INTERVIEW OF SEAN WILSON	
DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT PAUL BULMAN	

1 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Good evening. Μv 2 name is Detective Lieutenant Paul Bulman, Massachusetts 3 State Police, Middlesex District Attorney's Office. If you wouldn't mind, would you please state your name for 4 5 me? 6 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. My name is Officer Sean 7 Wilson, S-e-a-n, W-i-l-s-o-n. 8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What's your 9 badge number, Sean? 10 OFFICER WILSON: 66. 11 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Sean, just so you 12 know, we're conducting a criminal investigation into 13 the incident that occurred tonight. You're being 14 digitally recorded. If you wouldn't mind, I'd just 15 like you to -- I'd like to ask a little background 16 questions on your career. And then I'm going to just 17 have you go chronically your perception of the events 18 as they transposed tonight. 19 OFFICER WILSON: Okay. 2.0 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Can you just tell me how long you've been a police officer with 21 2.2 the town? 2.3 OFFICER WILSON: Almost 13 years. 24 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Thirteen years

2		OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
3		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Did you have any
4	previous	law enforcement experience in PD?
5		OFFICER WILSON: Not with the PD. I worked in
6	the brig	in the Marine Corp.
7		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: In the Marine
8	Corp.?	
9		OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.
10		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: How many years
11	were you	in the Marine Corp.?
12		OFFICER WILSON: Like 10 years.
13		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Was that did
14	some of t	that time run concurrent with your 13 years
15	here or?	
16		OFFICER WILSON: No.
17		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you did 10
18	years in	the Marines and you got and 13 years in
19	here?	
20		OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.
21		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And how many
22	years we	re you in the Marine Corp. in like a law
23	enforceme	ent capacity?
24		OFFICER WILSON: Approximately eight years.

1	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: If you wouldn't
2	mind, could you just start from the very start of your
3	shift when you reported for duty today and just kind of
4	walk me through what happened to the best of your
5	recollection.
6	OFFICER WILSON: You want me to start from my
7	start of my shift?
8	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah.
9	OFFICER WILSON: Okay. I was working overtime
10	shift today. I started at 0:8 this morning. It was
11	supposed to go to a 14 hour 18:00, 16:00. 4
12	o'clock. My bad.
13	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what sector
14	were you assigned to? Patrol or
15	OFFICER WILSON: I was sector 3 today.
16	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: You were sector
17	3?
18	OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.
19	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And who's your
20	superior officer on duty for today?
21	OFFICER WILSON: Lieutenant John McKenna.
22	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And was he the
23	shift commander or the OIC
24	OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. He was the OIC today.

1		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: He was the OIC
2	for this	day shift.
3		OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
4		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Can you tell me
5	where you	were when you first heard about the call at
6	this loca	ation?
7		OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I was in the station
8	doing a r	report and it came over the radio for a
9	domestic	situation at 1642 Main Street I believe.
10	1642, 164	13.
11		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And it was for a
12	domestic	incident?
13		OFFICER WILSON: Yes. It was a past assault
14	and batte	ery.
15		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And did it
16	indicate	like who was involved or anything like that or
17	was it ju	ust the address 1642?
18		OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. It was just the
19	address.	
20		DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Are you familiar
21	with that	t address?
22		OFFICER WILSON: Yes. We in roll call this
23	morning,	there was an incident there that happened last
24	night or	some time yesterday on the shift where there

