he really
- 13 | wanted to.
- 14 Q. What makes you say he really wanted to get
- 15 into the room?
- 16 A. He kept banging on the door screaming to
- Johnny, Where's my pills, where's my pills. You
- 18 get out here.
- 19 Give me the code to the door, bang bang,
- 20 bang, bang.
- Johnny, open the door, bang, bang, bang,
- 22 bang.
- 23 Johnny, come here, open the door, open the
- 24 door.
- What's the code, Johnny, to the door.

- 1 Tell me now, Johnny, tell me now. Don't make me
- 2 do anything irrational, Johnny. Bang, bang,
- 3 bang, bang.
- 4 Q. Did you see --
- 5 A. So he kind of lost it, Brendan lost it at
- 6 Johnny's door.
- 7 | Q. Did you see Brendan in front of Johnny's door
- 8 or could you just hear what was going on?
- 9 A. I could just hear what's going on.
- 10 Q. All right. Do you remember hearing Brendan
- 11 saying anything else or threatening Johnny in any
- 12 | way at that point?
- 13 A. No, that's all I can remember.
- 14 Q. Do you remember hearing Brendan saying
- 15 | anything about having a knife?
- 16 A. No, I don't remember anything.
- 17 Q. Okay. In the time that you lived with
- 18 Brendan, did you ever see him with a knife or a
- 19 weapon of any kind?
- 20 A. Yes, yes. I saw him with a knife, and a
- 21 screwdriver a lot.
- 22 Q. Can you --
- 23 A. He had a screwdriver in his hand, like that,
- 24 waving it around.
- 25 Q. When was that?

- 1 A. A couple weeks earlier.
- 2 Q. Okay.
- 3 A. And a couple weeks earlier than that.
- 4 Q. Do you remember if he was saying anything
- 5 when he was waving the screwdriver around?
- 6 A. No. He just wanted something maybe from me,
- 7 | wanted money or -- I don't know.
- 8 Q. Okay.
- 9 A. He was bothering me.
- 10 Q. When else did you see him with a knife; do
- 11 you remember?
- 12 A. No.
- 13 Q. Okay.
- 14 A. No, I can't.
- 15 Q. Do you remember if Brendan ever tried to talk
- 16 about having the knife?
- 17 A. He talked about guns.
- 18 Q. He talked about guns?
- 19 A. I guess he likes guns, but -- no, not really.
- 20 Q. Okay. So you're in the kitchen; you're
- 21 hearing Brendan at the door for Johnny's room.
- Tell us what you see happened next.
- 23 A. Johnny's screaming out the front window, Hey,
- 24 come help me. There was some guy that was
- 25 | walking by.

- 1 Q. Did you see a guy walking by?
- 2 A. Yeah.
- 3 \ Q. Okay. And where were you when you saw the
- 4 man who was walking by?
- 5 A. On the front porch.
- 6 \ Q. Okay. Do you remember why you went outside?
- 7 A. Smoke a cigarette.
- 8 Q. All right. So you see a man walking by; you
- 9 hear Johnny in the window.
- 10 Can you see Johnny in the window from
- 11 where you were?
- 12 A. No.
- 13 Q. All right. What do you see happen next?
- 14 A. Well, I think I -- I think this guy went
- 15 rushing off and was using a phone to call the
- 16 police, and I was somewhat gratified by that.
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 A. So --
- 19 Q. You saw the man who -- who had been outside
- 20 calling -- calling police, you think?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. Okay. Could you see Brendan?
- 23 A. No.
- 24 Q. Okay. At some point while you were outside
- 25 to smoke your cigarette, did you see Brendan

- 1 again?
- 2 A. Yes.
- Q. Can you describe what you saw him do?
- 4 A. Yeah. I saw him hang a knife around like
- 5 this, in his hand, and sort of whittle on these
- 6 trash barrels, these plastic trash barrels.
- 7 He was leaning up against them.
- Q. Okay. Were those the trash barrels that you
- 9 were talking to us about being behind your house?
- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 Q. All right. Did you see how Brendan got
- 12 outside?
- Like, did you see him come outside?
- 14 A. No.
- 15 Q. Okay. Can you describe to us what he was
- 16 doing by the trash barrels?
- 17 A. No. That's -- that was a question I had,
- 18 what -- what is he doing there, kind of with his
- 19 feet in the dirt, kind of muddy, dirt there,
- 20 bending the trash barrels in half.
- 21 I'm not sure.
- 22 Q. Did it seem like he was -- he was sitting on
- 23 those barrels?
- 24 Like --
- 25 A. Yes.

- 1 Q. -- what was he doing with the barrels?
- 2 A. Yeah. He was kind of leaning on them,
- 3 sitting on them, kind of.
- 4 | Q. Okay. Did he have anything in his hands?
- 5 A. Yeah.
- 6 Q. You might have told us this.
- 7 A. Yeah. He had a knife.
- 8 Q. What did you see?
- 9 A. A Smith & Wesson knife. This long pointed
- 10 knife, silver.
- 11 Q. Okay. It looked like a Smith & Wesson knife
- 12 to you?
- 13 A. Yeah. Silver there.
- 14 Q. All right. Do you remember what hand he was
- 15 holding that with?
- 16 A. Jeez, good question. His left hand.
- 17 O. It was his left hand?
- 18 A. Yeah.
- 19 Q. Okay. Could you hear Brendan saying anything
- 20 at that point, like, when you first see him by
- 21 the trash barrels with the knife?
- 22 A. Get out of here, something (indiscernible),
- 23 and he said it to the police.
- 24 Q. So at what point -- you saw the guy outside
- 25 who called police.

- 1 Did the police actually come?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 | Q. All right. Did you see how many police came
- 4 to the house at first?
- 5 A. Yes, two.
- 6 Q. Two? Where did you see them go?
- 7 A. To the driveway.
- 8 Q. Okay. Did they interact with Brendan at all?
- 9 A. Yes.
- 10 Q. Can you describe for us what you saw those
- 11 police officers do first while you're still by
- 12 the house.
- 13 A. Sure. I saw him took out his gun. One had
- 14 his gun out. Then the next guy was trying to get
- 15 his gun out, trying to get his gun out, and got
- 16 his gun out, pointed it at him, two cops asked
- 17 him -- because one was out of (indiscernible)
- 18 that had the gun out, pointed at him.
- 19 Q. Can you tell us what that gun looked like,
- 20 like how big it was?
- 21 A. It was like a 45.
- 22 Q. Okay. Did it look like a handgun --
- 23 A. Yeah.
- 24 | Q. -- or, like, a longer gun?
- 25 A. It was like a handgun.

- 1 Q. Okay. Did the police officer say anything to
- 2 Brendan?
- 3 A. Yeah, Put it down, put it down, put the knife
- 4 down.
- 5 Q. Could you hear if Brendan said anything back
- 6 to those officers?
- 7 A. No.
- 8 Q. So you have two police officers who come,
- 9 they're in the driveway area, and Brendan's by
- 10 the trash cans, right?
- 11 A. Um-hum.
- 12 Q. Okay. What happens next?
- 13 Like, does Brendan stay in that spot or --
- 14 A. No.
- 15 Q. -- does something else happen?
- 16 A. He fled. He -- he took -- he went on foot
- and jumped, passed them, down the driveway, in
- 18 his sneakers, running, holding his knife.
- 19 Q. Okay. Was he running -- could you tell where
- 20 he was running to?
- 21 A. No. He just was going to leave the property.
- 22 Q. Okay.
- 23 A. And -- and run -- kind of crosscut the
- 24 rotary.
- 25 Q. Right.

- 1 A. It looked like.
- Q. So, like, he was running across the rotary
- 3 that's in front of your house?
- 4 A. Yes.
- 5 Q. Could you hear him saying anything while he
- 6 was running?
- 7 A. Well, he started in on his preaching about
- 8 the mob.
- 9 Q. Tell us about that. What did you hear him
- 10 say?
- 11 A. He said, I'm the mob. I'm the mob. I'm a
- 12 gangster, I'm the mob. So he -- he said -- he
- was saying for real that he was the mob.
- 14 Q. Okay. He was saying that while he was
- 15 running?
- 16 A. Yes, ma'am.
- 17 Q. Okay. How -- did you see where Brendan went?
- 18 Like, how far did he get?
- 19 A. He may have gone 400 feet maybe. It looked
- 20 like he slammed the ground, on the concrete,
- 21 because his shoes was untied and stuff.
- 22 Q. Okay did --
- 23 A. The cops was arriving there, you could see
- 24 them with their guns that moved into some sort of
- 25 position on him.

- And then he got up, and he tried tripping across the concrete more.
- The cops came near him, he swung his knife around, he swung it at them near the chest.
- And then he hit the ground again, he hit the concrete.
- Q. You were just making a motion with your hand,
 your right hand --
- 9 A. Yeah, yeah.
- 10 Q. -- where you were kind of like waving your
- 11 hand back and forth.
- 12 A. I think it was in his right hand, I think.
- 13 Q. Okay. So is that the motion that you were
- 14 seeing Brendan making with the knife, with his
- 15 right hand?
- 16 A. Yeah. Big swings, like this. Big swings.
- 17 Q. Okay. So the first time you saw him, I think
- 18 you said, hit the concrete, did Brendan fall --
- 19 A. Yes.
- 20 Q. -- while he was running?
- 21 A. He slipped and fell.
- 22 Q. Okay. And it looked to you like it was a
- 23 slip?
- 24 A. Yeah.
- 25 Q. Could you hear the police officers saying

- 1 anything to him while he was running that -- that
- 2 first time?
- 3 A. No. I think, Put the knife down was the
- 4 phrase they used to --
- 5 Q. Did you hear any other noises at that point
- 6 that -- that didn't sound like words or voices?
- 7 A. No, just the gunshots.
- 8 Q. Okay. How many times did you hear gunshots
- 9 that day?
- 10 A. I figure eight.
- 11 Q. All right.
- 12 A. Nine, maybe ten.
- 13 Q. Did you hear more than one kind of sound, or
- 14 did all the shots sound, like, the same to you?
- 15 A. Oh, they sounded the same, the gun.
- 16 Q. All right.
- 17 A. Yeah.
- 18 Q. Do you remember what Brendan was doing the
- 19 | first time you heard the shots?
- 20 A. He was on the ground. It looked like they
- 21 busted him in the chest with the gun --
- 22 | Q. Okay.
- 23 A. -- a number of times. And he -- he wouldn't
- 24 surrender.
- 25 Q. Okay.

- 1 A. He still had a knife and he was on the
- 2 ground.
- 3 Q. Okay.
- 4 A. And. Finally, it was really dramatic, it
- 5 was, the guns keep -- keep firing, pop, pop, pop,
- 6 pop, pop.
- 7 And then he -- he looked like he was going
- 8 to die, and he threw the knife and fell down on
- 9 the ground like that and surrender --
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. -- in some sort of surrender.
- 12 Q. You were just describing to us the first set
- 13 of pops.
- 14 You kind of were holding your hands, like
- in a -- in a, like, a rifle shape?
- 16 A. Yeah.
- 17 Q. Is that the kind of gun you were seeing at
- 18 | first?
- 19 A. Yeah.
- 20 It looked like a shotgun, and it had
- 21 orange on it.
- 22 | Q. How many of those guns did you see?
- 23 A. I see maybe -- maybe eight.
- 24 Q. Eight of those guns?
- 25 A. Yeah.

- Q. Okay. Did it look like all the police 1 2 officers had a gun like that or just some of them?
- 4 I quess just some.

The guys in front, they walked out in front, like, five of them, six of them maybe.

Q. Okay. So Brendan fell.

You said that he was on the ground at some point when they're -- when you're hearing the pops and that he's not surrendering.

