2 (Court called to order.)

3 (2:20 p.m.)

4 MS. KAZAROSIAN: ...yeah. You probably
5 see a notice that I just started doing that. I'm
6 sorry about that.

7 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

8 And anything else, Attorney Spiros?

9 MS. SPIROS: Judge, I just wanted to
10 check in on whether the Court had an update
11 related to construction at the courthouse, if we
12 were all set to go and...

13 THE COURT: Well, I guess Attorney -- Ms.
14 Clerk Casey, we have an update that it might not
15 be the cleanest room in the -- in the
16 Commonwealth, but I think the -- the construction
17 on the windows is going to be complete, correct?

18 THE CLERK: Yes.

19 So my -- my understanding was it might
20 not be the prettiest, but it will be clean.

21 THE COURT: Okay. That's what I was
22 told.

23 THE CLERK: The ceiling tiles are going
24 to be replaced in June and the carpet is going to
25 be replaced in June.

1 But they will do, you know, a nice job on
2 cleaning everything up.

3 THE COURT: Okay.

4 THE CLERK: We won't have to dust off our
5 seats or anything like that. Okay.

6 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

7 MS. KAZAROSIAN: But we won't ceiling
8 tiles falling on our head like just happened in
9 Lawrence, right?

10 THE CLERK: No. No.

11 THE COURT: All right. So -- so -- and
12 if anything changes, I will let everybody know.

13 THE CLERK: Yes.

14 THE COURT: Okay.

15 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Are we still planning on
16 having the view the first day?

17 I wasn't sure if that was still...

18 THE COURT: I think it's the second.

19 Correct, Attorney Spiros?

20 MS. SPIROS: The second day.

21 THE COURT: Yeah. That will be --

22 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Oh, okay.

23 THE COURT: -- that Tuesday.

24 MS. KAZAROSIAN: And that's in the
25 morning?

1 MS. SPIROS: Yes.

2 THE COURT: Attorney Spiros, did you --

3 MS. SPIROS: Yeah, I think -- I think
4 that we had intended to do that in the morning.

5 But we can always readdress that on the
6 2nd if we want to talk more about timing.

7 THE COURT: Okay. And so we still plan
8 on three, maybe four days?

9 MS. SPIROS: That's the hope, yes.

10 THE COURT: Okay. All right.

11 And I have the -- the discovery notices,
12 Clerk Casey, here.

13 So what I will plan on doing is I'll
14 bring my copies to the -- to the inquest.

15 THE CLERK: Okay.

16 THE COURT: Those will all then become
17 the marked official records, okay?

18 THE CLERK: Sounds good.

19 THE COURT: Does anybody have a problem
20 with that?

21 I haven't touched -- I haven't marked
22 anything, so those would be the clean copies.

23 MS. SPIROS: That sounds perfect.

24 MS. KAZAROSIAN: That sounds fine.

25 Um, we can bring our laptops in and use

1 laptops, right?

2 THE COURT: Yeah. Yeah, sure.

3 MS. KAZAROSIAN: I'm not sure I will be
4 able to carry all that stuff.

5 THE COURT: Okay. Sure.

6 If -- if the WiFi is in I go like it is
7 at this brand-new building in Lowell, bring your
8 own hotspot because --

9 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Yeah.

10 THE CLERK: -- there is no WiFi.

11 THE COURT: Okay. So...

12 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Oh, okay. I don't think
13 it -- yeah, or I can just download everything to
14 my laptop, because I don't know how to use a
15 hotspot.

16 THE COURT: Okay. Neither do I. I just
17 heard that someplace.

18 MS. KAZAROSIAN: It sounded good.

19 (Inaudible.)

20 MS. SPIROS: And, I guess, one last
21 question.

22 I don't think that this is part of the
23 procedure but just, in trying to be prepared, you
24 are not expecting summations at the end from the
25 parties or anything like that?

1 THE COURT: I don't expect it, but I'll
2 leave it -- if anybody wants to make an argument
3 or if someone wanted -- if one of the parties
4 wanted to -- or the interested people wanted to
5 give a written summation on any issue that they
6 want to, I'll take. All right.

7 But it's -- it's -- I don't -- I don't
8 necessarily need it.

9 And the -- I think we talked briefly
10 about it last time; but it makes sense, I think
11 even for the attorneys -- Attorney Anderson and
12 Attorney Kazarosian if we -- and it would help
13 me -- if we knew the -- the names of the
14 witnesses on the days that we -- that we can get
15 it.

16 Just so that we can kind of keep it
17 rolling, and we have some -- and I have some idea
18 of -- of where, you know, the -- the -- the time
19 frame or the -- as we go through this so that
20 we -- and like I said, I'd rather have a couple
21 extra at the end and go right until 4:00 then
22 have to stop at 3:00 because...