1	was supposedly probable cause to arrest for another
2	previous assault and battery incident.
3	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Prior to today,
4	had you any dealings with that address or any of the
5	parties involved?
6	OFFICER WILSON: Yes, I have.
7	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Can you tell me
8	when or approximately how many times?
9	OFFICER WILSON: I was at that address maybe
10	four or five years ago for an alarm and then Alan
11	Greenough I've had extensive dealings with him. I've
12	arrested him once I believe for possession of Class A.
13	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: At least once?
14	OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
15	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And that was a
16	possessory offense for heroin?
17	OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
18	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Do you recall
19	how long ago that was?
20	OFFICER WILSON: That was the Stephanie Conway
21	situation down there at 352 Main Street. I'd say seven
22	years ago.
23	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Seven years ago?
24	OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Is that 1 2 the only time you've arrested him? 3 OFFICER WILSON: I believe so, yes. 4 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Have you had any 5 other occasion to deal with him in a, you know, drunk 6 and disorderly or --7 OFFICER WILSON: I remember pulling him over on I think it was Parker Street heading into Wakefield off of Ash Street and I gave him a money fine for 9 10 defective equipment. He had -- Stephanie Conway was in the vehicle with him and I think I gave him a money 11 12 fine for defective equipment. 13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Let me back up. 14 You stopped him in a motor vehicle? 15 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And he was the 16 17 operator? 18 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And this was 19 20 where? OFFICER WILSON: On Ash Street and that was 21 after I arrested him, so that was my probably -- I've 22 23 dealt with him --DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: You don't have 24

to be exact. Approximate, how long ago was the motor 1 2 vehicle stop? 3 OFFICER WILSON: It was probably six years 4 ago. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And this 5 6 resulted in a money fine for defective equipment? 7 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. 8 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Is it fair to 9 say he'd recognize you; do you think? 10 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: He would 11 12 recognize you? 13 OFFICER WILSON: I encountered him tonight and 14 tried to talk to him. 15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: All right. We'll get to that. Aside from arresting him for the 16 17 Class A and stopping him for the defective equipment which resulted in a money fine, do you think -- can you 18 19 recall any other interactions? OFFICER WILSON: No, not that I can recall. 20 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Getting 21 back to today, so you were at the police department and 22 you got the call. Were you the only one that responded 23 or were additional officers --24

OFFICER WILSON: Three of us originally 1 2 responded. It was myself, Office Gooley, who was in 3 the station doing a report with me and Officer Mike Lee. 5 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And approximate 6 time again? 7 OFFICER WILSON: I believe this right at like 4:30. No. I was supposed to get off at 4:30 so it was 8 9 like right at like 3:30. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: 3:30. Okay. 1.0 And if you would just go over the officers again that 11 12 went there with you. 13 OFFICER WILSON: Gooley. It's G-o-o-l-e-y. 14 And then Mike Lee. L-e-e. 15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Do you remember 16 who was there, first? 17 OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. Mike Lee was there 18 first and then Gooley. I was the third one that arrived all within, you know 20, 30 seconds of each 19 20 other.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And when you got

-- when you first arrived, what are your recollection

of happened initially?

OFFICER WILSON: When we first arrived, we

knocked on the door and attempted to speak to whoever 1 2 was inside. As I was on my way to the call, dispatch 3 came over the radio and did the reporting party and left the scene and they went down to the Lobster Claw 4 which is, you know, a couple of -- quarter of a mile 5 6 down on the street on the North Reading line. 7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Did dispatch tell you anything else what you may encounter at the 8 9 scene? OFFICER WILSON: They basically said it was a 10 past domestic incident and then they -- that was pretty 11 much it from my recollection right now. 12 13 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So is it you or Lee that knocks on the door? 14 OFFICER WILSON: Officer Lee. 15 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And where were 16 17 you when this happened? OFFICER WILSON: I was like five feet behind 18 19 him. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So you're 2.0 -- so bear with me because I haven't actually been to 21 22 the scene. I've been here all night. Is this the door to the apartment or is this the door -- is this the 23

door of the common hallway of the apartment --

1	OFFICER WILSON: Yes, correct.
2	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Not the door
3	from the office of the gas station
4	OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

