

INTERVIEW OF SEAN WILSON

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT PAUL BULMAN

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Good evening. My
2 name is Detective Lieutenant Paul Bulman, Massachusetts
3 State Police, Middlesex District Attorney's Office. If
4 you wouldn't mind, would you please state your name for
5 me?

6 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. My name is Officer Sean
7 Wilson, S-e-a-n, W-i-l-s-o-n.

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What's your
9 badge number, Sean?

10 OFFICER WILSON: 66.

11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Sean, just so you
12 know, we're conducting a criminal investigation into
13 the incident that occurred tonight. You're being
14 digitally recorded. If you wouldn't mind, I'd just
15 like you to -- I'd like to ask a little background
16 questions on your career. And then I'm going to just
17 have you go chronically your perception of the events
18 as they transposed tonight.

19 OFFICER WILSON: Okay.

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Can you
21 just tell me how long you've been a police officer with
22 the town?

23 OFFICER WILSON: Almost 13 years.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Thirteen years

1 with the department?

2 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Did you have any
4 previous law enforcement experience in PD?

5 OFFICER WILSON: Not with the PD. I worked in
6 the brig in the Marine Corp.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: In the Marine
8 Corp.?

9 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: How many years
11 were you in the Marine Corp.?

12 OFFICER WILSON: Like 10 years.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Was that -- did
14 some of that time run concurrent with your 13 years
15 here or?

16 OFFICER WILSON: No.

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you did 10
18 years in the Marines and you got -- and 13 years in
19 here?

20 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And how many
22 years were you in the Marine Corp. in like a law
23 enforcement capacity?

24 OFFICER WILSON: Approximately eight years.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: If you wouldn't
2 mind, could you just start from the very start of your
3 shift when you reported for duty today and just kind of
4 walk me through what happened to the best of your
5 recollection.

6 OFFICER WILSON: You want me to start from my
7 start of my shift?

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah.

9 OFFICER WILSON: Okay. I was working overtime
10 shift today. I started at 0:8 this morning. It was
11 supposed to go to a 14 hour -- 18:00, 16:00. 4
12 o'clock. My bad.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what sector
14 were you assigned to? Patrol or --

15 OFFICER WILSON: I was sector 3 today.

16 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: You were sector
17 3?

18 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And who's your
20 superior officer on duty for today?

21 OFFICER WILSON: Lieutenant John McKenna.

22 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And was he the
23 shift commander or the OIC --

24 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. He was the OIC today.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: He was the OIC
2 for this day shift.

3 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

4 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Can you tell me
5 where you were when you first heard about the call at
6 this location?

7 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I was in the station
8 doing a report and it came over the radio for a
9 domestic situation at 1642 Main Street I believe.
10 1642, 1643.

11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And it was for a
12 domestic incident?

13 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. It was a past assault
14 and battery.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And did it
16 indicate like who was involved or anything like that or
17 was it just the address 1642?

18 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. It was just the
19 address.

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Are you familiar
21 with that address?

22 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. We -- in roll call this
23 morning, there was an incident there that happened last
24 night or some time yesterday on the shift where there

1 was supposedly probable cause to arrest for another
2 previous assault and battery incident.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Prior to today,
4 had you any dealings with that address or any of the
5 parties involved?

6 OFFICER WILSON: Yes, I have.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Can you tell me
8 when or approximately how many times?

9 OFFICER WILSON: I was at that address maybe
10 four or five years ago for an alarm and then Alan
11 Greenough I've had extensive dealings with him. I've
12 arrested him once I believe for possession of Class A.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: At least once?

14 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And that was a
16 possessory offense for heroin?

17 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Do you recall
19 how long ago that was?

20 OFFICER WILSON: That was the Stephanie Conway
21 situation down there at 352 Main Street. I'd say seven
22 years ago.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Seven years ago?

24 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Is that
2 the only time you've arrested him?

3 OFFICER WILSON: I believe so, yes.

4 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Have you had any
5 other occasion to deal with him in a, you know, drunk
6 and disorderly or --

7 OFFICER WILSON: I remember pulling him over
8 on I think it was Parker Street heading into Wakefield
9 off of Ash Street and I gave him a money fine for
10 defective equipment. He had -- Stephanie Conway was in
11 the vehicle with him and I think I gave him a money
12 fine for defective equipment.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Let me back up.
14 You stopped him in a motor vehicle?

15 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

16 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And he was the
17 operator?

