

Sayed Faisal was transported via EMS to Massachusetts General Hospital on January 4, 2023. EMS had been unable to secure an airway on route and he arrived unresponsive in an extremis, but still with a palpable pulse. Doctors lost his pulse in the trauma bay where various life saving measures were undertaken including cardiac massage. Ultimately the decision was made to transfer him directly to the operating room where the Trauma Surgery team discovered a significant injury to the right side of his liver and struggled to control the bleeding. The surgery had to be paused multiple times to address heart issues as he entered ventricular fibrillation.

The doctors made note of additional gunshot wounds to the thigh, neck, chest, and arm. At 3:05pm time of death was called, which was about an hour after he entered the operating room. The doctors concluded the extent of his injuries and inability to gain cardiac activity as the basis for calling time of death. The medical records also acknowledge the presence of a bullet as well as fragments still within the body, specifically in the right upper quadrant and multiple lacerations to his neck and wrists.