6	that I wasn't able to open. It's a common hallway.
7	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay.
8	OFFICER WILSON: Apartment on the right and
9	apartment on the left.
10	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And to the best
11	of your knowledge, which apartment did the suspect
12	occupy?
13	OFFICER WILSON: He lived in the apartment on
14	the left.
15	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: On the left
16	side.
17	OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
18	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you knocked
19	on the door and did you get any response?
20	OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. We got no response.
21	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What did you
22	guys do then?
23	OFFICER WILSON: We continued knocking. I
24	yelled, you know, Reading Police, if you're in there,

come on out. We just want to talk to you. We want to 1 2 find out what's going on. And then I had walked around 3 the building so I went to the -- you know, the front of the building which is right in front of you. I went to 4 the Delta side, checked all those windows and then --DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So this would be 6 7 the right hand side of the building? 8 OFFICER WILSON: Correct. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. 9 10 OFFICER WILSON: And then I went around to the back, the Charlie side, and attempted to look in the 11 12 windows to see if I could see anyone, but all the 13 shades and windows were shut and you couldn't see into the house. 14 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: No luck looking 15 in the windows on the Delta side? 16 OFFICER WILSON: Correct and the Charlie side. 17 18 And the Charlie would be the back side. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. Could you 19 20 see into the apartment? Were there shades? OFFICER WILSON: No, the shades were down or 21 22 their blinds were done. 23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Shades or

blinds, so you couldn't see in any of the windows.

1	OFFICER WILSON: No.
2	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What happened
3	then?
4	OFFICER WILSON: At that point, I went around
5	to the front and we still continued to or Officer
6	Lee continued to knock on the door, announce Reading
7	police. And at that time, one of the workers from the
8	gas station came on over and I later found out that it
9	was Alan Greenough's brother, and he tried to explain
10	to me, you know, what was going on.
11	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Hold on
12	one second.
13	OFFICER WILSON: I've got his name if you want
14	me to look it up in my book. I wrote it down.
15	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. That
16	would be great if you could just pull it out. Anthony?
17	OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. Anthony Perrotti.
18	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And how did he
19	spell it?
20	OFFICER WILSON: It's Perotti, P-e-r-r-o-t-t-
21	i.
22	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what did
23	Anthony tell you?
24	OFFICER WILSON: He stated basically gave

OFFICER WILSON: And then I basically told
Anthony, look, you know, we got a 911 call that there
was a domestic assault or assault going on and we just
want to talk to him and get his side of the story.
And then we're continuing to -- or Officer Lee is
continuing to knock and then Officer Fontez (phonetic)
arrives at this time, too. And then -- so me, Mike, or
Officer Lee, Gooley and myself are in the front of the
building. Fontez arrives and I have him just go over
to the Delta side of the building, you know, just to
make sure no one is jumping out windows or anything
like that.

And then I engage in conversation with

Anthony. I'm like, look, we just need to talk to the

guy. And then I find out that Anthony is talking to

him on a cell phone.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. You said Fontez took a position on the Delta side?

OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: That's when

Anthony tells you that he's talking to the brother -
OFFICER WILSON: On the cell phone and his

brother is basically trying to get him to come to the door and open it up.

 $\label{eq:decomposition} \mbox{ DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So he asked Alan} \\ \mbox{to come to the door.}$

OFFICER WILSON: The police want to speak to you and then he -- then Anthony tells us, you know, that his brother is not coming to the door because he's worried about the police, that they're going to beat him up, and he mentions an incident in Winchester where I guess Alan got allegedly beat up by the police. And then I reiterated to Anthony again. I'm like, look, we're not here to beat anyone up. We want to just get Alan's side of the story, just have him come to the door, and I could hear Alan at that point yelling back at his brother, you know, no, I'm not coming to the door. I didn't do nothing wrong. I don't have any reason to open up the door. And then --

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Let me just -- let me just try to catch up here.

OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you asked Anthony to again relay to open the door?

OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I told him, you know, we're not there to, you know, we're here to get his

1	side of the story. We want to know what's going on.
2	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Alan replies no,
3	I'm not doing it.
4	OFFICER WILSON: Right.
5	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. Then what
6	happens?
7	OFFICER WILSON: And then, at this time, more
8	officers show up. Officer Vatcher shows up. It's V-a-
9	t-c-h-e-r.
10	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: V-a-t-h
11	OFFICER WILSON: C-h
12	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: c-h
13	OFFICER WILSON: E-r.
14	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: V-a let me
15	start over. V-a-t-c-r. I'm sorry.
16	OFFICER WILSON: V-a-t-c-h-e-r.
17	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: E-r.
18	OFFICER WILSON: Officer Drauschke (phonetic)
19	shows up. Don't ask me how to spell that.
20	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Including
21	Vatcher and Druvsky.
22	OFFICER WILSON: Yeah.
23	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Like starting
24	with D, Delta?

