## INTERVIEW OF TALAL CHAGHOURI

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DETECTIVE MICHAEL FITZGERALD TROOPER JAMES CONNOLLY

FEBRUARY 3, 2018

2 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Come on in. You can 1 2 have a seat right there. Thank you for your patience. Just to let you know, we're just going to ask you some 3 questions just regarding the incident that happened. 4 To let you know, the audio -- the room is on audio and 5 6 video recording, okay. 7 MR. CHAGHOURI: Sounds good. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Sir, I'm sorry. What is 8 9 your first name? MR. CHAGHOURI: Talal, T-a-l-a-l. 10 11 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Okay. MR. CHAGHOURI: Joseph, middle name, and last 12 13 name Chaghouri, C-h-a-g-h-o-u-r-i. TROOPER CONNOLLY: And your birthday? 14 15 MR. CHAGHOURI: /64. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Where do you live? 16 17 MR. CHAGHOURI: Beverly, Mass, TROOPER CONNOLLY: Good phone number to reach 18 19 you at? MR. CHAGHOURI: 20 TROOPER CONNOLLY: And you're the owner of East 21 22 Coast? MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes, sir. I am the owner. 23 It's a corporation. Me and my brother, we own it both 24

3 1 50/50 to be more accurate. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Okay. Can you tell me about 2 3 -- well, were you working yesterday? MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. Yes, I was. 4 TROOPER CONNOLLY: What time were you there? 5 MR. CHAGHOURI: I was there until -- 6:45 I 6 7 left. TROOPER CONNOLLY: What time did you start? 8 MR. CHAGHOURI: I started at 2:00 I believe. Ι 9 10 came late yesterday. 11 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Why you were there, did you 12 see -- or who else was working? 13 MR. CHAGHOURI: We have gas attendant. What 14 was vesterday? Yesterday --15 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Friday. 16 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Friday. 17 MR. CHAGHOURI: Friday? DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: I know. 18 MR. CHAGHOURI: Thinking Tuesday. Yesterday, 19 yes, we had Martin open from 6:00 to 2:00, and then 20 Mikey worked from 2:00 to 9:00 on the gas shift. 21 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Randell, is that Michael 22 23 Randell? 24 MR. CHAGHOURI: Michael Randell, yes, yes.

4 1 TROOPER CONNOLLY: And -- I'm sorry -- what --2 what shift did he work? 3 MR. CHAGHOURI: He started at 2:00 in the 4 afternoon until 9 o'clock at night, seven-hour shift. 5 TROOPER CONNOLLY: While you were there --6 MR. CHAGHOURT: Yeah. 7 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Did you see Alan? 8 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yesterday he did not show up. I did not see him at all. 9 10 TROOPER CONNOLLY: What about Devin or Kim? 11 MR. CHAGHOURI: Devin came. He gave me some 12 rent money. He came twice. He gave me first 300. 13 Then he came again two hours later, gave me another 14 175. And --15 TROOPER CONNOLLY: What time was that about do 16 you think? 17 MR. CHAGHOURI: That was around 5:30 -- between 5:30 and 6:00. And by the time I got home and I was 18 19 eating and watching TV, he start texting me and 20 explaining to me what is taking place at the apartment. 21 TROOPER CONNOLLY: What time did he start 22 texting you? MR. CHAGHOURI: To be accurate, let me just --23 24 maybe 8 o'clock. Let me see when the first text came.