11 Can you describe to us what he was doing 12 during that time?

- That's when he said, I'm the mob. He had just yelled that he was. And that was all he said.
- 16 I mean --
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 -- it looked like he was stone cold out of
- 19 it, definitely.
- 20 Q. Okay.
- 21 A. I mean --
- 22 He still looked to you at that point
- different from how he usually was when you were 23
- 24 with him?
- 25 A. After all that gunshot and final falling on

- the concrete, I don't think he had much constitution left.
- Q. Okay. You said that he was down on the ground.
- 5 Did you ever see him stand back up?
- 6 A. No, ma'am.

- Q. Did you ever see him trying to -- was he trying to move around at all, or was he just staying on the ground?
- A. I can't tell. I can't remember if he was -- if he maybe at first was writhing a little.
 - Q. I think one of the things you told us was that you saw him running or charging.

Can you describe what you saw?

- A. I remember him kicking through the dirt with the knife in his hand with his sneakers onto the street and that was basically -- basically the whole night.
- I mean, I didn't really -- it was -- it didn't take long for the -- the sequence of those events.
- And -- I mean, once the police had gotten
 there, it was just, I don't know, 30 seconds -Q. Okay.

- 1 A. -- of mayhem. Like I said, it was like he
- 2 was at war.
- 3 Q. It was like he was at war?
- 4 A. It was like he -- yes.
- 5 Q. What did --
- 6 A. There's no distinction about the environment,
- 7 or the enemy, or his confluence with everyone --
- 8 I don't know -- but he was just at large, you
- 9 | could say, raging.
- 10 | Q. Okay.
- 11 A. Yeah.
- 12 Q. What was Brendan doing before that last time
- when he -- when he finally fell back and stopped
- 14 moving?
- 15 Do you remember what happened right before
- 16 that?
- 17 A. I don't.
- 18 Oh, right before that.
- 19 Q. Yeah, right before that.
- 20 A. Yeah. Well, the last thing he yelled was,
- 21 I'm the mob.
- 22 Q. Okay.
- 23 A. And then pop, pop, they shot him.
- 24 | Q. Okay.
- 25 A. With the nonviolent lethal weapon.

- Q. All right. I think I heard you say that he threw the knife at some point.
- Can you describe to us what you were seeing?
- A. I saw him surrender the knife and his conduct, because he fell down onto the ground;
 but right previous to that, when he was sitting up on his butt and wavering, he whipped the knife
- 10 Q. Okay. He whipped it out of his hands?
- 11 A. Yeah.

out of his hands.

- 12 Q. Did it look like he was dropping the knife or throwing the knife?
- 14 How would you describe that?
- 15 A. He was throwing it, yeah. He threw it away.
 - Q. Okay. Where did he throw it to?
- 17 A. It looked like the rotary.
- 18 | Q. Okay.
- A. It looked like it could have landed on even -- even five feet off the rotary.
- 21 Q. Okay.
- 22 A. Just it's a turnaround to (indiscernible),
- 23 type of grass outlet.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. It sounds very big. They call it a rotary,

- and a rotary's a highway, you know, but that's
- 2 | not quite a -- this is a little field of grass
- 3 they got there in Lexington.
- 4 Q. Yeah. Like a little patch of grass
- 5 surrounded by a circular road --
- 6 A. Yes.
- 7 Q. -- with lots of other little roads?
- 8 A. Yes, miss, yes.
- 9 Q. Okay. The direction that he threw the knife,
- 10 was that towards other people or just away?
- 11 A. Away.
- 12 Q. Okay.
- 13 A. I'm trying -- I'm trying to help and I -- and
- 14 I wonder if you want to know if he had died at
- 15 that time.
- I'm not sure. I don't know.
- 17 Q. Okay. Can you tell us what Brendan was doing
- 18 in the moments right before he was shot that last
- 19 time?
- 20 A. He was aggravated. He was agitated. He was
- 21 threatening, and he looked like a -- he looked
- 22 | like a crazed Indian, like that, swinging his arm
- 23 back and forth at the police, trying to mobilize
- 24 himself across those two streets --
- 25 Q. Okay.

- 1 A. -- for some reason.
- 2 Q. All right. And so that's what was happening
- 3 right before the last set of shots?
- 4 A. Yes.
- 5 Q. Okay. Mr. Hanify, we talked a little bit
- 6 earlier today about you take some medications.
- 7 A. Mmm.
- Q. Would you be able to tell Judge Brennan what
- 9 vour medications are?
- 10 A. Sure.
- 11 Wellbutrin, met formula (phonetic), and
- 12 I'm taking a cholesterol pill. The doctor said I
- 13 had high cholesterol, and I take a half a
- 14 Klonopin at night.
- 15 Q. Okay.
- 16 A. And aprosium (phonetic) -- aprosium at night,
- and (indiscernible) pill. It's called zegrimium
- 18 (phonetic).
- 19 Q. What are those pills supposed to help with,
- 20 like, what are those for?
- 21 A. ADD, schizoaffective bipolar.
- 22 Q. Schizoaffective bipolar?
- 23 A. Um-hum.
- Q. Do you -- is there anything about your -- can
- you tell us what some of the symptoms are of your

- 1 schizoaffective disorder?
- 2 A. Sure. Disorganized, tired, unmotivated.
- 3 That's basically it.
- 4 Q. Does it --
- 5 A. Chronic fatigue.
- 6 Q. Does it affect your memory at all?
- 7 A. No.
- 8 Q. Okay. Does it affect any point your ability
- 9 to sort of understand what's happening in front
- 10 of you?
- 11 A. No.
- 12 Q. Okay. Are you clearheaded today while you're
- 13 talking to us?
- 14 A. Yes, ma'am.
- 15 Q. Okay. Thank you.
- MS. GEMMILL: Thank you, Mr. Hanify.
- 17 I don't --
- 18 THE WITNESS: Sure.
- MS. GEMMILL: -- any more questions for
- 20 you. Some other folks might.
- 21 THE COURT: Mr. McDonald?
- 22 Oh, hold on one second, sir.
- Give me a couple minutes.
- 24 Do you have any questions?
- MR. MCDONALD: Just a couple, if I may.

1	THE COURT: All right.
2	EXAMINATION
3	BY MR. MCDONALD:
4	Q. Mr. Hanify, have you discussed your testimony
5	here today with Johnny Chang at all or
6	A. No.
7	Q in exchange (indiscernible) of what
8	happened?
9	A. No. (Indiscernible) said not to talk about
10	it.
11	Q. Okay. Did you have an interview by the State
12	Police prior to shortly after the incident?
13	A. Yes.
14	Q. And let me read a sentence to you and see if
15	that refreshes your memory.
16	It says, Hanify advised that there was a
17	standoff in the street between officers and
18	Reilly.
19	Hanify could not observe anything further
20	due to the distance between him and the apparent
21	standoff.
22	Does that refresh your recollection about
23	what you actually saw at the time of the
24	shooting?

25 A. I did at last.

1 I was -- I was -- I was never allowed to go to the shop, and it didn't seem like my 2 business. An ambulance had arrived there. 3 And I'm talking before the shooting, you said 4 5 the officer reported that you told him it was a 6 standoff, which means the police weren't leaving and Brendan wasn't leaving, correct? 7 A. Yes, sir, yes. 8 And then you said that you didn't observe 9 10 anything after that, you went in the house and heard shots? 11 12 No, no. I was in the yard. I heard the 13 shots. I saw him fall. 14 I believe -- I believe there was someone on a stretcher. And I left. 15 16 Okay. But immediately before the shooting, 17 the last thing you saw was a standoff, or did you 18 see something else? 19 No, you're right. I did see that. It was 20 him with -- right. 21 MR. MCDONALD: That's all I have. 22 Thank you. THE COURT: Mr. Heineman? 23 24 EXAMINATION

25

BY MR. HEINEMAN:

- 1 Q. Good morning, Mr. Hanify.
- 2 A. Morning.
- 3 Q. I just want to try to get some -- some things
- 4 in order in time, if I could --
 - A. Um-hum.

- 6 Q. -- because I was a little confused.
- First of all, you used a phrase when you
- 8 were talking about the shotgun -- I think you
- 9 called it a nonviolent lethal weapon.
- 10 Where'd you learn that phrase from?
- 11 A. I don't know.
- 12 Q. Okay.
- 13 A. I just know that it's -- it had a fluorescent
- 14 | orange on it, so maybe -- maybe my friend's -- my
- 15 (indiscernible) BB gun. I don't know.
- 16 Q. Okay. But you saw some of those -- some of
- 17 the police officers with those shotguns with the
- 18 orange, right?
- 19 A. Yes.
- 20 Q. And can you estimate for us how many times
- 21 you heard those guns fired that day?
- 22 A. Yeah, fifteen.
- 23 Q. And earlier when you told us that Brendan was
- 24 on the ground at times while he was being shot,
- 25 was Brendan actually on the ground being shot by

- 1 those shotguns?
- 2 A. Yes.
- Q. How many times did you see Brendan be shot by
- 4 those orange shotguns while he was on the ground?
- 5 A. I must have heard it go off six. I couldn't
- 6 really tell that he was getting hit.
- 7 O. Um-hum.
- 8 A. It didn't cause blood.
- 9 I don't know if it was a sandbag or what
- 10 it is, but he -- maybe -- that was the big part
- 11 of the gun, six.
- 12 Q. And then at the end, right at the very end,
- 13 before the ambulances came, did you hear a
- 14 | different sounding gunshot?
- 15 A. No.
- 16 Q. Okay. Again, just for order of things, you
- 17 mentioned that you saw or heard the last shot and
- 18 you also told us about Brendan throwing the knife
- 19 away.
- 20 A. Um-hum.
- 21 Q. Which of those happened first?
- In other words, was the knife thrown
- 23 before the last shot or after the last shot?
- 24 A. After.
- Or -- you know, I can't remember.

- 1 Q. Okay. That's fine. That's --
- 2 A. I'm pretty -- I'm pretty sure it was -- it
- 3 was -- it became past 15 once he hit the ground,
- 4 and right prior to that, he threw the knife.
- 5 | Q. How many times did you see Brendan fall out
- 6 in the street that day?
- 7 A. Twice.
- 8 Q. Was one time closer to the rotary and then
- 9 once a little farther away?
- 10 A. Yeah. It was -- yeah.
- 11 Q. Okay. And the first time you heard Brendan
- 12 | fall, or saw Brendan fall, had you heard any of
- 13 those shotgun shots yet?
- 14 A. No.
- 15 Q. And then, after Brendan fell, was when the
- 16 | shotgun shots started?
- 17 A. When he got up, I think they started pecking
- 18 at him.
- 19 Q. And then Brendan went down a second time?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 Q. And, while he was down the second time, did
- 22 they continue to shoot while he was down on the
- 23 | ground?
- 24 A. Yes, sir, yes.
- MR. HEINEMAN: Thank you, Mr. Hanify.