- OFFICER WILSON: Yes. D-r-a -- your quess is 1 2 as good as mine. 3 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. All 4 right. We'll figure that one out. OFFICER WILSON: He's the one that ultimately 5 6 shot him. 7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. We'll get 8 to that. So they arrive on scene. Are they told to go to a particular location? 9 OFFICER WILSON: No, then it just kind of --10 it was kind of confusing. It just became, you know, 11 12 basically a stalemate where he wasn't coming to the 13 door. We kept on knocking, so I went in -- I borrowed Fontez' phone because I didn't have my cell phone on 14 me, and I called Sergeant Silva. The first time 15 Lieutenant McKenna picked up the phone. 16 17 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So you 18 called the desk here at the PD?
- OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I called the desk at the station. And --
- DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what did you tell Silva?
- OFFICER WILSON: I'm like, you know, hey,

 Sarge, we're getting no knock at the door or no answer

at the door, but we know he's inside. He states he's 1 2 not coming out and then I informed him that, you know, 3 what we have here is -- what do we have here. Do we have PC to arrest? What do you want us to do, because he's not coming to the door. And then, I'll let you 5 6 finish writing. 7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. And then 8 what happened? 9 OFFICER WILSON: And then I have a conversation with Officer Vatcher. He was the officer 10 11 that dealt with the situation last night. 12 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. 13 OFFICER WILSON: And I'm like, Vatch, what's going on. Do we have PC to arrest or not based on last 14 15 night's incident? And he tells me that he spoke to Sergeant Jones and Lieutenant Brown and they determined 16 17 that there was no probable cause to arrest based on 18 last night's incident and that's why Officer Vatcher 19 did a summons. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And that was 2.0 because there was a past A&B that did not --2.1 22 OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So you're talking to the two victims, and simultaneously Lee is still banging on the door --

OFFICER WILSON: Correct.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: -- and other officers are around the structure at this point.

OFFICER WILSON: Yes.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So what did they tell you what happened that day?

OFFICER WILSON: So I asked them what happened today and they stated to me that when Alan came home, he was pissed that the coffee table or some table in the entry roomway was broken and in pieces and they stated that Alan picked up a speaker and threw it in the direction of the female.

1	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Did they say who
2	broke the table?
3	OFFICER WILSON: That happened last night
4	in last night's incident.
5	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Yeah. Okay.
6	But did they indicate to you that Alan had actually
7	broken the table? Because I think
8	OFFICER WILSON: I found that out after the
9	fact.
10	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. All
11	right. But they didn't tell you that?
12	OFFICER WILSON: No.
13	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So Alan is
14	pissed about a broken table. He picks up a speaker and
15	what?
16	OFFICER WILSON: And throws it in the
17	direction of the female, the female victim.
18	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And her name is
19	Kim?
20	OFFICER WILSON: I believe so, yes. I didn't
21	get her name. Is that her name, Kim? I don't know.
22	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
23	happened?
24	OFFICER WILSON: And then she stated that

1	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: This is Kim?
2	OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. That the speaker hit
3	Anthony, which is Alan's brother.
4	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What does
5	Anthony do?
6	OFFICER WILSON: And then Anthony basically he
7	blocked the speaker from it hitting Kim.
8	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So intentionally
9	kind of put himself in jeopardy there just to save the
10	brother some trouble probably?
11	OFFICER WILSON: Probably, yes. That's what
12	I'm assuming.
13	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So what
14	does she tell you happens next?
15	OFFICER WILSON: And then the male chimes in
16	and says then Alan charged him. And they basically,
17	you know, wrestled each other, pushing and shoving,
18	both of them exchanging, you know, pushing and shoving,
19	and they were on the ground and exchanging, you know,
20	blows.