18 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And this was
20 where?

21 OFFICER WILSON: On Ash Street and that was
22 after I arrested him, so that was my probably -- I've
23 dealt with him --

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: You don't have

1 to be exact. Approximate, how long ago was the motor
2 vehicle stop?

3 OFFICER WILSON: It was probably six years
4 ago.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And this
6 resulted in a money fine for defective equipment?

7 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Is it fair to
9 say he'd recognize you; do you think?

10 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: He would
12 recognize you?

13 OFFICER WILSON: I encountered him tonight and
14 tried to talk to him.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: All right.
16 We'll get to that. Aside from arresting him for the
17 Class A and stopping him for the defective equipment
18 which resulted in a money fine, do you think -- can you
19 recall any other interactions?

20 OFFICER WILSON: No, not that I can recall.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Getting
22 back to today, so you were at the police department and
23 you got the call. Were you the only one that responded
24 or were additional officers --

1 OFFICER WILSON: Three of us originally
2 responded. It was myself, Office Gooley, who was in
3 the station doing a report with me and Officer Mike
4 Lee.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And approximate
6 time again?

7 OFFICER WILSON: I believe this right at like
8 4:30. No. I was supposed to get off at 4:30 so it was
9 like right at like 3:30.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: 3:30. Okay.
11 And if you would just go over the officers again that
12 went there with you.

13 OFFICER WILSON: Gooley. It's G-o-o-l-e-y.
14 And then Mike Lee. L-e-e.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Do you remember
16 who was there, first?

17 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. Mike Lee was there
18 first and then Gooley. I was the third one that
19 arrived all within, you know 20, 30 seconds of each
20 other.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And when you got
22 -- when you first arrived, what are your recollection
23 of happened initially?

24 OFFICER WILSON: When we first arrived, we

1 knocked on the door and attempted to speak to whoever
2 was inside. As I was on my way to the call, dispatch
3 came over the radio and did the reporting party and
4 left the scene and they went down to the Lobster Claw
5 which is, you know, a couple of -- quarter of a mile
6 down on the street on the North Reading line.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Did dispatch
8 tell you anything else what you may encounter at the
9 scene?

10 OFFICER WILSON: They basically said it was a
11 past domestic incident and then they -- that was pretty
12 much it from my recollection right now.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So is it you or
14 Lee that knocks on the door?

15 OFFICER WILSON: Officer Lee.

16 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And where were
17 you when this happened?

18 OFFICER WILSON: I was like five feet behind
19 him.

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So you're
21 -- so bear with me because I haven't actually been to
22 the scene. I've been here all night. Is this the door
23 to the apartment or is this the door -- is this the
24 door of the common hallway of the apartment --

1 OFFICER WILSON: Yes, correct.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Not the door
3 from the office of the gas station --

4 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- that also
6 leads in -- okay.

7 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And this -- if
9 you're looking at the front of the building, the front
10 of the building being the Alpha side of the house and
11 if you were to go clockwise, the left hand side, would
12 be the Bravo side --

13 OFFICER WILSON: Bravo, Charlie, Delta.

14 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. What side
15 is this doorway on?

16 OFFICER WILSON: This is on the Alpha side
17 straight ahead.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: It's on the --
19 okay. So the door is on the Alpha side of the house.

20 OFFICER WILSON: Alpha is right in front of
21 you, correct.

22 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yes. The front.

23 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Is this

1 -- does this door lead to additional apartments in the
2 structure or is it just the one apartment?

3 OFFICER WILSON: From my understanding,
4 there's an apartment on the right hand side and then
5 there's an apartment on the left hand side. The door
6 that I wasn't able to open. It's a common hallway.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

8 OFFICER WILSON: Apartment on the right and
9 apartment on the left.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And to the best
11 of your knowledge, which apartment did the suspect
12 occupy?

13 OFFICER WILSON: He lived in the apartment on
14 the left.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: On the left
16 side.

17 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you knocked
19 on the door and did you get any response?

20 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. We got no response.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What did you
22 guys do then?

23 OFFICER WILSON: We continued knocking. I
24 yelled, you know, Reading Police, if you're in there,

1 come on out. We just want to talk to you. We want to
2 find out what's going on. And then I had walked around
3 the building so I went to the -- you know, the front of
4 the building which is right in front of you. I went to
5 the Delta side, checked all those windows and then --

6 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So this would be
7 the right hand side of the building?

