PART II: Research, Teaching, and Clinical Contributions

Narrative Report:

My training in General Adult Psychiatry was completed at the University of Chicago Hospitals where I served as Chief Resident of the Inpatient Service during my fourth and final year of training. As Chief Resident I was responsible for the teaching and supervision of junior residents and medical students on the inpatient unit, working closely with nursing and administrative staff to identify and resolve conflict, and for fostering a collaborative working environment. Following my residency, I pursued a fellowship in student mental health at the University of Chicago Hospitals, where I provided care to the graduate and undergraduate students of the University of Chicago, served as a liaison to the University of Chicago administration, and educated University of Chicago community members about student mental health.

Following my training at the University of Chicago, I completed a fellowship in forensic psychiatry at the Harvard Medical School/Massachusetts General Hospital Forensic Psychiatry Fellowship. In addition to fulfilling the requirements of this ACGME-Accredited training program, I pursued extensive research and specialized training in the treatment of sex offenders.

I am presently working as the Medical Director of Bridgewater State Hospital (BSH) and serve as an Affiliate in Psychiatry at the University of Massachusetts Medical School. My responsibilities as Medical Director include functioning as the responsible health authority for medical and psychiatric care at Bridgewater State Hospital and ensuring that appropriate psychiatric care, medical care and allied professional services are provided to all patients at the hospital. In this role I lead interdisciplinary case conferences to determine the suitability of patients for discharge from the hospital, work with the Massachusetts Department of Health (DMH) in facilitating transfers from

Bridgewater State Hospital to DMH facilities and assist in developing treatment plans for the hospital's more complex patients. I work collaboratively with the Superintendent of BSH and the BSH Hospital Administrator in order to perform strategic planning, further the goals of the hospital, support security interests and maintain accreditation by The Joint Commission and American Correctional Association. With the assistance of hospital and departmental leadership I also help facilitate hospital-wide trainings to further staff development and was instrumental in leading an initiative by Governor Baker to reduce Seclusion and Restraint at BSH while implementing a trauma informed patient centered modality of care. Finally, I maintain clinical responsibilities at BSH including the evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment of patients who are either undergoing court-ordered forensic evaluations or are committed to the hospital. In addition, when indicated I submit affidavits, prepare treatment plans, and testify in court for those patients who need court-authorized antipsychotic treatment or electroconvulsive treatment.

My responsibilities as an Affiliate in Psychiatry at the University of Massachusetts Medical School include the supervision and training of Fellows in Forensic Psychiatry. This includes training the fellow in the appropriate psychopharmacologic and psychotherapeutic treatment of psychiatric patients at Bridgewater State Hospital. In addition, I supervise the fellow in preparing affidavits and testifying for the involuntary treatment of these patients when indicated. Finally, I provide informal and formal supervision on a variety of issues relevant to the practice of Forensic Psychiatry including forensic evaluations, forensic report writing, and landmark forensic cases.