1	That's all the questions I have.
2	THE COURT: Anything on that?
3	MR. VAN EPPS: Just a second.
4	MS. GEMMILL: Nothing further, your
5	Honor.
6	THE COURT: Mr. Hanify, thank you very
7	much.
8	THE WITNESS: Thank you.
9	(Witness excused.)
10	MR. HEINEMAN: Your Honor, can we perhaps
11	do a quick restroom break?
12	THE COURT: That's fine.
13	Why don't we take five, ten minutes?
14	MR. HEINEMAN: Sure.
15	THE COURT OFFICER: All rise.
16	Court will be in a brief recess.
17	(11:39 a.m. court in recess.)
18	(11:49 a.m. court resumes.)
19	THE COURT OFFICER: You may be seated.
20	Court is in session.
21	MR. VAN EPPS: Your Honor, before we call
22	the next witness, I'm going to offer, and I'm
23	showing (inaudible), but I'm going to offer the
24	interview reports that were on cases referenced
25	in prior testimony

1	THE COURT: All right.
2	MR. VAN EPPS: of the witnesses, Ms.
3	Hine, Mr. Chang, and Mr. Hanify.
4	And I know the Court's already reviewed
5	them because they were filed with the clerk
6	THE COURT: Yes.
7	MR. VAN EPPS: and I would ask that
8	they be marked as Exhibits 2, 3, and 4.
9	THE CLERK: Hine No. 2; Chang three;
10	Hanify four.
11	(Exhibit No. 2, Interview Report of
12	Ms. Hine, received into evidence.)
13	(Exhibit No. 3, Interview Report of
14	Mr. Chang, received into evidence.)
15	(Exhibit No. 4, Interview Report of
16	Mr. Hanify, received into evidence.)
17	MR. VAN EPPS: And the next witness is
18	Tal Dinnar.
19	THE COURT OFFICER: Right this way,
20	please.
21	Stop here, and face the clerk, and raise
22	your right hand, please.
23	THE CLERK: Do you solemnly swear or
24	affirm that the testimony you will provide for
25	this Court will be the truth so help you God?

1	THE WITNESS: (Inaudible.)
2	TAL DINNAR, SWORN
3	THE COURT OFFICER: Right this way,
4	please. Right over here.
5	Just watch your step going over here.
6	Try and sit as close as you can (inaudible).
7	THE COURT: Careful. Ma'am, is it Dinnar
8	or
9	THE WITNESS: Dinnar.
10	THE COURT: Dinnar.
11	THE WITNESS: Yes.
12	THE COURT: My name's Judge Brennan. I'm
13	presiding over the inquest. Two things.
14	I saw when you came in you were wearing a
15	mask. If you want to continue to wear it, that's
16	totally fine.
17	THE WITNESS: Okay.
18	THE COURT: Secondly, I can't order you
19	not to talk about your testimony with anyone, but
20	at some point following the inquest I'm going to
21	produce a report that's going to be published
22	at least to the parties here, it's not for
23	general publication but I'd just ask if you
24	could not discuss your testimony until that's

been released. Okay?

1 EXAMINATION

- 2 BY MR. VAN EPPS:
- 3 Q. Good morning, ma'am.
- 4 A. Good morning.
- 5 \ Q. Would you give us your name and would you
- 6 | spell your full name for our transcript?
- 7 A. Tal Dinnar, T-A-L, and last name Dinnar.
- B = D-I-N-N-A-R.
- 9 Q. And, ma'am, where do you live?
- 10 A. Lexington, 95 Simonds Road.
- 11 Q. Okay. How far is that from the -- the rotary
- 12 where Blake and Burlington meet Hancock and North
- 13 Hancock?
- 14 A. Five minutes's walk.
- 15 Q. Five-minute walk? Okay.
- 16 How long have you lived in Lexington?
- 17 A. Twenty years.
- 18 Q. Okay. Always at that address or a different
- 19 address?
- 20 A. Different address, but we live in that
- 21 address for 18 years.
- 22 Q. Eighteen years, okay.
- 23 And are you married?
- 24 A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And you mentioned it's about a

- 1 five-minute walk from the rotary.
- 2 Does that mean you're familiar with that
- 3 area from walking there a lot?
- 4 A. Yes. That's our regular route.
- 5 Q. Okay. And are you employed, ma'am?
- 6 A. Right now I'm self-employed.
- 7 Q. What do you do?
- 8 A. Well, I am project manager and I'm a UX
- 9 designer.
- 10 Q. UX designer?
- 11 A. It's user experience designer.
- 12 Q. So that's for computer software, something
- 13 like that?
- 14 A. Yeah, something like that.
- 15 Q. Okay. I want to ask you some questions about
- 16 February 12th of this year.
- Did you go out for a walk around 12:30
- 18 p.m. that day?
- 19 A. Yes.
- 20 Q. Okay. How do you get to the rotary from
- 21 | where you were?
- 22 How would you get there?
- 23 A. We live on the corner of Simonds and Blake.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. So we go down Blake Road, which connects from

- 1 the northwest to the rotary.
- 2 | Q. Okay. Is that what you did that day?
- 3 A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And were you with your husband?
- 5 A. Yes.
- 6 Q. Okay. As you're approaching the rotary, were
- 7 you able to hear anything that drew your
- 8 attention?
- 9 A. We stopped because we heard something. We
- 10 stopped at -- near 16 Blake.
- 11 Q. Okay.
- 12 A. And then we saw a man crossing the rotary
- 13 from west to east.
- 14 Q. Okay. Had you heard anything unusual as you
- 15 were approaching the rotary?
- 16 A. No.
- 17 Q. Okay. The person approaching the rotary,
- 18 | tell me about that person.
- 19 A. So we -- I was not able to see details, I saw
- 20 him running, and nothing unusual, and then he
- 21 fell on the road between the rotary and the
- 22 | sidewalk, on the east side.
- 23 Q. Okay. This man that was running.
- 24 Can you describe anything about his
- 25 appearance?

- A. He was kind of tall, I think more than average.
- I cannot say any more details at that point when I first saw him.
- 5 Q. Okay. Okay.
- 6 A. Then --
- 7 Q. But you kept watching, it sounds like?
- 8 A. I what?
- 9 Q. It sounds like you kept watching or you
- 10 kept --
- 11 A. Yes, oh, yes.
- 15 Q. Okay. And what -- so the man running into the rotary falls.
- What about that led you to stop with your husband?
- A. Oh, that there were -- oh, just that
 something is going on, maybe noises or -- and it
 was unusual that, I mean, crossing from the
 rotary, because it's not a place where people
- 23 normally walk, so...
- Q. And when you describe the man running, are you describing somebody running like they're

- 1 jogging or --
- 2 A. No.
- Q. -- somebody, like, running away from
- 4 something?
- 5 A. No, it was, like, definitely someone is
- 6 running away from something.
- Q. Were there any other people that you could
- 8 | see behind that man that came into view?
- 9 A. Not at the first moment, but when he fell,
- 10 there was a bunch of, like, I would say five
- 11 policemen running after him and standing --
- 12 eventually on the sidewalk, between the road
- 13 leading to the school and Burlington Road, so it
- 14 was the side, the east side of the rotary.
- 15 Q. Okay. And is that sort of before the road
- 16 that takes you to the middle school?
- 17 A. It's between the road taking to the middle
- 18 school north and to -- to the Burlington Road.
- It's a very tiny, very -- yeah, I can show
- 20 you exactly.
- 21 Q. I'm going -- I'm going to just show you --
- 22 I'm just going to show you a map now.
- What I'd like you to do, I'm just going to
- 24 give you a marker.
- 25 If you could -- first of all, does that

- 1 appear to be a Google Earth map or a Google map?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. Based out of the way it --
- 4 A. Okay. Here's Blake. This is north. This
- 5 is the rotary, Hancock -- I'm looking for the
- 6 tiny -- it must be this one, going to the school,
- 7 so they were standing right here. He fell right
- 8 here.
- 9 Q. So why don't you -- let's -- I'm going to
- 10 give you a marker.
- 11 A. Yup.
- 12 Q. Why don't you write your initials where you
- 13 were standing first.
- 14 A. Okay. It's not --
- 15 Q. If you can see it on the map.
- 16 A. -- but it's close, No. 16.
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 A. Next to No. 16.
- So we were able to see from here, okay?
- 20 Q. Can you make -- why don't you make an M for
- 21 | where the man --
- 22 A. Fell?
- 23 Q. -- ended up with the police?
- 24 A. Okay. Here is a man and here are the police.
- 25 Q. Okay. And can you --

- 1 A. Police. Police, man.
- Q. All right. That's what I was going to ask
- 3 you, you wrote police.
- 4 MR. VAN EPPS: And I'm just going to ask
- 5 this be offered as the next exhibit (inaudible).
- 6 THE COURT: Exhibit 5.
- 7 (Exhibit No. 5, Map, received into
- 8 evidence.)
- 9 MR. VAN EPPS: Thank you.
- 10 BY MR. VAN EPPS:
- 11 Q. All right. So -- actually, I'm going to turn
- 12 it (inaudible). Sorry. I'm going to turn it
- 13 like that.
- 14 THE COURT: Um-hum.
- 15 BY MR. VAN EPPS:
- 16 Q. Okay. So you've -- you've indicated in the
- 17 top left, you drew a little arrow indicating
- 18 that's where you were --
- 19 A. Close, close to where we were.
- 20 Q. -- (inaudible) from? Okay.
- 21 And you're looking down between the curb
- 22 marking and the kind of straight black marking
- 23 | that you drew?
- 24 A. Correct.
- 25 Q. That's your -- kind of your line of sight?

- 1 A. Um-hum.
- 2 \ Q. And the M in the middle of the rotary is the
- 3 man that was running and fell?
- 4 A. Correct.
- 5 Q. And the officers ended up in this kind of arc
- 6 shape that you just --
- 7 A. Correct.
- 8 Q. Okay. I just wanted to make sure I
- 9 understood how you marked it up.
- 10 A. Um-hum.
- 11 Q. Okay. Now, so what happens after -- you're
- 12 now watching this.
- What can you hear?
- 14 A. So we heard -- during this event --
- 15 O. Um-hum.
- 16 A. -- we heard two main voices coming out from
- 17 the police --
- 18 Q. Okay.
- 19 A. -- men.
- 20 Q. You could distinguish different voices?
- 21 A. Two different voices.
- One was very calm, coming from a policeman
- 23 on the right.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. And saying thing -- you want me to say

- 1 what --
- 2 Q. Please.
- 3 A. Yeah.

So this policeman said, Brendan -- and this is how we -- we learn what was probably the man's name -- Brendan, it's going to be okay. We are here to help you. We will call an ambulance. It will be okay, don't worry, but we need you to drop off your knife.

And he kept on saying things like that in a very calm and -- and reassuring voice.

A policeman on the left --

- 13 Q. Okay.
- A. -- he constantly in a very, like, hectic
 voice said, Drop the knife; drop the knife; drop
- 17 O. Okay.

the knife.

- 18 A. In a very scary way.
- 19 Q. (Indiscernible.)
- 20 A. So there were these two voices coming -21 coming out from the policemen.
- 22 Q. So -- so you have two voices, one that is -23 is calmer than the other, the other one for --
- 24 giving instructions, as opposed to --
- 25 A. In a very scary way, actually.