8 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

9 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

10 OFFICER WILSON: And then I went around to the
11 back, the Charlie side, and attempted to look in the
12 windows to see if I could see anyone, but all the
13 shades and windows were shut and you couldn't see into
14 the house.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: No luck looking
16 in the windows on the Delta side?

17 OFFICER WILSON: Correct and the Charlie side.
18 And the Charlie would be the back side.

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. Could you
20 see into the apartment? Were there shades?

21 OFFICER WILSON: No, the shades were down or
22 their blinds were done.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Shades or
24 blinds, so you couldn't see in any of the windows.

1 OFFICER WILSON: No.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What happened
3 then?

4 OFFICER WILSON: At that point, I went around
5 to the front and we still continued to -- or Officer
6 Lee continued to knock on the door, announce Reading
7 police. And at that time, one of the workers from the
8 gas station came on over and I later found out that it
9 was Alan Greenough's brother, and he tried to explain
10 to me, you know, what was going on.

11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Hold on
12 one second.

13 OFFICER WILSON: I've got his name if you want
14 me to look it up in my book. I wrote it down.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. That
16 would be great if you could just pull it out. Anthony?

17 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. Anthony Perrotti.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And how did he
19 spell it?

20 OFFICER WILSON: It's Perotti, P-e-r-r-o-t-t-
21 i.

22 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what did
23 Anthony tell you?

24 OFFICER WILSON: He stated -- basically gave

1 me a brief history of what's been going on. His brother
2 is a drunk. The roommate and his girlfriend they're
3 constantly fighting. They're constantly calling the
4 police on each other and there was an incident there,
5 you know, earlier -- prior to our arrival and that's
6 why they called 911.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So that's
8 interesting. So Anthony indicated that they called
9 911, as in Anthony and the gas station attendants or
10 they meaning the two roommates?

11 OFFICER WILSON: I'm just assuming that. I --
12 he said, you know, there was incidences, you know, the
13 night before and in the past and I know who called 911.
14 It was the boyfriend and the girlfriend.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. They did
16 -- okay.

17 OFFICER WILSON: They're the ones that called
18 911. I just --

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

20 OFFICER WILSON: -- generalized and assumed --

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. No.
22 That's fine. I just wanted to clarify that. So
23 Anthony gave you this background.

24 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what happened
2 after the background?

3 OFFICER WILSON: And then I basically told
4 Anthony, look, you know, we got a 911 call that there
5 was a domestic assault or assault going on and we just
6 want to talk to him and get his side of the story.
7 And then we're continuing to -- or Officer Lee is
8 continuing to knock and then Officer Fontez (phonetic)
9 arrives at this time, too. And then -- so me, Mike, or
10 Officer Lee, Gooley and myself are in the front of the
11 building. Fontez arrives and I have him just go over
12 to the Delta side of the building, you know, just to
13 make sure no one is jumping out windows or anything
14 like that.

15 And then I engage in conversation with
16 Anthony. I'm like, look, we just need to talk to the
17 guy. And then I find out that Anthony is talking to
18 him on a cell phone.

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. You said
20 Fontez took a position on the Delta side?

21 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

22 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: That's when
23 Anthony tells you that he's talking to the brother --

24 OFFICER WILSON: On the cell phone and his

1 brother is basically trying to get him to come to the
2 door and open it up.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So he asked Alan
4 to come to the door.

5 OFFICER WILSON: The police want to speak to
6 you and then he -- then Anthony tells us, you know,
7 that his brother is not coming to the door because he's
8 worried about the police, that they're going to beat
9 him up, and he mentions an incident in Winchester where
10 I guess Alan got allegedly beat up by the police. And
11 then I reiterated to Anthony again. I'm like, look,
12 we're not here to beat anyone up. We want to just get
13 Alan's side of the story, just have him come to the
14 door, and I could hear Alan at that point yelling back
15 at his brother, you know, no, I'm not coming to the
16 door. I didn't do nothing wrong. I don't have any
17 reason to open up the door. And then --

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Let me just --
19 let me just try to catch up here.

20 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you asked
22 Anthony to again relay to open the door?

23 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I told him, you know,
24 we're not there to, you know, we're here to get his

1 side of the story. We want to know what's going on.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Alan replies no,
3 I'm not doing it.