He is right here, Devin. And he says to me he is just 1 -- let me see. "He is wasted on something." Lay low. 2 Okay. I'm tell him. Okay. He's saying, "Also just 3 destroyed the table in the kitchen and chairs, 4 threatening us because he said it is his home." That 5 6 was at 6:27. Can you see this? I'm sorry. 7 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yep, 6:27. MR. CHAGHOURI: 6:27 the first text came. And 8 if you guys want to read it, I'll give you -- you know, 9 so you can understand what was going on. They're 10 fighting, and then Alan called me himself telling me 11 that he comes home from his friend's funeral, and he 12 found the house is all destroyed. And they're fighting 13 with each other he says, the girl and the boy. That 14 15 was the end of it. After that, Alan calls me --16 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). 17 MR. CHAGHOURI: -- 20 minutes after that. He 18 says to me I came from the funeral -- or from the place 19 where the -- funeral home. 20 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. 21 MR. CHAGHOURI: And he says he found the table 2.2 broken in the kitchen, and Devin and his girlfriend, 23 they were fighting very bad. And he said that he 24

cannot deal with this. It's too much noise, blah, blah, 1 blah. He says to me, "I want them out, Joe. I cannot 2 live like this anymore." I said, "Just cool down now. 3 Don't do anything. Tomorrow I deal with everybody." 4 5 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So Devin is texting you saying that Alan is destroying the place? 6 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. And --7 8 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: And then Alan calls you and says Devin and his girlfriend are destroying the 9 10 place? MR. CHAGHOURI: Exactly. And Devin also did 11 12 the same with Anthony, Alan's brother. 13 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. MR. CHAGHOURI: And he also sent him the same 14 15 text telling him that your brother is acting up, blah, blah, blah. Now, the gas attendant testified that 16 17 before Alan was there in the house, Mike Randell, he heard a lot of fighting inside between Devin and his 18 19 girlfriend. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. 20 MR. CHAGHOURI: So I got a little feeling 21 saying that maybe Devin rushed that text saying because 22 he knows that they've already done damage to the house, 23 and he want to blame it on Al because he knows Al is my 24

7 weak spot. And I let him stay without trying that 1 2 stuff. So I really don't know that truth, but what Michael testified that he heard lot of screaming and 3 destruction before Alan came to the house. So I got a 4 feeling there that maybe Devin lied, maybe. I don't 5 6 know. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. That's 7 interesting. Okay. 8 9 MR. CHAGHOURI: Because Anthony also had the same text from them, and when Anthony called his 10 brother, his brother told him the same thing he told 11 me, that he just came in. He found the house 12 destroyed, and blah, blah, blah, blah. 13 TROOPER CONNOLLY: I'm sorry. Let me just 14 write some of that stuff down. 15 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 16 TROOPER CONNOLLY: When you talked to Alan on 17 the phone -- he called you -- did he sound like he's 18 19 drunk? MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. He sounded a little bit 20 under the influence of but not too much. Usually he's 21 22 more like slurry. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. 23 MR. CHAGHOURI: But you know, his brother tells 24

me next day, before the incident happened, like in the 1 2 morning, he says to me, you know, "Al wasn't that 3 drunk. I mean, did you notice that?" I said, "I noticed that he's -- his voice was not the same." 4 5 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. MR. CHAGHOURI: "But I don't know how wasted he 6 7 was." I said, "But, no, his voice was not the same Al. 8 Surely was on something," either a pill or, you know, 9 something. 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: And how many times did 11 you speak to Alan? Just that one time --12 MR. CHAGHOURI: Just --13 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: -- when he called? 14 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. Just last night, only because we were watching TV, and my wife does not want 15 to hear anything about these guys. She's been on my 16 17 case to get rid of all of them --DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Sure. 18 19 MR. CHAGHOURI: -- for five years. 20 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Oh, yeah, right. 21 MR. CHAGHOURI: And I got a soft heart. I feel 22 bad. I see the guy, you know. He has no money. He 23 helps me. His brother works good for me. 24 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Right.