- 1 Q. Okay. Did that voice seem stressed?
- 2 A. Yes, yes.
- 3 Q. Okay.
- 4 A. Yes.
- 5 Q. Tell me, if you can, could you observe what
- 6 the police were holding, if they were holding
- 7 anything?
- 8 A. As far as I remember now, they were holding
- 9 something. I could not tell what it was. I saw
- 10 the man holding something in his hand --
- 11 Q. Okay.
- 12 A. -- and waving with it.
- 13 Q. You're gesturing with your right hand.
- 14 A. Yes.
- 15 Q. Could you see what that thing was?
- 16 A. I -- I think it was his right. I'm not sure
- 17 about that.
- 18 O. Understandable.
- But you gestured with your right hand, and
- 20 you sort of waved it above your head a little
- 21 bit.
- Could you see what was in that hand?
- 23 A. No, no.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. There was something in the hand. I cannot

- 1 say what it was.
- 2 Q. Okay. And as they're addressing him, the
- 3 police (inaudible), as they're addressing
- 4 Brendan, are they giving him instructions about
- 5 anything he's holding?
- 6 A. As I mentioned, there was, Drop off the
- 7 knife.
- 8 Q. Okay. And was this once or more than once or
- 9 many times or what?
- 10 A. Many times.
- 11 Q. Okay.
- 12 A. And I heard some kind of (indiscernible)
- 13 coming from him. I was not able to understand
- 14 what he was saying.
- 15 Q. Okay.
- 16 A. He was, like, half -- faced to us, so I
- 17 | couldn't --
- 18 Q. You couldn't make out the responses?
- 19 A. I could not hear what he said.
- 20 Q. Okay. Putting aside words, could you
- 21 describe for us the tone or the volume or
- 22 anything about what was coming out of his mouth?
- 23 A. Not really.
- Q. Okay. So after this man fell, and the police
- 25 potentially catch up, what's the position of

- 1 the -- Brendan -- Brendan?
- 2 A. He was --
- 3 Q. What was the position of the man?
- 4 A. He was at the same place where I drew him,
- 5 and most of the time on his back, really, like,
- 6 you know, like, moving around a small area.
- 7 Q. Okay. Moving around -- he's on -- he's on
- 8 his back side, meaning his butt, is he -- is he
- 9 moving around, like, I'm trying to find -- if you
- 10 could describe how he's moving around.
- 11 A. You want me to demonstrate?
- 12 Q. No, no.
- 13 A. He was on the ground, but -- but moving,
- 14 like, because he was waving with -- with the
- 15 knife, so he was moving around, but -- but not,
- 16 | like, trying to run around, okay, he was -- he
- 17 | was most of the time.
- 18 Q. All right. So as they're giving him
- 19 instructions for what -- for the item he's
- 20 holding, you had, again, you had gestured sort of
- 21 with your hand with sort of waving it, is that
- 22 something that you saw him motion like that once,
- 23 more than once, many times?
- 24 A. Many times.
- 25 Q. Okay.

- 1 A. Yeah.
- 2 \ Q. And could you get a sense -- could you
- describe for us the distance between the man on
- 4 the ground and the officers that were talking to
- 5 him?
- 6 A. You could see it right there. I mean, you
- 7 see where he was standing and the policemen were
- 8 standing on the sidewalk, so, you know, it was,
- 9 like -- it's difficult for me to -- to say, to
- 10 estimate.
- 11 Q. Could you estimate using items in this room?
- 12 A. I mean, you can measure on -- on there. I
- 13 mean, it was, like, maybe -- maybe a little bit
- 14 behind you, the man was, Brendan was, and the
- 15 policemen were here, like, and it wasn't, like,
- 16 an immediate contact, if that's what you're
- 17 looking for.
- 18 O. There was a little bit of distance?
- 19 A. There was a distance, definitely a distance.
- 20 THE COURT: Just for the record, I don't
- 21 know if everybody can agree, but I would say
- 22 somewhere -- I'm basing this on foul shot,
- 23 somewhere around 15 feet, 15, 20 feet?
- MR. VAN EPPS: Give or take.
- 25 THE COURT: Give or take.

- So basically from, I guess what she's describing. Is somewhere around the railing in this room to the judge's bench.

- Q. So you're watching -- is there any point at
 which you can see that the man did whatever the
 police were asking him to do so that they stopped

- A. So it lasted for long time. It lasted for, I
 would say, for 15 minutes, during which they shot
 him with what we understood later from the police
- 17 with, like, a bean bag.
- 18 Q. Um-hum.
- A. They told us that's what they do, because we heard the shot and -- and then he fell -- he fell back whenever it happened.
- It happened probably twice, as far as I can tell.
- Q. Okay. So you would hear those shots?
- 25 A. Yes.

- Q. You'd see some kind of physical movement on -- after the shot?
 - Would the instructions and whatever he was saying continue after that?
 - A. Yes.

- Can you -- before we get to that, can you describe, if you can, anything about the man's demeanor, in terms of the way he communicated and the way he was (indiscernible) his instructions or anything about his demeanor at that point?

 A. So as I mentioned, he continue moving -- be
- 15 Q. Um-hum.

restless --

- A. -- and waving with his hand, and whatever he held in his hand, and they continue with their instructions.
 - So it was, like, kind of back and forth, back and forth, back and forth, going on for -for a long time.
- 22 Q. Okay. So what happens as this unfolds?
- A. So, during that time, a police car showed up and blocked Burlington Road from the north.
- 25 Q. Um-hum.

- 1 A. I blocked Blake Road from the northwest, so I
- 2 redirected the traffic coming in.
- 3 Q. Um-hum.
- 4 A. And at some point the policeman on the left
- 5 slipped on the ice and fell on the -- fell on the
- 6 ground, and then we heard another shot.
- 7 | Q. Okay.
- 8 A. And, after that, one policeman went to the
- 9 car, to the police car, and got equipment out of
- 10 it and approached the man, yeah.
- 11 Q. So as this is happening, you mentioned a
- 12 second -- or that you were -- you were blocking,
- 13 is it Blake?
- 14 A. Blake.
- 15 Q. Okay. So does that mean you're -- you're
- 16 kind of -- you're in the street kind of as cars
- 17 | are coming, motioning them away?
- 18 A. Correct.
- 19 Q. Okay. Are you still at this time trying to
- 20 keep an eye on what's going on?
- 21 A. When I was redirecting traffic, I was not
- 22 able to see the scene.
- 23 Q. Okay. But, like, in between?
- 24 A. In between, we kept on watching until my
- 25 husband told me, Let's go, because he understood

- 1 what happened. I did not.
- 2 Q. And tell me about the -- the moment when the
- 3 officer slips, if you can.
- 4 A. So it was February, there was snow and ice
- 5 on -- on the sidewalk and as he was moving back
- and forth, he slipped on the ice and fell.
- 7 Q. Forward or backward or --
- 8 A. Forward, forward.
- 9 Q. Okay.
- 10 A. So I -- at this point, I cannot remember if
- 11 he was still on the sidewalk or he fell on the
- 12 road. I cannot. I'm not sure. (Indiscernible.)
- 13 Q. But is it right by that curb?
- 14 A. Yeah.
- 15 Q. Okay. And so what happens at that point?
- You said you heard shots?
- 17 A. I heard a shot.
- 18 Q. What -- what could you see happening as you
- 19 heard the shots?
- 20 A. I don't remember.
- 21 Q. Okay. The last -- just before the shots, do
- you have a memory of where the man was in
- 23 relation to police?
- 24 A. Same place.
- 25 Q. Okay.

- 1 A. He was same place.
- 2 Q. Okay. In the moments before the -- the last
- 3 moment you can remember before the shot, did it
- 4 appear to be the man was still holding whatever
- 5 he had been holding the whole time?
- 6 A. Probably.
- 7 Q. And, in terms of shots, did those shots sound
- 8 different or the same as the earlier what you
- 9 described as the bean bag shots?
- 10 A. I cannot really tell. To me, it sound the
- 11 same.
- 12 Q. Okay. In the sense they were loud? Okay.
- 13 A. (Indiscernible.)
- 14 Q. Do you remember how many shots you heard?
- 15 A. One, but I'm not very sure about that.
- 16 Q. Okay. As you're -- when you hear the shots,
- 17 is this something that you hear as you're facing
- 18 the rotary, or are you in the middle of directing
- 19 traffic at the same time?
- 20 A. I believe facing the rotary.
- 21 Q. Okay. The -- the officer who approached the
- 22 car after the shots began (inaudible), how
- 23 quickly did that happen after the shots?
- 24 A. Pretty quickly. And their ambulance arrived,
- 25 | too.

- Q. Okay. How quickly did that happen?
- 2 A. Quickly.

Q. Okay. So you described one car -- one police car blocking off Burlington Street.

As you're watching, did you get a sense of whether there were other police or emergency vehicles nearby?

A. No, not that we were able to see.

As you can -- as you can see, we were able to see only until half of the rotary.

We were not able to see the west or southwest.

- Q. Okay. After the shots, could you -- could you see whether the position of the man on the ground changed?
- A. (No audible response.)
- 17 Q. Could you hear any -- you're indicating no.

Can you -- can you tell me whether there was a point at which the police were still giving that person instructions after the shots?

- A. Not as far as I recall, there were not any more instructions.
- Q. And the officer that slipped at the curb,
 we'll say, when that happens, are you able to
 tell whether the officer just went flat down or

- 1 was scrambling to get his feet or what?
- 2 A. Just flat, I think. He was the officer,
- 3 like, the farthest from the man. He was
- 4 farthest.
- 5 There were officers closer to the man.
- 6 Q. Were there -- could you tell whether that
- 7 officer was carrying anything, or holding
- 8 anything?
- 9 A. I believe he did carry, as far as I remember,
- 10 he did carry a gun or something.
- 11 Q. Do you remember anything about the -- the
- 12 shape or the color of that gun?
- 13 A. No.
- 14 Q. Do you remember at any point -- do you
- 15 remember at any point that the -- the closest --
- 16 | it sounds like your testimony, what you're saying
- is that there's this -- this kind of semicircle
- 18 of officers and then there's a man on the ground
- 19 who's moving in different ways.
- 20 A. Yeah, more towards the south.
- 21 Q. Right. Towards -- towards the south would be
- 22 towards you?
- 23 A. No. We were on the northwest.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. So he was on the -- moving around the south

- 1 part.
- Q. Okay. And, again, this is still while he's
- 3 essentially on his backside on the (inaudible)?
- 4 A. Yes.
- 5 Q. So almost like butt scooting, is that --

- 7 Q. At any point -- or do you recall talking to
- 8 the police about whether, when you were
- 9 interviewed, whether the distance between him and
- 10 the police got closer at any point?

- 12 He was -- he was moving around, but not
- 13 really getting close, really close to the
- 14 policemen.
- 15 Q. Okay. When you -- when you saw him after the
- 16 shots, the man, can you approximate the distance
- 17 he was from the officers at that point?
- 18 A. When -- after he was shot?
- 19 Q. Yes.
- 20 A. No. I don't remember.
- 21 Q. Do you remember when you were interviewed by
- 22 the Lexington police on February 16th, do you
- 23 remember that interview -- and you met with, I
- 24 believe it was Detective (indiscernible)?
- 25 A. I don't remember the names.

- 1 Q. Okay. But, in fact --
 - A. There were two of them.
 - Q. Right.

- And do you remember discussing or talking about how at one point the distance between the officer and the man was at one point as close as six feet?
- A. Which officer, the one that's hit? That stepped on the ground?
- Q. One of the officers with -- that was holding up a rifle.

 - But the man was there and the man that slipped was on the north side of the semicircle.
 - Q. But do you remember that topic coming up when you talked to the police back in February?

- Q. The movements of the man on the ground, can you describe how, you know, what were they, fast, slow, were they smooth, were they jerky?
- Can you describe the movements in a little more detail?
- 25 A. He was trying to move. Sometimes he even,

- 3 Q. That's when you would hear the noises?
- A. Yeah. But he never, like, stood on his feet
- or, like, moving towards -- really towards them.
- 6 Q. He never got fully to his feet?
- 7 A. Right.
- Q. Okay. So, if I understand you, correct me if
- 9 I'm wrong, at different points he's moving and
- 10 beginning to rise up, and then you would hear
- 11 | the --
- 12 A. Yeah.
- 13 Q. -- the bean bag shots?
- 14 A. Yeah.

- 16 A. Sometimes he was moving back, sometimes he

- 11 Right is south, and left is north.
- 12 Q. All right. And so the officer to the left or
- to the north was the officer who was being loud?

- 17 Q. And you said that the way he was talking was
- 18 in a scary tone?
- 19 A. Correct.
- 20 | Q. Did he continue with that loud, scary tone --
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. -- through the entire episode?