4 OFFICER WILSON: Right.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Then what
6 happens?

7 OFFICER WILSON: And then, at this time, more
8 officers show up. Officer Vatcher shows up. It's V-a-
9 t-c-h-e-r.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: V-a-t-h --

11 OFFICER WILSON: C-h --

12 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- c-h --

13 OFFICER WILSON: E-r.

14 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: V-a -- let me
15 start over. V-a-t-c-r. I'm sorry.

16 OFFICER WILSON: V-a-t-c-h-e-r.

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: E-r.

18 OFFICER WILSON: Officer Drauschke (phonetic)
19 shows up. Don't ask me how to spell that.

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Including
21 Vatcher and Druvsky.

22 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Like starting
24 with D, Delta?

1 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. D-r-a -- your guess is
2 as good as mine.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. All
4 right. We'll figure that one out.

5 OFFICER WILSON: He's the one that ultimately
6 shot him.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. We'll get
8 to that. So they arrive on scene. Are they told to go
9 to a particular location?

10 OFFICER WILSON: No, then it just kind of --
11 it was kind of confusing. It just became, you know,
12 basically a stalemate where he wasn't coming to the
13 door. We kept on knocking, so I went in -- I borrowed
14 Fontez' phone because I didn't have my cell phone on
15 me, and I called Sergeant Silva. The first time
16 Lieutenant McKenna picked up the phone.

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So you
18 called the desk here at the PD?

19 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I called the desk at
20 the station. And --

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what did you
22 tell Silva?

23 OFFICER WILSON: I'm like, you know, hey,
24 Sarge, we're getting no knock at the door or no answer

1 at the door, but we know he's inside. He states he's
2 not coming out and then I informed him that, you know,
3 what we have here is -- what do we have here. Do we
4 have PC to arrest? What do you want us to do, because
5 he's not coming to the door. And then, I'll let you
6 finish writing.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. And then
8 what happened?

9 OFFICER WILSON: And then I have a
10 conversation with Officer Vatcher. He was the officer
11 that dealt with the situation last night.

12 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

13 OFFICER WILSON: And I'm like, Vatch, what's
14 going on. Do we have PC to arrest or not based on last
15 night's incident? And he tells me that he spoke to
16 Sergeant Jones and Lieutenant Brown and they determined
17 that there was no probable cause to arrest based on
18 last night's incident and that's why Officer Vatcher
19 did a summons.

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And that was
21 because there was a past A&B that did not --

22 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- occur in his
24 presence --

1 OFFICER WILSON: Right.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- so they just
3 decided summons was the best way to handle it. Okay.

4 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. And then -- so at that
5 point the two people that called 911 came back. The
6 boyfriend and the girlfriend came back in a car and I
7 went and talked to them to get their version of what
8 happened today. And then while this is all going on,
9 Officer Lee is still knocking on the door.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So you're
11 talking to the two victims, and simultaneously Lee is
12 still banging on the door --

13 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

14 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- and other
15 officers are around the structure at this point.

16 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So what did they
18 tell you what happened that day?

19 OFFICER WILSON: So I asked them what happened
20 today and they stated to me that when Alan came home,
21 he was pissed that the coffee table or some table in
22 the entry roomway was broken and in pieces and they
23 stated that Alan picked up a speaker and threw it in
24 the direction of the female.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Did they say who
2 broke the table?

3 OFFICER WILSON: That happened last night --
4 in last night's incident.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. Okay.
6 But did they indicate to you that Alan had actually
7 broken the table? Because I think --

8 OFFICER WILSON: I found that out after the
9 fact.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. All
11 right. But they didn't tell you that?

12 OFFICER WILSON: No.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So Alan is
14 pissed about a broken table. He picks up a speaker and
15 what?

16 OFFICER WILSON: And throws it in the
17 direction of the female, the female victim.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And her name is
19 Kim?

20 OFFICER WILSON: I believe so, yes. I didn't
21 get her name. Is that her name, Kim? I don't know.

22 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
23 happened?

24 OFFICER WILSON: And then she stated that --

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: This is Kim?

2 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. That the speaker hit
3 Anthony, which is Alan's brother.

4 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What does
5 Anthony do?

6 OFFICER WILSON: And then Anthony basically he
7 blocked the speaker from it hitting Kim.

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So intentionally
9 kind of put himself in jeopardy there just to save the
10 brother some trouble probably?

11 OFFICER WILSON: Probably, yes. That's what
12 I'm assuming.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So what
14 does she tell you happens next?