23 MS. SPIROS: Understood.

24 THE COURT: Okay. And towards that end,
25 when do you think you might have that, Attorney

1 Spiros?

2 MS. SPIROS: I had a working list for the
3 last date, so it's just a matter of reviewing
4 that.

5 THE COURT: Sure. Sure.

6 MS. SPIROS: I am assuming I can get that
7 to the Court by the 15th.

8 THE COURT: Oh, yeah. That's -- that's
9 plenty of time.

10 MS. SPIROS: Okay.

11 THE COURT: Okay. And, as far as
12 displaying any exhibits, I don't know what they
13 have over there, and I don't -- and -- but, I
14 mean, I am going to have everything.

15 So does anybody need a laptop -- does
16 anybody have a laptop if they want to show a
17 witness that's something that's not in writing,
18 like, or in a document?

19 MS. SPIROS: I anticipate that, with the
20 Court's permission, we would try to set up an
21 overhead projector --

22 THE COURT: Okay.

23 MS. SPIROS: -- a laptop.

24 That's been a request that I have in for
25 our IT people.

1 THE COURT: Okay. Great.

2 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Then we will be able to
3 see the photos on there?

4 THE COURT: Yeah.

5 MS. KAZAROSIAN: You will pull up the
6 photos.

7 THE COURT: Yeah.

8 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Okay.

9 THE COURT: All right. And the DA's
10 Office has access to one that we might be able to
11 use for a few days?

12 MS. SPIROS: Yes, I believe we -- and I
13 think probably it makes the most sense if your
14 Honor is bringing the official records that we
15 will -- we would display the official version.

16 THE COURT: Okay. Yep. Perfect.

17 MS. SPIROS: All right. We'll work on
18 that here.

19 And if we could get in the Friday before
20 just to set that up, if it's possible, Madam
21 Clerk.

22 We can work that out.

23 THE CLERK: Yep.

24 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Anything
25 else we should discuss?

1 MR. ANDERSON: I just had a quick
2 question about the protective order because there
3 are a number of officers, certain deputies, like,
4 who I sat in the interviews with.

5 I'm assuming I am allowed to give them
6 those interviews to read to prepare, but I
7 don't know if I can actually give them copies to
8 keep?

9 I don't know what the -- how that
10 protective order works with that.

11 THE COURT: I mean, they are -- they are
12 the witness's own statements, correct?

13 MR. ANDERSON: Correct.

14 THE COURT: I mean, I -- I don't think
15 they should get it a copy of it so -- so that
16 copy then leaves your custody.

17 But it's -- I have no problem with you
18 having them review their witness statements
19 before they take the stand or at any point, as
20 long as you retain -- you know, don't give a copy
21 and you keep -- you keep physical custody of it.

22 MR. ANDERSON: And that was I didn't want
23 Witness A to get it and then --

24 THE COURT: And then not -- yeah.

25 MR. ANDERSON: -- Witness B ends up with

1 the statement then.

2 THE COURT: Yeah.

3 MR. ANDERSON: Okay.

4 THE COURT: Yeah. And I think that's
5 just for the spirit of the protective order, as
6 long as we keep everything kind of encapsulated
7 until such time as that -- it -- the protective
8 order doesn't exist.

9 MR. ANDERSON: Oh, okay.

10 MS. KAZAROSIAN: And -- and I had a quick
11 question.

12 So are the witnesses going to be in the
13 room when everyone else is testifying? Okay.

14 THE COURT: No. No. I -- I want a
15 sequest -- I want everybody outside.

16 The only people allowed in the room
17 are the interested parties as well as the
18 witness.

19 And I also let the witnesses know after
20 they testify they are not to discuss their
21 testimony with anybody else.

22 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Okay. Makes sense.

23 THE COURT: Okay.

24 And so -- and so if anything else does
25 come up between now and, say, that Friday, just

1 reach out to Clerk Casey and so -- just so that
2 at nine o'clock we can get -- get going right on
3 the -- because we are -- we are in somebody
4 else's building, and I don't want to overstay our
5 welcome.

6 Not that I'm going to rush anybody but
7 it's -- you know, it is being used for something
8 else as well so -- all right?

9 MS. SPIROS: Understood.

10 THE COURT: Okay.

11 THE CLERK: And, your Honor, just for
12 clarity of the record, since I started
13 recording --

14 THE COURT: Oh, sure.

15 THE CLERK: -- there were a few things
16 that I believe were discussed before I started
17 recording.

18 THE COURT: Sure.

19 THE CLERK: One, that you do want to hear
20 from the medical -- the medical examiner,
21 correct?

22 THE COURT: Yep. Yes.

23 THE CLERK: Two, that notices of
24 discovery are going to be marked; the first

23 MS. KAZAROSIAN: Thank you, Madam Clerk.

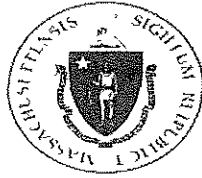