- 24 Q. And the other officer, who was to the right,
- 25 was --

- A. One -- one of the right -- I cannot say if it
 was the -- the one at the right or the one next
- 3 to him.
- It came from the right side -- from the south side.
- Q. All right. So one of the officers, who was to the south of the loud officer, was talking in
- 9 A. Correct.

a more calm voice?

- 10 Q. Do you remember telling the Lexington police
- 11 that towards the end, it was the louder officer
- 12 who took control of the situation towards the
- 13 | end?

- 14 A. I don't know.
- 15 Q. Okay. That loud officer, did you see that
- 16 | loud officer moving around during this
- 17 interaction?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. And the loud officer, was he carrying one of
- 20 the long guns or some other type of a weapon?
- 21 A. I cannot tell you what kind of weapon he was
- 22 holding.
- 23 Q. Was it the loud officer who slipped and fell?
- 24 A. I believe so.
- 25 Q. And the police report we've been provided

says that when the officer -- of the interview, 1 and I can't tell whether it's of you or your 2 3 husband, so I apologize -- but it says, When the officer fell, tension went up, and the man in the 4 5 street sat up. Did you see that? 6 Did you see the man sit up when the 7 officer fell? 8 9 He was moving. He was moving same way he was 10 moving before. Okay. After the officer fell, though, the 11 12 man never got to his feet, did he? 13 I believe not. Α. 14 MR. HEINEMAN: Thank you. 15 That's all I have, Ms. Dinnar. 16 Thank you. 17 Anything on that from anyone? THE COURT: 18 MR. VAN EPPS: I just want to clarify 19 something. 20 REDIRECT EXAMINATION 21 BY MR. - 20 ask you some questions about February 12th of

- 25 out for a walk.

- Q. And you live only maybe five minutes from the rotary behind North Hancock and Hancock and Blake; is that right?
 - A. Yes.

We live on the corner of Blake and Simonds, so just down the road a few minutes.

Q. Okay. Did the path of your walk take you to the rotary, or in the direction of the rotary?

A. Yes.

That's our normal path that we walk, and it took us in that direction; and then we were held short because of the event, yeah.

- Q. And a residential neighborhood, lots of homes nearby, there's a school nearby; is that right?
- A. Yes.
 - Q. As you're approaching the rotary, you know, as you're approaching where, you know, Blake feeds into Burlington and Burlington hits the rotary, did you become aware of any sounds or any noises that were out of the ordinary?
 - A. We -- as we're walking down Blake, it starts descending in that direction, I heard a far-off siren, didn't pay much attention to it, but it was a Saturday morning, and it did seem to be in

the general direction. That was it.

- Q. And what do you recall about that day in terms of -- you're out for a walk, what was the weather like, what was the condition like?
 - A. It was -- it had snowed, so the ground was -- had snow and ice on it, patches of snow and ice, and it was a nice, sunny winter day, which felt good for a walk, yeah.
 - Q. Fair enough.

As you approach where Blake and Burlington feeds into the rotary, what, if anything, did you observe in the rotary that seemed unusual to you?

A. So first we heard this -- so this is a couple minutes after that siren, we heard sort of boot stomping --

- Q. Um-hum.
- A. -- and just, like, this commotion.

And we looked up in the direction of the rotary, and I saw a person run in our direction from the rotary direction to Burlington, and then slip at -- at the place where Blake and Burlington would meet, just shy of the rotary, slip on the ground facing us, and then immediately thereafter several policemen came up behind and sort of positioned themselves facing that person.

- Q. Okay. The person that had been running, could you describe that person's looks and appearance in any detail?
 - A. It's -- it's hard from so long ago.

Youngish, I would say 38, thin, athletic.

- Q. Clothes, if you can?
- A. I think a tan-colored shirt and -- and pants.
- 8 Hard to -- I don't recall exactly.
- 9 Q. Okay. So this person falls, I think you said.
- 11 | A. Yeah.

- Q. And you had -- as you're approaching, you had heard sirens.
 - Now that you're watching this, are you able to hear anything about what's going on in the rotary?
- A. So -- so, initially, I didn't put the siren together. I don't know if it was connected.

In hindsight, it seemed connected, but at that moment, it was just a commotion of everybody on the -- on the ground.

He was falling in our direction, trying to get up; told to stay down, and -- and that was more or less the essence of the discussion that went on for -- that -- an extended period of time

afterwards.

- Q. Okay.
 - A. Some of it we could hear, especially the officers or policemen who were facing us.

Most of the time we could not hear what the -- the person, which I later know as Brandon [sic], so if it's okay I'll use Brandon [sic], he was most of the time with his back towards us, so what we could make out, I couldn't make out what he was saying.

Q. Okay. Just so I understand you, could you hear if the police were talking to him, if so, could you make out what they were saying?

A. Yes.

Initially, he was told to stay down. He was told to drop the knife. I don't know at what point he was -- one of the officers or policemen addressed him by his name and tried to calm him down and tell him that an ambulance was on his way; they -- they want to get him back home, back to his family.

- Q. Okay.
- A. So there were -- there were basically two distinct voices among them, but that was the essence of the conversation throughout.

- 1 Q. Okay. And we'll come back to those in a
- 2 second, but so you're hearing police say things
- 3 to him.
- 4 A. Yeah.
- 5 Q. Could you hear any response at all coming
- from him, even if you couldn't make out the
- 7 words?
- 8 A. I could tell he was highly distressed.
- 9 Q. What makes you say that?
- 10 A. Highly anxious.
- 11 The voice was -- I mean, you could see by
- 12 the body gestures, by the -- by the tone of the
- voice, but I couldn't make out what was being
- 14 said, yeah.
- 15 Q. Can you tell us about the -- you told us
- 16 about the body language and the tone.
- 17 What about the volume of the response,
- 18 | anything you tell us about that?
- 19 A. I --
- 20 Q. Compared to, say, the way you and I are
- 21 talking today.
- 22 A. Yeah, I don't --
- 23 Q. (Inaudible.)
- 24 A. Again, this is a long time and I'm not -- I
- don't think it was consistent, so I don't think

A. Some -- some of both.

Some where he was sort of talking in a softer and quiet voice, either to himself or to them, and then at some point it was getting louder and a little more agitated.

I mean, they had shot him with bean bags or whatever it was.

I mean, there was definitely moments of distress there; and the tone was impatient, higher, you know, pitch, sharper kind of.

But it -- but it changed. It wasn't consistent.

- Q. Okay. Can you tell us from where you were watching where the man and where the police appeared to have come from as they're running into the rotary and they end up in front of you?
- A. So we're positioned up street on Blake about two houses down.

What you can see is the intersection of

- 1 Blake and Burlington.
- You don't see much of the rotary. They
- 3 all came from the direction of that rotary.
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. And then Brandon [sic] ran and slipped and
- 6 fell on the ground, and then the officers sort of
- 7 created this arc or semicircle all on the west --
- 8 | eastern side of the rotary, so towards
- 9 Burlington, sort of in a semicircle or an arc.
- 10 Q. And when that's happening, is the man, is he,
- 11 you know, on the grassy part of the rotary or is
- 12 he in the street? Where is he?
- 13 A. Brandon's [sic] in the middle of the street.
- 14 Q. Okay. And the officers are where at this
- 15 time?
- 16 A. And the officers -- the one, No. 1, that was
- on the left, our left, was on the sidewalk, right
- 18 on that seat.
- 19 Two and three were on the street towards
- 20 the direction of the rotary.
- 21 And four was -- and maybe there was a
- 22 | five, I don't remember, I don't recall exactly --
- 23 were more towards that side of the rotary where
- 24 -- where -- that disappears out of view, that's
- 25 blocked by going off to the right --

- 1 Q. Okay.

- Q. What I'm going to ask you to do is, I'm going

The arc of police officers -- well, so there's the man on the ground. You drew the different numbers of the officers --

A. Yeah.

throughout.

Q. -- that you recall in the map.

Do their positions, you know, sort of change as the incident unfolds are or they standing perfectly motionless throughout?

A. Most of these that I drew, the four, I think they were more or less in the same position

There appeared to have been more coming from the back, and things were happening on the rotary beyond what I could view; and, eventually, there were also others, police cars coming in from the Burlington side or -- or then later to the Burlington side.

But for the most -- most of the interaction, these -- these were the primary officers that were engaged --

- Q. Okay.
- A. -- and they were more or less in the same positions.

- Q. Tell me about the instructions you heard the police giving to the man.
 - A. Um --
 - Q. I think you -- I think you --
- 5 A. Yup.

- Q. -- had said there were multiple voices.
- A. So there were two primary voices.

The one on the left I would call No. 1, stockier build, shorter, black hair, if I remember correctly, pointing a -- a rifle at the person on the ground, and most of their commands, or most of their sentences, were commands in -- in a very abrupt, loud, staccato kind of voice, so, Put the knife down. Stay down. Put the knife down. Things like that.

The person that was Officer 3 or 2, because I mean, they may have sort of moved around a little bit between them, taller, darker voice, more steady and relaxed, not relaxed, but calming, trying to be calming, and trying to be more empathetic in the -- in the way they were conversing.

And they were -- they were -- they did more, I think, of the talking, and their sentences were longer and tried to call him by

- name, at least at some point, I don't know if
 right from the beginning, but, Brandon [sic],
 we're trying to get you, or, We called your
 family, or, We're trying to get you home, we're
 calling an ambulance, things like that.

 O. Okay. And are these, with respect to these
 - Q. Okay. And are these, with respect to these two voices, are they giving these instructions multiple times or a couple times or -- can you give us a sense of that?
- 10 A. Yes.

This is going on for quite a while, multiple times.

The -- the man on the ground occasionally would turn back; look as if they were going to maybe try and, you know, see if there's another way to go, or try to get up or -- or talk back to them and shaking their hand with what appeared to be a knife at them.

And, occasionally, the person on the -the officer, policeman No. 1, would shoot at
Brandon [sic] what seemed to be nonlethal, you
know, bean bags or -- or whatever it is, to keep
him on the ground.

Q. Let me just ask you a couple follow-up questions.

- 1 A. Sure.
- 2 Q. So when you were talking to me about the man
- 3 on the ground talking back and indicating that
- 4 you -- you were -- you kind of raised your hand
- and were sort of waving it or gesturing with it.
- 6 A. That was one time. That was maybe the third
- 7 kind of interaction or after he was doing that,
- 8 so that was at a later -- again, I -- I
- 9 apologize.
- 10 It's been a long time. I don't remember
- 11 the exact sequence, but that was later in one of
- 12 the exchanges with them.
- 13 | Q. Okay.
- 14 A. And by that time, I mean, it was hard for me
- 15 to see that it's a knife, but from having heard
- 16 them say, Drop the knife, I assumed that was the
- 17 knife.
- 18 Q. Okay. And you're also, I would note, you're
- 19 | sort of shaking your hand, holding your hand as
- 20 if you're holding an imaginary knife?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. Is that how you remember that man's handling,
- 23 in terms of --
- 24 A. Yeah.
- 25 Q. -- the shake?

- A. Yeah. He was holding it as -- like you would hold a stick, not like you would do a down stabbing motion, but holding up, is what I recall.

A. He -- he was moving around. He was looking in different directions at the different

There were different officers talking to him; there were others with rifles pointed at him.

So he's looking nervously around; he's looking at the other direction where there are no officers, as if that may be an escape route or whatever, I don't know, so he's moving about, sitting, sitting up, sitting down, sort of lying down or being hit by the bean bag and being back on the ground.

At no point did -- do I remember hım getting up, okay.

So he's shifting his weight around, he's

- 1 moving around, he's -- but at no point do I
 2 remember him getting up.

- A. The best I recall is that it was black, so the barrel was -- was black and a little thicker, from my memory, but I -- I can't be 100 percent sure.
- Q. And, in terms of when you describe them as, I think, bean bags or something like that, but you describe the man on the ground being shot with those periodically.