15 OFFICER WILSON: And then the male chimes in
16 and says then Alan charged him. And they basically,
17 you know, wrestled each other, pushing and shoving,
18 both of them exchanging, you know, pushing and shoving,
19 and they were on the ground and exchanging, you know,
20 blows.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So Alan charges
22 Kim's boyfriend --

23 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- and they

1 start fighting. And this occurred where?

2 OFFICER WILSON: Inside that little living
3 room area.

4 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Inside the
5 living room? Is that the first floor of the apartment?

6 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Is this
8 where all the furniture is busted up?

9 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. And then
11 what does she say happens?

12 OFFICER WILSON: And then somehow the
13 boyfriend creates distance and he leaves and calls 911
14 to report the incident.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So he leaves the
16 apartment.

17 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And does Kim go
19 with him?

20 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
22 happens?

23 OFFICER WILSON: And then at that point, I go
24 back and I see that we're not having any luck and I

1 attempt to -- you know, I notice that the brother is
2 still talking to Alan on the phone and, you know,
3 they're arguing back and forth. "Just open the door.
4 They just want to talk to you. That's all they're
5 going to do." And then Alan agrees to come to the
6 window and opens the window up so I can talk to him.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So did you ask
8 Anthony to have him come to the window?

9 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Then what
11 happens?

12 OFFICER WILSON: And then Alan opens up the
13 window and there's just a screen separating the two of
14 us.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And is this
16 window -- I'm sorry. Is this window on the Alpha side?

17 OFFICER WILSON: The Alpha side. Yeah.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what did
19 this conversation consist of?

20 OFFICER WILSON: At first, Alan recognized me.
21 He said you're the police officer that arrested me for
22 heroin and he mentioned, you know, I beat that charge.
23 His demeanor and tone was very belligerent, angry at
24 me.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So he's
2 belligerent, angry --

3 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

4 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
5 does he say?

6 OFFICER WILSON: And then just initial
7 observations as, you know, we're two feet apart. He's
8 leaning into the window and I'm looking into the
9 window. I can smell alcohol emanating from his breath
10 and his eyes were extremely glassy (sic). You know,
11 just through training and experience, you know, he was
12 definitely under the influence of something. He just
13 wasn't talking rational.

14 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So red
15 glassy-eyed?

16 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. Glassy eyes,
17 bloodshot.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And you could
19 detect the odor of alcohol on his breath?

20 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: You were that
22 close to him?

23 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. And what

1 happened next?

2 OFFICER WILSON: So, at that point, I go,
3 Alan, we want to know your side of the story; what
4 happened. And then that's when he pointed, you know,
5 inside the apartment and he pointed towards that
6 smashed table. He goes, "I got home today and look at
7 this table. You know, it's smashed and those other two
8 people were in my room."

9 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
10 happened?

11 OFFICER WILSON: And, from there, it was, you
12 know -- it was basically, you know, more irrational
13 stuff. You know, I didn't do nothing wrong. You know,
14 slamming his fist on the windowsill and then he
15 basically told me I was an asshole and said fuck you
16 and slammed the window on me or in front of me and then
17 he shut the -- actually, he just slammed the window.
18 He didn't shut the blind.

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What happened
20 next?

21 OFFICER WILSON: And, at that point, I got on
22 the phone and I called Sergeant Silva who was also --
23 Lieutenant McKenna who was within talking distance and
24 I'm explaining the situation. I'm like, look, he's not

1 going to come to the door. He's not going to open it
2 up. What do you want? Do you want us to make entry?
3 You know, I was, you know, seeking guidance as far as
4 what to do next. And then we call for the fire
5 department to come on down at that point.

6 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Was that you or
7 was that Sergeant Silva?

8 OFFICER WILSON: One of the guys over the
9 radio, I'm not sure who, called for the fire department
10 to come on down. And then I remember also talking to
11 Anthony, like, hey, keep calling your brother, try to
12 calm him down and say, look, we just want to talk to
13 him. At the same time, Officer Lee is still banging on
14 that one door, you know, saying this is the police,
15 come on out. And then as I'm talking to Lieutenant
16 McKenna, Mike Lee mentions something about he's got a
17 stick or something in his hand and that, you know, he
18 was making threats that, you know, if we come in, you
19 know, he's not afraid to use it; words to that effect.
20 I don't really specifically remember what he said, but
21 --

22 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Now, how can Lee
23 see this? Is he looking through a window on the door
24 or --

1 OFFICER WILSON: Because Alan was -- basically
2 stated look, I've got a stick in my hand. You guys
3 aren't -- I'm not opening this door to come in. And
4 that's -- Mike related to me as I was on the phone.
5 He's like he's stating he's got a stick in his hand or
6 a club in his hand.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And this is
8 through the door?

