On Monday, November 12, 2012 I was called by C-Troop Headquarters and requested to respond to 52 Meadow Brook Rd in Marlborough for a police involved shooting. Unit Supervisor Sgt. Timothy MacDougall was immediately notified of the situation, and he stated that he was in route to the residence.

A short time later I arrived on scene and met with the Marlborough Detectives and case officer Trooper Michael Banks #2948. At this time they stated that the suspect was fatally wounded and was located in the bedroom to the left at the top of the stairs on the second floor. The Marlborough Detectives explained what had occurred from the information they were given. I walked through the scene after placing the properly protective equipment on. Short, after walking the scene I asked Trooper Banks if he wanted the Leica system brought to the scene to diagram the interior of the residence. Trooper Banks requested that the Leica be used to diagram the scene. I immediately contacted DLt. Fabry and requested that the Leica system be brought to the scene. Trooper Robert Dateo #2618 and Trooper Robert Quigley #2777 were both requested to the scene to use the Leica system.

At this time I began properly documenting the scene with digital images and video. I started with taking digital images. When I got to the second floor landing that is located in between the bedrooms I observed two spent shell casing. The first spent shell casing was located on the landing and it was marked placard #1. The second spent shell casing was found on the rug near the entry way in the bedroom to the left and this was marked placard #2. From the entranceway I could see the suspect lying on the floor next to the bed. The white male was marked placard #3. A short distance away from the suspect's feet a red and brown stain that was found and

marked #4 Right next to the red and brown stain a one long black handled steel knife was found and marked placard #5 All this evidence was properly document with digital images and then video was taken

After the residence was properly documented Sgt McDougall and I made a hand drawn dragram of the scene. Once we completed the hand drawn dragram Troopers Dateo and Quigley began dragramming the scene using the Leica system. Once the Trooper Dateo and Quigley finished with the Leica system I collected the long black handled steel knife. I properly put the knife inside a knife collection box, and after it was placed into Trooper Robert Dateo assigned cruiser. Trooper Dateo transported the knife back to the Crime Scene Services Section – Sudbury lab where it was entered into the system and placed into my custody. On Monday, November 19, 2012 I began processing the long black handled steel knife for questioned latent fingerprints. The following item was submitted for analysis. Item 1-2, one long handled steel knife. Item 1-2 was visually observed, photographed, and processed using the appropriate and approved methods and