What was happening at the time you heard those shots in terms of his position, his movements, their instructions?

Can you sort of -- describe that?

A. Yeah.

It -- again, if it was -- I don't know the exact conversation dynamics; but at some point when it appears he was either looking to go elsewhere or trying to change position and maybe get up, or not responding to their instructions to stay down and to drop the knife, then there

- was, you know, there was a shot or -- or two -- I
 think I thought one at the time -- and then he
 would get hit and sort of stay on the ground
 or -- or fall -- fall back down from sitting to
 - Q. Was -- and how many times did you hear shots like that, like the -- that sounded like that, what you're describing?
 - A. I -- I probably had a better description in my interview after the fact of how many times.

It's hard for me to recall, maybe three, maybe four. I don't recall exactly from ten months later, but.

- Q. But today you remember it as three or four?
- A. It's several, several, yeah.
- Q. And you described them as being bean bags.

After -- after the -- after the shots, the whole interaction would continue, there'd be instructions and he'd still be kind of moving around?

The officer, or Policeman No. 1, who was on the left with the -- what I perceived to be the bean bag long gun, rifle, is -- is occasionally adjusting their position, so they -- they would shuffle forward, shuffle back to decide as they're -- as they have their rifle trained on Brandon [sic] on the ground and yelling, and at some point after this had happened several times, they -- they are shuffling and they slipped on the ice and fell on their back.

That caused this sort of shift in the dynamic because. All of a sudden, things that have been pretty stable, all of a sudden there's a big kind of change in the dynamic, a person's on the ground with the rifle, people are looking up, they're looking in different directions, and Brandon [sic] reacted as well to -- to the fact that the officer's on the ground, by leaning forward or looking at him on the ground, et cetera, and -- and then a different sounding

- rifle is what I heard, fire -- fire a couple of shots, or a few shots, and then Brandon [sic]
- 3 fell down.

- Q. Do you remember how many shots you heard?
- 5 A. I don't precisely, but I think it was maybe three or four in short sequence.

- 17 deeper voice was talking in a calmer manner?

- 19 Q. And you identified the officer to the left as
- 20 Officer No. 1 --
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. -- in your drawing?
- I want to talk about Officer No. 1.
- 24 A. Okay.
- 25 Q. Officer No. 1 during the course of this event

- 1 had a long rifle or a shotgun in his hands,
- 2 right?
- 3 A. Yeah.
- 4 Q. Was it pointed at Brandon [sic] the entire
- 5 | time?
- 6 A. Yes. I mean, apart from repositioning, et
- 7 cetera, but the -- yes.
- 8 Q. And so when we're talking the entire time,
- 9 we're talking the scope of minutes?
- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 Q. And during that time, were there officers
- 12 other than Officer No. 1 who also had rifle or
- 13 shotguns pointed at -- his name is Brendan, by
- 14 | the way --
- 15 A. Yeah.
- 16 Q. -- I wouldn't expect you to know it, but
- 17 Brendan, not Brandon -- pointed at Brendan.
- 18 A. I'm sorry.
- 19 Q. It's not your -- not your fault.

- Q. Okay. And what did you observe that the police were doing as that happened?
- A. They were shouting and following him and telling him to stop.
- 13 Q. Could you make out what they were shouting?
 - A. I recall snippets of -- I recall snippets. I remember his name being used. Lots of telling him to stop.

I remember I became aware that they must have said something about, Drop the knife, because I became aware he had a knife, but I hadn't seen it, per se.

And so they were shouting, but it was replaced pretty quickly as he got over the rotary and he stumbled, but then he got back up, and then there were some bangs.

Q. Okay. I'm going to show you a map.

- 1 A. Sure.
- Q. I'm going to ask you to do your best to show
- 3 us, if you can, on the map where Brendan -- this
- 4 person fell.

And then around the time after Fall No. 2, I decided I needed to get home, as my house was directly across from where the police officers were facing and where the gentleman might run, and I was worried my children were going to come out because it was loud, and I didn't want them

to come out and be right there, so I decided I had to get home.

And as I made my way, I couldn't go -- I couldn't go my usual route, I couldn't go backwards because it would take too long and my kids might come out, so I decided to go across Hancock towards the road that leads down to Diamond.

And as I was doing that, I saw, you know, the cars lined up, and I think I mentioned, there was a lady filming in her car, which caught my attention, and I -- I frowned at her, because I thought it was not cool.

And do I remember any other people? There was a car. At that point I started to run.

Q. What do you remember about the conditions that day?

And by that I mean the weather (inaudible)?

A. Um-hum. It was sunny, and it was an unusually warm day, because I was surprised to hear it was February, because I know it was warm, but I know there was still some snow and crud on the ground.

- 5 when you were making these observations once you
- 6 stopped and were seeing things -- I haven't seen
- 7 the drawing yet -- but were you essentially at
- 8 the end of Hancock Street where it meets the
- 9 rotary?

- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 Q. And you mentioned that there was a woman you
- 12 saw who was filming.
- 13 Was she in a car on Hancock Street?
- 14 A. Not North Hancock, but Hancock.
- So I'm here; she was here, yes.
- 16 Q. And at some point in time did you walk in
- 17 | front of her vehicle?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. All right.
- 20 A. That's why I noticed her filming, because I
- 21 looked to see.
- 22 \ Q. Now, using your -- your terms of Fall 1 and
- Fall 2, the rotary has a center section with
- 24 grass.
- 25 A. Yup.

- 1 Q. Am I right that Fall 1 was closer to that
- 2 grassy --
- 3 A. Yes.
- 4 Q. And then Fall 2 was a little farther up?
- 5 A. Yes.
- 6 Q. Did you hear any of the shots which we're
- 7 calling the bean bag shots before Brendan fell
- 8 the first time?
- 9 A. No.
- 10 Q. Did you hear bean bag shots between the first
- 11 fall and the second fall?
- 12 A. Yes.
- 13 Q. Did you hear more bean bag shots after
- 14 Brendan was on the ground on the second fall?
- 15 A. I believe so.
- 16 Q. After Brendan fell the second time and was on
- 17 the roadway, did he ever again get up to his
- 18 feet?
- 19 A. I didn't see him get to his feet.
- 20 Q. And I know times are tough; that is,
- 21 estimated times --
- 22 A. Yes.
- 23 Q. -- but can you give me an estimate of the
- 24 time between Fall No. 2 and the time of those
- 25 | final different-sounding shots?

- 1 A. That's very hard.
- 2 It wasn't seconds; it wasn't ten minutes,
- 3 I don't think. Somewhere...
- 4 MR. HEINEMAN: Thank you, ma'am.
- 5 That's all the questions I have.
- 6 THE COURT: Thank you.
- 7 MR. MCDONALD: If I could?
- THE COURT: Sure. Go ahead.

- 9 A. I am in account management. I work for a
- 10 healthcare IT firm.
- 11 Q. Okay. I'm going to turn your attention now
- 12 to February 12th of 2022.
- Did your plans on that particular day take
- 14 you into Lexington?
- 15 A. Yes. I was doing a cycling route going
- 16 through Lexington.
- 17 Q. Okay. And, I apologize, can you maybe scoot
- 18 a little closer to your microphone?
- 19 THE COURT: And just so it's clear, I can
- 20 hear him fine.
- 21 MS. GEMMILL: Okay. I'm just having a
- 22 | little bit of trouble.

- MS. GEMMILL: I apologize.

- 1 Q. So you were on a cycling route.
- 2 Where were you traveling from. Like, what
- 3 was your path that day?

- Are we talking about, like, a two-wheel
- 9 bicycle, not a motorcycle, correct?
- 10 A. Yes, two-wheel, pedal bicycle.

SCOTT MATTOON, SWORN 19 20 THE COURT: Go ahead. 21 MS. GEMMILL: Thank you. 22 BY MS. GEMMILL: Sir, can you tell us how old you are? 23 Q. 24 Fifty-three. Α. What is your date of birth? 25 0.

- 1 A. May 12, 1969.
- Q. In February of 2022, where were you living?
- 3 A. Seven Royal Circle in Lexington.
- 4 Q. Where do you live now?
- 5 A. I now live in Oakland, California.
- 6 Q. All right. And are you Zooming with us from
- 7 Oakland, California, today?
- 8 A. Correct.
- 9 Q. Okay. Sir, are you employed?
- 10 A. I am.
- 11 Q. What do you do for work?
- 12 A. I'm an education administrator.
- 13 Q. Okay. I'm going to turn your attention to
- 14 February 12th of 2022.
- Were you in Lexington on that day?
- 16 A. I was.
- 17 \ Q. All right. And did your plans on that
- 18 particular Saturday take you towards the area of
- 19 the rotary in the Hancock Street area in
- 20 Lexington?
- 21 A. Yes. I was going for a distance run.
- 22 Q. A distance run?
- 23 A. Yup.
- 24 Q. When you were going for a run, were you by
- 25 | yourself, or were you running with anybody else?

- 1 A. By myself.
- Q. Okay. Do you regularly -- at that time, were
- 3 you regularly running through that rotary area?
- 4 A. I -- I had run through that rotary area for
- 5 about a seven-year period but at varying times,
- 6 depending on the day.
- 7 Q. Okay. Would you say you were familiar with
- 8 | the roads and the homes in that area?
- 9 A. Yes, I am.
- 10 Q. Okay. So around midday on that day, were you
- 11 running through the area of the Hancock Street
- 12 rotary?
- 13 A. I was.
- 14 Q. Did something catch your attention as you
- 15 were headed through that area?
- 16 A. Yes. As I crossed through the rotary and
- 17 | landed on -- on the sidewalk, I heard a man from
- 18 the second-floor window kind of yelling
- 19 | frantically about needing help because someone
- 20 was going to kill him.
- 21 Q. Now, did you hear this man before you saw
- 22 him?
- 23 A. I heard him before I saw him.
- 24 Q. Okay. About how far away from the house
- 25 where this man was yelling from were you at the

- 1 | time you first heard that voice?
- 2 A. I was at the -- on the sidewalk where it met
- 3 the driveway to the house, so I would -- I would
- 4 guess I was about -- I want to say maybe 50 feet
- 5 from that second-floor window.
- 6 Q. Now, was that five, zero or one, five?
- 7 A. I'm sorry, five zero.
- 8 Q. Okay.
- 9 A. That's just a best guess.
- 10 Q. The house at that address, was that
- 11 98 Hancock Street?
- 12 A. That was my understanding, yes.
- 13 Q. Okay. So you hear the voice.
- What do you do when you hear that voice calling?
- 16 A. I ask -- when it first caught my attention, I
- asked what was wrong; and he repeated that he was
- 18 trying to kill me, someone's trying to kill me.
- I asked him to repeat what he was saying,
- 20 just to make sure I heard what I thought I heard.
- 21 Q. Were you able to look to see where this man
- 22 was yelling from?
- 23 A. Yes.
- At that point I could -- I made
- 25 face contact with the person.

- Q. Okay. And where was that person located?
- A. In the second floor -- in a second-floor window, I believe.

It was one of those windows that -- well, let's see. No, it was -- I believe it was the second-floor window on the kind of right side of the house as you're looking at the house.

- Q. Can you describe what that man looked like?

 A. Yes.
- So, I mean, from a distance, he had dark
 hair. He was wearing a hoodie, but I could see
 kind of mid-length dark hair up front, and some,
 like, light brown skin.

I -- I asked him, when I had made a 911 call, to describe himself, because that's what I was being asked to do.

And then this person described himself as his being of, as he put it, he said he was of Chinese -- he was Chinese, and 27 years old.

- Q. Okay.
- A. So...