9 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. And Officer Lee relayed
10 that to me.

11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Do you remember
12 if it was a stick or a club?

13 OFFICER WILSON: The exact word was "pole".
14 He's got a pole.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: In his hand and
16 what, he's going to --

17 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah, he's pulling his hand
18 and I remember relaying that to Lieutenant McKenna and,
19 you know, asking for guidance. You know, do you want
20 us to make entry, what do you want us to do.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

22 OFFICER WILSON: And, at that point, Sergeant
23 Silva arrives on scene and then I brief him what's
24 going on.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Then what
2 happens?

3 OFFICER WILSON: And then Anthony comes over
4 and tells me, hey, my brother just was over on the --
5 there's a secondary doorway on the -- if you're looking
6 at the front of the building, on the left that leads
7 into the gas station office. And I guess Alan went out
8 that door and he had that pole in his hand.

9 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And Anthony told
10 you this that he had a pole in his hand?

11 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. He had a pole in his
12 hand and he went over to speak to the clerk.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And the other
14 doorway is also on the Alpha side, but it's not at the
15 door you guys are, right?

16 OFFICER WILSON: Right. It's --

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: It actually goes
18 into the office where the gas station --

19 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- people
21 conduct business.

22 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And that Anthony
24 saw him with the stick in his hand?

1 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. Yeah.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Or pole.

3 OFFICER WILSON: Pole. And then he went back
4 inside.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And he conversed
6 with the attendant at the gas station?

7 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. It was the --

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Do we know which
9 worker that was?

10 OFFICER WILSON: It was the owner --

11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: It was the owner
12 --

13 OFFICER WILSON: -- which I believe was the
14 first guy I got, so that Talaj Chengoni (phonetic). I
15 believe that was the owner.

16 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

17 OFFICER WILSON: And then so Anthony tells us,
18 you know, hey, he went back inside and he left the door
19 open or unlocked, not open, like visible, but he left
20 it unlocked, and he comes out and tells us this.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
22 happened?

23 OFFICER WILSON: And then, so I don't remember
24 everyone that went in, but it was myself, Officer

1 Gooley, Officer Lee and I believe Fontez was there as
2 well and we made entry into the apartment, announced
3 police, Anthony, you know, come on out. And as I
4 opened the door and walked through the threshold of the
5 door, I had my baton and I deployed my baton, you know,
6 yelling my presence and show me your hands and come on
7 out.

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what
9 happened then?

10 OFFICER WILSON: And then I got no response so
11 I continued to walk into the apartment looking at doors
12 and then I basically -- when you walk in, there's a
13 hallway or an open area and then there's Alan's bedroom
14 which is right here. And so I walk into his bedroom
15 and again, I announce Alan, are you in here, show me
16 your hands, come on out, and I noticed that the back
17 window is open. And we couldn't -- we didn't know
18 where Alan was at this time. So I --

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: I'm sorry. If I
20 could just -- hold on one second. The back window was
21 in Alan's bedroom?

22 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. So it would have been
23 the Charlie -- Charlie side of the house.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And did you look

1 out the window?

2 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. I looked out the window
3 and I saw Officer Savio in the back of the house and
4 I'm like do you see any footprints because he's not in
5 here. He's not responding to me. Do you see any
6 footprints in the snow that would make you believe that
7 he jumped out the window or, you know, I don't know if
8 he actually physically jumped out the window or if he
9 just opened it as, you know --

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Ploy.

11 OFFICER WILSON: Right. Right. So Dave and
12 looked and didn't see anything and --

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Is this Officer
14 --

15 OFFICER WILSON: Officer Savio, Dave Savio.
16 It's S-a-v-i-o. And Sergeant Silva was inside the
17 house with us, too.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So he didn't see
19 any footprints. Is there any way he could have avoided
20 -- were there patches of snow like --

21 OFFICER WILSON: Right. It was icy snow. It
22 was real spotty.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Spotty.

24 OFFICER WILSON: So you really couldn't see

1 visible footprints.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Then what
3 happened?

4 OFFICER WILSON: So, at that point, I hear
5 over the radio something about he's over by the
6 vehicles.

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you're still
8 in the apartment --

9 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. We're in the apartment
10 in Alan's bedroom in the, you know, common room I guess
11 you would want to call it, you know, the dining room,
12 and we hear over the radio a quick, "He's over by the
13 vehicles."

