INTERVIEW OF OFFICER ERIK DRAUSCHKE

DET. BULMAN: Good afternoon, my name is Detective
Lieutenant Paul Bulman, Massachusetts State Police, Middlesex
District Attorney's office. It's Monday, June 18th 2018,
approximately 12:02 P.M. If everyone wouldn't mind, we could

just go around and identify themselves for the record.

- 6 LT. ABATE: Lieutenant Detective Richard Abate from the 7 Reading Police Department.
- 8 ATTY. PASCIUCCO: Attorney Peter Pasciucco. Last name is
 9 spelled 'P A S C I U C C O'. Here on behalf of
 10 Officer Erik Drauschke.
- OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Officer Erik Drauschke badge number 74
 of the Reading Police.
- DET. BULMAN: Erik, as I've spoken to you earlier, this is
 a criminal investigation being conducted by the Middlesex
 District Attorney's office. Lt. Abate is here in that capacity.
 He is in no way here an Internal Affairs capacity. Do you
- 18 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Yes, sir.

understand that?

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DET. BULMAN: Along those lines Erik, I'm going to advise you of your rights. I understand you have Attorney Pasciucco here, representing you. If at any time you don't understand a question and you want to take some time to take a break to confer with Attorney Pasciucco, let me know. We'll stop it. That said, you have the right to remain silent. Anything you say can

- 1 be used against you in court. You have the right to talk to a
- 2 lawyer for advice before we ask you any questions and to have
- 3 him with you during questioning. If you cannot afford a lawyer,
- 4 one will be appointed for you. If you decide to answer questions
- 5 | now, you still have the right to stop the questioning at any
- 6 time. Do you understand the rights I have read to you?
- 7 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Yes, sir.
- 8 **DET. BULMAN:** Erik, first off, could you just tell me on
- 9 the night in question, what your approximate height was?
- 10 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE**: I'm approximately 6 feet tall. I
- 11 believe I was probably approximately 250 pounds.
- 12 **DET. BULMAN:** Okay.
- 13 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** That's my best estimate.
- 14 **DET: BULMAN:** Now, one of the issues we had with our first
- 15 | interview was that and it's probably my fault. I didn't do a
- 16 good enough job of asking how you came to encounter Mr.
- 17 Greenough. Would you mind and for the record I'm going to
- 18 present to him a diagram of the gas station and the vehicle.
- 19 | Would you just be able in your own words describe to me what you
- 20 did when you exited the office-
- 21 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Okay.
- 22 **DET: BULMAN:** Of the gas station?
- 23 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Yes, sir. So, as I had mentioned, when
- 24 I came out of the office, that I had spoken with the gentleman I

had come to find out was Mr. Greenough's brother. And stating 1 that he was a tall, skinny, white male. And I exited the office, 2 following along the front of the building. So, if you were 3 4 looking out the front door, I went to the right, and then I took another right and went along by the side of the building. I 5 believe it's the south side of the building. As I went out 6 7 around to the south side of the building, looking for Mr. Greenough, I had then realized that there was a fence line, a 8 9 short fence line, that's in the back of the driveway area, or 10 junkyard area of the gas station property. I followed along the 11 backside of that fence line, towards where I'd seen the hummer, 12 and there were miscellaneous, as I had mentioned, obstructions 13 in the back of this fenced-in area. So, as I walked along, I'm 14 sure you could've seen my boots where I followed the path, and as I had seen Mr. Greenough through the window of the hummer and 15 16 called in that - I had seen him and my location. I then walked 17 directly towards the H2 hummer, and that's when I encountered 18 him, as I mentioned, opening the door, and as he- as I gave him 19 the commands, as I had mentioned earlier, and I started 20 retreating back towards the back of the hummer. He was standing 21 inside this door area - and as I believe some of the pictures have showed where his - where the blood was on the ground, was 22 where he had fallen to the ground that was in front of me, and 23 24 my back was towards this - this vehicle that you have here. I

- 1 believe we looked at the pictures there was a grey vehicle. So,
- 2 | the distance that he traveled was from when he got out of the
- 3 | vehicle, by that passenger door, to where I was, at the front of
- 4 this other vehicle.
- 5 **DET. BULMAN:** Okay, just for the record, the diagram I'm -
- 6 | we're using for this interview is a report created by Trooper
- 7 Arisetty, from the Massachusetts State Police Collision Analysis
- 8 Reconstruction Section. Erik, you mentioned the fence. Just for
- 9 | the record, so it's clear for people listening to this
- 10 | interview.
- 11 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Yes sir.
- 12 **DET. BULMAN:** There's actually two fence lines depicted in
- 13 this -
- 14 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Right.
- 15 DET. BULMAN: One is in the back of the building that
- 16 | almost delineates the property line -
- 17 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Correct.
- 18 **DET. BULMAN:** And the fence that you're talking about is a
- 19 | little there's another fence that is it has a break in it,
- 20 | but it's closer to Route 28 -
- 21 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Correct.
- 22 **DET. BULMAN:** And just for the record, so when you walked
- 23 out of the office, you came along the building, and then you
- 24 walked-

- 1 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: I was taking a left.
- 2 **DET. BULMAN:** You took a left.
- 3 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Heading south.
- 4 **DET. BULMAN:** Heading south, but you were on the opposite
- 5 | side of the fence that Route 28 is on -
- 6 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Correct.
- 7 **DET. BULMAN:** Correct?
- 8 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Correct.
- 9 **DET. BULMAN:** So, um -
- 10 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Between the two fence lines.
- 11 **DET. BULMAN:** So, you were walking between the two fence
- 12 | lines?
- 13 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Correct.
- 14 **DET. BULMAN:** And you were just kind of there was a lot
- 15 of as we mentioned debris and -
- 16 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Correct.
- 17 **DET. BULMAN:** Like, auto parts. You were just kind of
- 18 | making your way -
- 19 **OFC. DRAUSCHKE:** Correct.
- 20 **DET. BULMAN:** Mounds of ice -
- 21 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: And panning and looking for the -
- 22 **DET. BULMAN:** Okay.
- 23 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: For Mr. Greenough at that point, and
- 24 once I got close enough that I could through the window of him,

7 1 starting to lean over, that's when I went direct - called in my 2 location and went directly towards the -3 DET. BULMAN: Okay, and, at that point, you were looking -4 you first observed him was through the passenger side door window of the -5 6 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Front passenger side. 7 DET. BULMAN: Front passenger side door window. 8 OFC. DRAUSCHKE: Correct. 9 DET. BULMAN: Alright. That's it. I don't have anything 10 else? Do you? 11 LT. ABATE: Nope. 12 DET. BULMAN: Any other questions for us? 13 ATTY. PASCIUCCO: I don't. 14 DET. BULMAN: The time is now 12:08.