- 22 Q. You mentioned calling 911.
- Did you call 911 in response to this man yelling for help?
- 25 A. I did, yes.

- 1 | Q. Okay. Was that on your cell phone?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. Did you actually talk to a 911 operator that
- 4 day --
- 5 A. I did.
- 6 Q. -- or to a dispatcher? Okay.
- 7 A. Yes.
- 8 Q. All right. And did you tell 911 what you
- 9 observed?
- 10 A. I did.
- 11 Q. Okay.
- 12 A. I said simply I heard a man who was -- who
- 13 seemed in distress, and was -- who was yelling
- 14 | frantically that, Please help, please help,
- 15 someone was trying to kill him.
- 16 \ Q. The time you were interacting with the man in
- 17 | the window, could you see anybody else in the
- 18 house with him or in the window with him?
- 19 A. I could not.
- 20 Q. Okay. At that time, did you see anyone else
- 21 outside of his house, like, in the vicinity of
- 22 the yard, that kind of thing?
- 23 A. I did not see anyone else who I might have
- 24 thought to be a resident of that house outside of
- 25 the house.

There was a woman in a car, who did not live there, who also had heard this man's voice who had pulled into the driveway.

That was the only other person that I saw on the property at that moment.

- Q. Did you stay to wait for the police?
- 7 A. I did.

- Q. Okay. Did you see anyone else come out of the house while you were waiting for police?
- A. While I was waiting for police, yes.

A white male came out of the house and walked down the driveway toward the car, that the woman who had been parked in -- the woman I mentioned previously.

And the person approached, was approaching that car slowly, and making a -- a gesture, putting his finger up to his mouth, as if to say, shush or be, you know, quiet or be calm, but the -- the woman started backing out and then was driving away.

- Q. Okay. Did you talk to that woman at all before she left the scene?
- 23 A. Before she left the scene?

No, I did not have any more conversation with her.

Q. Okay. At some point did you talk to her about how you had called the police?

A. Yes.

So I -- I had suggested that she -- I think she asked me, you know, if I had a sense of what was going on.

But she had clearly sensed that something was not -- not quite right or not seeming right.

And I suggested that she stay and at -- at that point she was parked in a driveway; and I suggested she stay, because she was in a car and I did not have a car.

And at that moment, my son, who's in college in North Carolina, happened to call me at the time, and so I took that call and at that point I kind of walked down the sidewalk a bit away from the -- the driveway, but that was the extent of the conversation I had with the woman in the car.

- Q. Okay. Could you -- did you notice anything else about that white male when he was approaching the woman in the car, making a shushing sound?
- A. He was wearing, I believe, a white T-shirt, and maybe some, like, light gray shorts,

- something along those lines, just very casual dress --
 - Q. Okay.

A. -- dark hair.

And it was when -- when I saw him walking toward the car with the woman in it and making that shushing gesture, he was walking slowly, but it -- it just seemed -- it seemed unclear or a bit confusing what his intention was; and not meaning to assume anything bad or good about that, just -- it just seemed a little -- it didn't seem like -- it didn't seem like a -- kind of a usual interaction that he was trying to make with the woman.

- Q. Did you notice whether he was holding anything at that point in his hands?
- A. I did -- yeah, I did not notice if he was holding anything at that point.

He -- he was doing the shushing gesture with one hand.

I believe the other hand was, like,

(indiscernible) at his side or behind his back,

but I did not -- I can't say that I -- I could

not see if there was anything in his hand.

Q. Okay. As the woman leaves, does this man

have any interaction with you at that point?

A. Yes.

Once the woman leaves, he then sees me a bit down the sidewalk from the driveway and I'm on the phone with my son at that point.

And then he started to head toward me, and when I sensed that, I walked -- I turned and walked up the sidewalk up the circle a little ways; and then he stopped and went back toward the house, and I just stayed in my new position there.

- Q. Could you see where he went once he went back towards the house?
- A. Back down the driveway and kind of to
 the -- that side of the house that the
 driveway -- you know, the driveway was on the
 right side of the house as you were facing the
 house, and then he was behind trees and I
 couldn't really see much more than that.
- Q. All right. So you lost sight of him at that point?
- 22 A. I did.

- Q. Did police officers arrive in response to your 911 call?
- 25 A. Yes.

- 1 Q. Did you --
- 2 A. One officer arrived -- I'm sorry,
- 3 O. No.
- So did -- how many officers did you see arrive at first?
- 6 A. At first was one officer --
- 7 Q. Okay.

- A. -- who parked the car near the entrance to
 Diamond Middle School, on that part of the
 rotary, and then walked over, crossed over
- 11 Hancock Street to the property.
- And -- yeah, that was -- that was the first officer who came.
- Q. Okay. Did you see where that first officer went after crossing onto the property?
 - A. Down the driveway, but then, again, from where I was, I lost sight after the officer went behind the trees.
- I -- it -- there was a sense that maybe it
 was kind of to the side of the house or behind
 the house, similar to the -- the man I was
 describing before.
- Q. Did you see that officer come back out from the property pretty quickly after that?
- 25 A. I don't know if it was quickly, but it wasn't

And that officer did come back to the car and got -- if I'm recalling correctly, got a firearm that had bright orange kind of pieces to it.

It sort of had the look of a gun that did not have live ammunition, and I just maybe wonder if that was, like, a rubber bullet type of qun or something like that.

- Q. Okay. Was the whole gun orange or just part of it?
- Just part of it.
- 13 Q. Okay. And was it, like, a long gun, like a 14 rifle, or was it smaller, like a handgun?
 - Yeah, rifle -- more, like, rifle-style.
- 16 Okay. Where did he go once he got that --Q. 17 that longer -- that gun out of the car?
- 18 Then he headed back down the driveway to the property to the same area, I presume, the area
- 20 that I couldn't see.

21 At that point, also, you know, a couple of 22 other officers had arrived and kind of joined 23 back there as well.

Q. All right. You saw the other officers go back towards the house as well?

- 1 A. Yes.
- Q. Could you see, was it -- how many officers
- 3 was that, that second bunch of officers?
- 4 A. So two arrived after the first one, so three
- 5 total.
- 6 Q. Okay. Could you see whether the two new
- 7 officers were carrying any kind of weapon?
- 8 A. I believe that they -- I believe one was
- 9 carrying a similar rifle style as the first
- 10 officer I described.
- 11 Q. Okay. Could you hear anything once the
- 12 officers were back by the house?
- 13 A. Yes.
- I mean, not at first, but at some point
- 15 voices got louder, and just here and there, it
- 16 was a bit louder for a bit and then quiet for a
- 17 bit, and then louder again and some commotion and
- 18 then some quiet.
- 19 And so it -- I couldn't make out words,
- 20 but the occasional word or two just left me with
- 21 an impression that they were trying to engage a
- 22 man to come with them.
- 23 That's the best sense that I had.
- 24 Q. You said you could hear voices.
- 25 Was it more than one person whose voice

- 1 you could make out?
- 2 A. Yeah. It felt like it was -- it was voices
- 3 between the officer and the man.
- 4 Q. Okay.

- 5 A. In other words, it sounded like -- there was
- 6 no, like, clear pattern to it.
 - There was a man, the man was getting louder first, and then the officers were trying to respond to that.
- And then after some quiet, the officers
 would try to say something again and then the
 man's voice would come.
 - That was the best sense that I had. I really couldn't make out the details of what was being said.
- Q. Did you tell anything about the tone of voice of the man when you could hear his voice?
 - A. It sounded -- it sounded, I don't know, the word that jumps to mind is kind of defensive.
 - Q. Okay.
- 21 A. And a sense of -- a sense of concern about
- 22 being trapped.
- 23 Q. Okay. So some tones of agitation?
- 24 A. Yes, yes. That would be fair to say,
- 25 agitation.

- Q. Could you hear any of the words that the man was saying at that point?
 - A. I could not.

Q. All right. So you're -- you're listening to this.

What do you see happen next?

- A. Then after this goes on for a bit, all of a sudden the man is running down his driveway into the street of the rotary and then across the kind of grassy tree area of the rotary and onto the other side on the -- the other side of that center part of the rotary in the road and on that -- while he was running over there, he -- he was running at a -- kind of a sprint, and had tripped maybe two or three times on his way and then the -- the three officers were kind of following suit themselves.
- Q. The man that you saw running, did you recognize him from earlier that afternoon?
- A. It was the same man.
- Q. Okay. This is the same man that was, you know, had the shushing sign who had come out of the house?
- 24 A. Correct.
- 25 Q. Okay. Were the officers running in pursuit

of him, or walking, or how were they moving?

A. At first they were jogging -- I would say more like jogging after him.

And when it was -- I think when it was clear that he was tripping in his sprint, the man, they were kind of a mix of jogging and walking to just kind of keep up.

- Q. Could you hear any of those officers saying anything while they were pursuing this man?
- 10 A. I don't recall specific words being said.

At that point it might have been -- here,
I'm a little fuzzy, but I feel like there was a
sense of, you know, please, to hold on, something
along those lines.

- Q. Okay. Did you hear any sounds that sounded like something besides the voices?
- A. Well, yeah.

So after -- after the man had tripped into the road and had -- had fallen onto his back and he tried to get up, the -- that was the first round of what I believe were kind of rubber bullets, and -- to just try to -- to have the man kind of dismissed, and at the same -- and after that round of bullets, and it was just a quick round, and then the officers said, Drop the

- 1 knife, very -- they were -- they said it very
- 2 | clearly, loudly, and -- and they repeated it a
- 3 second time, and then they paused --
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. -- to see -- between bullets if what they
- 6 said would effect the change.
- 7 Q. Okay. So while this man is running before he
- 8 has fallen to the ground, did you hear any of
- 9 those shot-like sounds before he falls?
- 10 A. Before he fell to the ground, um, I believe
- 11 that -- I believe that, yes, that the round that
- 12 was fired was either before he fell to the ground
- or -- no, no, it was -- yes, as he got to the
- 14 other side, that's when the round of bullets
- 15 happened and kind of had -- and sort of had the
- 16 man on the ground.
- 17 Q. Okay. Could you hear the man saying anything
- 18 | while he was running?
- 19 A. While he was running. I don't recall
- 20 anything specific. There might have been a --
- 21 kind of a noise, but I'm a little fuzzy on that.
- 22 Q. Okay. So the man runs, at some point he
- 23 falls. About where in the rotary is he once he
- 24 is on the ground?
- 25 A. So he is roughly -- I mean, where in the

1 rotary.

So he's in the road of the rotary, and it's probably -- like, it's coming out of 98

Hancock, that driveway, if that just -- if we call that twelve o'clock, I would say the man was at about five o'clock at that place in the rotary in the road.

- Q. Okay. You heard the officer saying, Drop the knife.
- Was it more than one officer who was saying, Drop the knife, or just one particular person?
- A. It sounded like two of the officers were saying that.
- Q. Okay. Could you see the man on the ground
- holding anything in his hands at that time?
- 17 A. Yes. At that -- I could see him holding a knife.
- 19 Q. All right. Prior to him being down on the
- ground, had you seen that knife in his hands
- 21 before, like while he was running from behind the
- 22 house?
- 23 A. When he was running, it was hard for me to
- tell if he had had that in his hand while
- 25 running.

- But right when he was on the ground, it 1 2 was very clear because it was in his right hand. 3 0. Okay. So from where I was positioned, him running 4 5 in front of me, if he had it in his right hand, I 6 wouldn't have had great vision on that; but when 7 he was on the ground and on his back, his right 8 hand was facing me and I saw that pretty 9 immediately after he was on the ground, so -- in 10 other words, it didn't -- I didn't have a sense 11 if there was something that he had pulled out 12 (inaudible) after that he was on the ground. 13 Q. Can you describe what you noticed about that 14 knife? 15 Yeah. It was -- I would say it was a 16 big-bladed knife. 17 It (inaudible) was a thick blade. 18 looked like it was maybe six- to nine-inches 19 long, and a -- and a -- and fairly wide. 20 Q. Okay. How was he holding it while he was 21 down on the ground after falling? 22 So he had -- his right hand was kind of Α. 23 around the handle.
- You're showing us your hand.