14 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. And what
15 do you guys do?

16 OFFICER WILSON: And then I hear a gunshot.

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you literally
18 hear the radio transmission and then before you --

19 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I'm going to --

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: How much time --

21 OFFICER WILSON: -- guesstimate 10 seconds max
22 from the radio transmission and then I hear the gunshot
23 and then I hear shots fired call over the radio.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Did you -- could

1 you discern how many gunshots?

2 OFFICER WILSON: I only heard one gunshot.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
4 did you do?

5 OFFICER WILSON: And then I remember I was
6 running out and I remember Sergeant Silva was in front
7 of me and we get to the outside and we didn't hear
8 anything. And Sergeant Silva calls over the radio
9 Eric, what's your location, and then Anthony, the
10 brother, is yelling hysterically, "They shot my
11 brother. They shot my brother."

12 So as we come out the building, we hear Anthony
13 yelling, "They shot my brother. They shot my brother."
14 And he's off to our right --

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: All right. So
16 --

17 OFFICER WILSON: -- which would have been the
18 Bravo side of the house.

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: You and Sergeant
20 Silva, you exit the building. How do you exit; the way
21 you came in?

22 OFFICER WILSON: No. I just remember Sergeant
23 Silva was in front of me --

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah.

1 OFFICER WILSON: -- and I was behind him.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

3 OFFICER WILSON: And then everyone else was
4 coming out.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Do you remember
6 what -- so you were in the apartment. Do you remember
7 how you got out of the apartment?

8 OFFICER WILSON: We got out of the apartment
9 --

10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: By the door Lee
11 was banging on?

12 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So that's also
14 on the Alpha side of the building, too.

15 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

16 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then you ran
17 around to the --

18 OFFICER WILSON: And then we heard Anthony
19 yelling, "He just shot my brother. He just shot my
20 brother." And we -- I went running over there and I
21 saw Officer Drauschke attempting to cuff Alan
22 Greenough.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And this is on
24 the Bravo side of the building at this point?

1 OFFICER WILSON: Correct. Over by where that
2 Humvee was.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you observed
4 Officer Drauschke --

5 OFFICER WILSON: Attempting to handcuff Alan
6 Greenough. And then I --

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Was Alan making
8 any noises? Was he breathing?

9 OFFICER WILSON: He was basically slunched
10 (sic) over, like this, and I looked and I could see
11 blood and I can't recall if he was saying anything, but
12 it basically looked like he was sitting on his butt,
13 slunched over like this, and Eric had his arm, you
14 know, trying to put it behind his back --

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

16 OFFICER WILSON: -- to handcuff him. And then
17 I asked Eric was happened and --

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Hold on one
19 second. Let me get caught up.

20 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Alan was sitting
22 on his butt?

23 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Leaning forward?

1 OFFICER WILSON: Leaning forward, yes, with his
2 legs extended.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And it's Erik
4 Drauschke?

5 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

6 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And he held one
7 arm attempting to put a handcuff on it?

8 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. He was attempting to
9 handcuff him. He was grabbing him by the arm putting
10 his arm behind his back.

11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
12 happened?

13 OFFICER WILSON: At that point, I asked Erik
14 what happened and Erik goes, "He came out -- he came
15 out of the vehicle at me with his hands in his pocket,
16 and I told him -- or he says show me your hands, show
17 me your hands, and he kept on coming at me, so I shot
18 him."

19 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

20 OFFICER WILSON: That's what he stated to me.

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So Erik said he
22 saw him in the vehicle?

23 OFFICER WILSON: He come out of the vehicle --
24 or coming from the vehicle. The vehicle meaning the

1 Humvee.

2 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Advancing
3 towards Erik.

4 OFFICER WILSON: With his hands in his pocket.

5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And Erik told
6 him, show me your hands, show me your hands?

7 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And when he said
9 he wouldn't show me his hands, so I shot him?

10 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. And then he kept on
11 approaching so he said he shot him.

12 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
13 happened?

14 OFFICER WILSON: And then, at that point, it
15 was -- it was kind of a fog, you know, disbelief that,
16 you know, one of our guys shot someone and I just
17 remember Officer Vatcher and Officer Lee, I looked
18 behind me, coming over with medical bags and they
19 were --

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Officers Lee and
21 Vatcher.