13	boyfriend creates distance and he leaves and calls 911
14	to report the incident.
15	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So he leaves the
16	apartment.
17	OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
18	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And does Kim go
19	with him?
20	OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
21	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And then what
22	happens?
23	OFFICER WILSON: And then at that point, I go
24	back and I see that we're not having any luck and I

attempt to -- you know, I notice that the brother is 1 2 still talking to Alan on the phone and, you know, they're arguing back and forth. "Just open the door. 3 They just want to talk to you. That's all they're 5 going to do." And then Alan agrees to come to the window and opens the window up so I can talk to him. 6 7 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So did you ask 8 Anthony to have him come to the window? 9 OFFICER WILSON: Yes. 10 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Then what 11 happens? 12 OFFICER WILSON: And then Alan opens up the 1.3 window and there's just a screen separating the two of 14 us. DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And is this 15 16 window -- I'm sorry. Is this window on the Alpha side? 17 OFFICER WILSON: The Alpha side. Yeah. 18 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And what did 19 this conversation consist of? 20 OFFICER WILSON: At first, Alan recognized me. He said you're the police officer that arrested me for 21 22 heroin and he mentioned, you know, I beat that charge. 23 His demeanor and tone was very belligerent, angry at

people were in my room."

Note that the shut the blind.

And, from there, it was, you know -- it was basically, you know, more irrational stuff. You know, I didn't do nothing wrong. You know, slamming his fast on the windowsill and then he basically told me I was an asshole and said fuck you and slammed the window on me or in front of me and then he shut the -- actually, he just slammed the window.

He didn't shut the blind.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: What happened next?

OFFICER WILSON: And, at that point, I got on the phone and I called Sergeant Silva who was also -Lieutenant McKenna who was within talking distance and
I'm explaining the situation. I'm like, look, he's not

going to come to the door. He's not going to open it up. What do you want? Do you want us to make entry?
You know, I was, you know, seeking guidance as far as what to do next. And then we call for the fire department to come on down at that point.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Was that you or was that Sergeant Silva?

OFFICER WILSON: One of the guys over the radio, I'm not sure who, called for the fire department to come on down. And then I remember also talking to Anthony, like, hey, keep calling your brother, try to calm him down and say, look, we just want to talk to him. At the same time, Officer Lee is still banging on that one door, you know, saying this is the police, come on out. And then as I'm talking to Lieutenant McKenna, Mike Lee mentions something about he's got a stick or something in his hand and that, you know, he was making threats that, you know, if we come in, you know, he's not afraid to use it; words to that effect. I don't really specifically remember what he said, but

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Now, how can Lee see this? Is he looking through a window on the door or --

And I don't -- I 21 didn't feed into that. I didn't say what officer -- so 22 I just -- I said relax, let us do our thing. 23 DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. OFFICER WILSON: And then I looked back to see 2.4

who that last officer was and it was Sergeant Silva and that's when I was like -- I played it off because I know Sergeant Silva didn't shoot Alan. I knew who --what officer did, so I just, you know, tried to keep him -- you know, didn't give him any information, and then I went and I attempted to get his name and date of birth, you know, just get his information; and he wouldn't give it to me, and he just kept mumbling, "You didn't guys didn't have to shoot my brother," and all like that.

So then, at that point, I gathered the four witnesses, and I basically said, guys, look, I need everyone's name, date of birth, telephone number and address who is here right now. We have an officer-involved shooting. There's going to be an investigation, and at that point, I basically I was --
DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: So you got up

four witnesses. Do you remember which witnesses?

OFFICER WILSON: Yeah. I got them -- these are the names that I wrote down. Chaghouri Talal.

That's all the information he gave me. There's the three people right there, and then if you flip the page, it's the fourth person.

DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. So it's

7	sorry. Officer Clark or Deputy
8	OFFICER WILSON: Deputy Chief Clark.
9	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: Okay. And that
10	basically, you've been here since?
11	OFFICER WILSON: Yes.
12	DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT BULMAN: And you haven't
13	talked to any other officers as far as were you
14	segregated, were you just
15	OFFICER WILSON: We were told not to talk
16	about the incident.