Like, kind of gripping the handle?

- 1 A. Yeah.
- 2 So it's -- kind of gripping the handle
- 3 with the blade facing down from his pinky, if
- 4 that makes sense.
- Q. Okay. Did you have any sense of how hard he
- 6 was holding on to that knife?
- 7 You looked like you were kind of clenching
- 8 your fist.

- A. Yeah. He was -- he had a firm hold on it.
- 10 Q. Okay. Once he was down on the ground --
- 11 A. (Inaudible.)
- 12 Q. -- where did the police officers who were
- 13 chasing him, where did they go?
- 14 A. Once he was down on the ground, they kind of
- 15 held position to see what he would do.
- 16 Q. Okay. Where were they in relationship to
- 17 him? Like, are they in front of him, to the side
- 18 of him, behind him?
- 19 A. At this point, you know, they were in -- in
- 20 the rotary in the road also, more like at six
- 21 o'clock from the Hancock driveway position being
- 22 noon.
- 23 And they were at this point, I would say,
- 24 facing the man, because the man had fallen on his
- 25 back and his -- his feet were pointing toward

- 1 where the three officers had lined up.
- Q. Okay. Could you hear anybody talking once the man was on the ground?

You said you heard, Drop the knife.

Could you hear anything else?

- A. Drop the knife was -- that's what I heard, and they -- that's what they -- that's what they were repeating, was, Drop the knife; drop the knife.
- 10 | Q. Did the ~-

- 11 A. There wasn't more -- there wasn't more kind
- 12 of, like, dialogue around that or other types of
- phrases to try to encourage the man to stop what
- 14 he was doing.
- 15 Q. Okay. That's what you were hearing, you were
- 16 hearing, Drop the knife; drop the knife?
- 17 | A. Yes.
- 18 Q. Could you hear the man saying something back
- 19 to the officers?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 | Q. And what do you remember him saying?
- 22 A. A couple things that I remember were, Leave
- 23 me alone -- and, forgive the language, but, I'm
- 24 | fucking going to kill you.
- 25 Q. Okay. While he is on the ground, did you

- notice the man trying to move in any way; and, if so, can you describe what you saw?
- 3 A. Yeah. It felt like he was -- he was on his
- 4 back and kind of moving backwards, a little bit
- 5 like a crab, right, kind of between his
- 6 shoulder -- his elbows and his -- his feet and
- 7 legs was just kind of like shuffling back.
- 8 Q. Okay. Did he --
- 9 A. Away from the officers.
- 10 Q. Did you ever see him moving in another
- 11 direction besides backwards?
- 12 A. Yes.
- So at one point, you know, when they -
 there was another -- let's see.
- 15 At one point the man did get up and
- 16 started walking assertively toward the
- 17 officers -- it felt like kind of a march for
- 18 them -- and at that point had a knife kind of up
- 19 here, I don't know if you can see me, but --
- 20 Q. You have --
- 21 A. -- the knife was positioned up here as he did
- 22 that kind of assertive march-like walk towards
- 23 them, and that was kind of a brisker -- had a
- 24 brisker feel to it.
- 25 Q. You had had your right arm lifted up, you had

your -- you sort of had your fist, like, your hand's raised.

Can you tell us, is that how the man was holding -- holding a knife in that hand?

- A. Yeah. So I don't know if you can see, this is a pen.
- Q. Yeah.

A. And if this pen were the knife, this is how he was holding it and as he was walking, it was -- it was in this position.

THE COURT: Just for the record, he's describing basically the knife protruding down, sort of the hilt -- or the top of the hilt, would be by his thumb, and the blade would be by the bottom or the palm -- by the pinky side of his hand.

THE WITNESS: Correct.

BY MS. GEMMILL:

- Q. So while he was walking like that, does that mean the blade was pointed towards the police officers or away from the police officers?
- A. Toward the police officers.
- Q. Did you see whether there was anything that this man was reacting to that made him stand up?

 Like, how did it come to be that he was

1 standing?

- A. I wasn't entirely sure there was -- there was a bit of -- there was a bit of commotion.
- I -- I didn't have a great vantage point to it, but I had a feeling that one of the officers, kind of standing in the back of the three of them, might have, like, tripped and -- and kind of was partially on the ground, and -- but I don't know if that's what the man was reacting to.
- Q. Did you see the officer partially on the ground?

Like, why did you say that you had a feeling about it?

A. Well, I didn't have a great vantage point. I just sensed some different kind of motion that was happening with that officer compared to their standing position of three, walking slowly, maintaining a position, that was just a little difference.

And -- and through the -- trying to look through the center of the rotary, it looked like that officer got shorter for some reason.

I don't know if it was because the officer was bending over or had tripped or something, but

- that was just -- that was the first change in the position of any of the officers in that whole period in the rotary.
 - Q. Before the man -- was that the only time the man got to his feet that you saw?
 - A. In that -- yes, in that sequence, that was -- that was the time.

I think maybe one other time when he had first sprinted across the rotary and tripped, I think he was kind of in between trying to stand up, but then falling down, then trying to stand up and run, and I think the first round of rubber bullets hit him when he was down.

But, other than that, when he was on his back in that mode and kind of shuffling backward, that was the first time that he stood up.

- Q. Okay. About how far away from these three police officers was the man when he first stood up, if you could estimate?
- A. My best estimate would be -- I would say it was, like, around three people lengths, so maybe about 15 feet.
- 23 Q. Okay.

A. Maybe 15 to 20 feet, somewhere in there at most.

Q. What happened while the man was -- was walking, or marching, as you described it?

A. Yeah.

So at that point, there was a larger burst of rounds from the -- those two rifles, and, like, noticeably larger, and then --

Q. What do you mean "larger?"

Is that, like, a reflection of sound or a number of shots?

Can you explain that?

A. I think a bit of both, you know.

I mean, the first two -- the first round that I heard was just sort of a quick, short burst; and this one was a -- it was longer, but not prolonged.

It was just longer than that -- the previous one, and I think, because it was longer, it just sounded louder, that's my guess, and then after that, that -- then the man fell down.

- Q. All right. And at that point, did -- did you see whether the man got up again after that last round of shots?
- 23 A. No.

When the man fell down that time, he was more motionless and quiet, and that's when one of

the officers, when they sensed that, went over and kneeled down next to him and checked him out, and then very quickly performed CER -- CPR.

And I think an ambulance was called, if it wasn't already there. I'm not sure about that.

- Q. Did you see what happened to the knife when the man fell down that last time?
- A. I don't recall that with certainty.
- 9 Q. Okay.

- Q. Okay.
- 20 A. And so I can't say for sure where the knife was, but.

attacking kind of position either way.

- Q. Do you have a sense of how close the man was to the police officers when you heard that last round of shots?
- 25 A. Maybe about -- maybe about 10 feet --

- 1 Q. Okay. Was he still --
- 2 A. -- is the best guess.
- Q. Was he still moving at the time you heard the
- 4 shots?

- A. Yes, yes. He was in -- he was in his full kind of marching sort of stride.
- 7 Q. You described it as an assertive stride.
 - Did you have a sense of how quickly he was moving, how quickly he was marching?
- 10 A. Faster than a neighborhood walk and slower than a distance run.
- Q. Mr. Mattoon, at any point during this incident while you were observing these events,
- did you document this in any way with your cell
- 15 phone?
- 16 A. Yeah, I did take one picture.
- Q. Okay. Do you remember what you took a picture of, like, what was going on at the time
- 19 you took a photograph?
- 20 A. Yeah.
- So that picture was -- that picture was at the moment when the man was on the ground on his back and the officers were in their formation of three and it was -- but it was before the man had sit up and tried marching toward them.

- Q. Okay. Were you able to provide that
 photograph to the -- to investigators when you
 were interviewed?
 - A. I did. I -- I went to the Lexington police office later that day, because on the news that evening they were asking for any witnesses to come -- to come in, so when I spoke with him, that had come up, so I shared it with him then.

MS. GEMMILL: Your Honor, may I have just one moment?

Was there any strategy that you observed 21 about when the officers used the bean bag 22 weapons, any pattern that you observed? 23 If there had been a pattern, I would say it 24 was -- it was being used at times when they were

trying to persuade the man to -- to stop what he

- 2 Q. And when you say "stop what he was doing,"
- 3 what was he doing that they were trying to stop?
- 4 A. Well, in the first round, they were
- 5 trying -- my sense is they were trying to stop
- 6 him from running away from some kind of a
- 7 confrontation or a conversation about what had
- 8 been happening at the house and that perhaps
- 9 the -- perhaps there was a knife involved, but
- 10 whether a knife was involved or not at that
- 11 moment was -- I had the sense it was someone that
- 12 may have been fleeing a scene of questioning, and
- 13 so they were trying to stop him from doing that.
- But then in another round, it was a
- 15 different situation where there was clearly a
- 16 knife out and they were trying to persuade the
- 17 man to drop the knife.
- 18 Q. Did you give a statement to the Lexington

- When the Lexington police interviewed you after this, they video recorded that interview, right?

- 19 A. Yes, sorry, yes.
- 20 \ Q. Do you recall hearing the police officers say
- any other words or phrases to the man?
- 22 A. Nothing that sticks in my memory.
- 23 O. Was there any speaking or -- any speaking you
- 24 could hear that you could tell people were
- 25 talking, but you couldn't make out the words they

- 2 A. It's been too long. I don't remember that,
- 3 anything like that. Sorry.
- 4 Q. What was the tone of voice for the police
- officer you could hear saying, Stay down?

- 8 A. (No audible response.)
- 9 Q. Sorry, you're nodding. You need to say yes

- 11 A. Yes -- yes.
- 12 Q. How was -- how was their volume?
- Was this a loud command, kind of quiet,
- 14 | was it (inaudible)?
- 15 A. It was -- it was loud, yes.
- 16 Q. Every one of the commands heard, was every
- 17 | command loud?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. Did you hear any different tones of voice
- 20 being used by the police officers?

- long you were there watching; is that fair?

 - A. I didn't look behind me as I was going.

There were guns out. I wanted to get out of there pretty -- pretty quickly, yeah.

- Q. Did you hear anything?
- A. Yes.

So I -- I exited the rotary, I took a right-hand turn, and I -- when I -- there was a hill that I needed to get over in order to get back to the path I was intending on going, and while I was at the very beginning of that hill, I remember hearing gunshots.

Q. Okay.

Can you tell us how loud the sound that you thought was gunshots, how loud was that sound?

- A. It was -- it was fairly loud, but I was also -- I mean, a minute later I was probably a couple tenths of a mile away at that point, so.
- Q. You said "a minute later."

Do you know exactly how much time had gone by from the time you left the rotary to the time you first heard the sound?

- 1 A. Yeah.
- 2 It was a minute and 15 seconds from the
- 3 time my GPS started up again after that 47 second
- 4 period block to when I got to the beginning of
- 5 that hill that I mentioned that I turned onto on
- 6 the next road.
- 7 Q. Okay. So you know how long that was by
- 8 (inaudible) your data, what time you reached that
- 9 hill; is that correct?
- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 Q. It had been a minute and 15 seconds that had
- 12 passed.

- I -- I'm highly confident it's a minute
- and 15 seconds; we can be 100 percent certain by
- 16 checking the data on Strava.

- 18 A. I'm very confident it was a minute and 15