22 OFFICER WILSON: Vatcher. Yeah. Coming over
23 with medical bags.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

1 OFFICER WILSON: And, at that point, I
2 mentioned get medical here now. We got a guy shot.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Radio
4 transmission?

5 OFFICER WILSON: No, I said it to -- over -- I
6 don't remember who I said it to, but I just basically
7 yelled. I'm like, "We've got a guy shot. Have the
8 paramedics come on down."

9 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
10 happened?

11 OFFICER WILSON: And then, at that point, I
12 just kind of mingled in the lobby and then I went over
13 to speak to Anthony and I got Anthony's name -- or,
14 actually, Anthony wouldn't give that to me at first.
15 He was very irate that his brother had gotten shot, and
16 then he mentioned to the fact of me what did you guys
17 do that for; you didn't have to do that. And then he
18 mentioned the last officer that arrived on scene had a
19 tough guy look, and he was the one that shot him.
20 That's what he mentioned to me. And I don't -- I
21 didn't feed into that. I didn't say what officer -- so
22 I just -- I said relax, let us do our thing.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

24 OFFICER WILSON: And then I looked back to see

1 who that last officer was and it was Sergeant Silva and
2 that's when I was like -- I played it off because I
3 know Sergeant Silva didn't shoot Alan. I knew who --
4 what officer did, so I just, you know, tried to keep
5 him -- you know, didn't give him any information, and
6 then I went and I attempted to get his name and date of
7 birth, you know, just get his information; and he
8 wouldn't give it to me, and he just kept mumbling, "You
9 didn't guys didn't have to shoot my brother," and all
10 like that.

11 So then, at that point, I gathered the four
12 witnesses, and I basically said, guys, look, I need
13 everyone's name, date of birth, telephone number and
14 address who is here right now. We have an
15 officer-involved shooting. There's going to be an
16 investigation, and at that point, I basically I was --

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you got up
18 four witnesses. Do you remember which witnesses?

19 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I got them -- these
20 are the names that I wrote down. Chaghouri Talal.
21 That's all the information he gave me. There's the
22 three people right there, and then if you flip the
23 page, it's the fourth person.

24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So it's

1 Talal Chaghouri --

2 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- who is the
4 owner?

5 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

6 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then it's
7 Michael Randall, who is a gas station attendance?

8 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

9 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then it's
10 Mr. Ortiz who is a mechanic?

11 OFFICER WILSON: I believe so.

12 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And the fourth
13 person is Anthony Perrotta (sic)?

14 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you took
16 witness statements from them as far as just their
17 names, date of birth --

18 OFFICER WILSON: I just took their names,
19 dates of birth --

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

21 OFFICER WILSON: -- and then they kept on
22 asking me, you know, is he going to be all right. And
23 I didn't give them any information. I says I don't
24 know. And at that point, I was basically with them

1 keeping them in one place, and I stayed there until I
2 was relieved by someone. I was relieved -- I don't
3 know who relieved me, but Deputy Clark told me that I'm
4 getting relieved and I'm going to head back to the
5 police station.

6 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Was it -- I'm
7 sorry. Officer Clark or Deputy --

8 OFFICER WILSON: Deputy Chief Clark.

9 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. And that
10 -- basically, you've been here since?

11 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

12 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And you haven't
13 talked to any other officers as far as were you
14 segregated, were you just --

15 OFFICER WILSON: We were told not to talk
16 about the incident.

17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Not discuss the
18 incident?

19 OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And you didn't?

21 OFFICER WILSON: No.

22 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Can I
23 just get some contact info for you?

24 OFFICER WILSON: Sure.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: In case we
2 haven't to reach back out to you.

3 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

4 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What's a good
5 contact number for you?

6 OFFICER WILSON: My cell phone. [REDACTED].

7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And for our
8 reports, we have you, for all intents and purposes, are
9 a witness in this case. Can I just get your mailing
10 address?

11 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. It's [REDACTED]
12 [REDACTED], and that's in Dunstable, D-u-n-s-t-a-b-l-e,
13 Mass.

14 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: How far away is
15 that?

16 OFFICER WILSON: When I drive it, it's about
17 25 or 30 minutes.

18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Is that --

19 OFFICER WILSON: It's right there on the
20 border of --

21 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: New Hampshire?

22 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.

24 OFFICER WILSON: Last exit number 3.

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: All right. Well,
2 thank you very much. The time is currently 10:30 p.m.
3 That concludes this interview.