9 1 MR. CHAGHOURI: So I say I help him out, you 2 know, if he cleans up. He does like, you know, clean 3 the snow off the roof, minor stuff. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Sure. 4 5 MR. CHAGHOURI: -- just for his rent. 6 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). 7 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Are either one of them on 8 any type of paper lease or anything like that? 9 MR. CHAGHOURI: No. Nobody has a paper lease. 10 TROOPER CONNOLLY: It's just --11 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. It's not a legal 12 apartment because in Reading we cannot have two. So I 13 have the one legal one apartment rented to the fellow 14 and another working kid. They both work for me as 15 The other unit, it's just for us workers like, well. you know, when we're tired, when we -- you know. And 16 17 then when Al needed a place after -- he came from jail 18 about three years ago. He had a car accident when he was intoxicated, and that was in December. I'm burying 19 20 my mom because she passed away. I come back here, and 21 I found out that Anthony put his brother in that apartment. And he says to me, you know, he's going to 22 23 be good. He's going to help us, blah, blah, blah. I was really against it because I know from record that 24

10 he was not stable. 1 2 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Right. MR. CHAGHOURI: And you know, he can go crazy. 3 He can destroy thing. But for Anthony's relation, I 4 5 allowed him to stay, and that was about two years ago 6 now. 7 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Two or three? MR. CHAGHOURI: I believe two. 8 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: 9 Two years. 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: My mom passed away December 14 two years ago. Yes. That's when he moved 11 12 in I believe. I said three. I'm sorry. 13 TROOPER CONNOLLY: No, no problem. MR. CHAGHOURI: It's two I think. 14 15 TROOPER CONNOLLY: That's okay. MR. CHAGHOURI: He couldn't work on the gas too 16 much because he always had an issue, you know. He was 17 always angry, and you know, he would say this customer 18 did this to me. This customer did that. 19 20 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Bad for customer service? 21 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. He was not -- you know, 22 he had a good heart, but he had a lot of issues. 23 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: A lot of mental problems 24

1 you mean?

2 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. A lot of issues, abuse 3 between alcohol and Klonopin, that stuff. I mean, I 4 know the stuff just from being close to him for so many 5 years now. About eight years he's been in my life 6 almost.

7 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Did you tell -- last night, 8 did you tell Anthony about this?

MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. I did text Anthony, as a 9 matter of fact, and I told him contact your brother. 10 There's a problem in the house. And Anthony responds 11 to me -- let's see what happened here. I say, "Check 12 on your brother. He is raging and breaking stuff in 13 the house. Devin seems to think he is on something." 14 So Tony, "Please do not forget to pick up Denise 15 Maximo." Okay. So he did not respond to me in text. 16 17 He calls me. He calls me, and he says, "Al did not sound that drunk to me." I said -- "Did he sound drunk 18 to you?" I said, "He sound like he was on something." 19 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. 20

21 MR. CHAGHOURI: But to his brother, he did not 22 sound like normal, like, you know, he would be more 23 raging and more -- but I could tell that he had couple 24 alcohol glasses or --

12 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. 1 MR. CHAGHOURI: -- from the voice. 2 3 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. So today, what time 4 did you get to work? MR. CHAGHOURI: Today I got there at 1:30. 5 TROOPER CONNOLLY: And what was there? 6 7 MR. CHAGHOURI: Anthony was there. And the mechanics were working inside. And the gas attendant 8 was Mike Randell because he broke shift at 1 o'clock. 9 10 TROOPER CONNOLLY: And the gas station -- I 11 mean the --MR. CHAGHOURI: The mechanics? 12 TROOPER CONNOLLY: The mechanics are? 13 MR. CHAGHOURI: The mechanics are Marcos, 14 Carlos, Arbor, and Punchi (phonetic). Four guys inside 15 the garage, and Anthony Carrati (phonetic), he is the 16 17 manager that organized their working. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Who is the -- I'm sorry. 18 There's four guys, the mechanics? 19 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. But they left -- some of 20 them left before the incident took place. 21 22 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Oh, they did? Okay. 23 24 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. Because they left

13 Saturday. They leave by 3:00. 1 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Orlando. 2 MR. CHAGHOURI: Orlando stay. Orlando is the 3 4 older guy. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. I just talked to him. 5 MR. CHAGHOURI: He stayed here. 6 7 MR. CHAGHOURI: Arbor left before the incident, Arbor (phonetic). Some kind of Armenian last name. 8 9 Don't ask me for it now. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Okay. 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Marcos and Carlos. 11 MR. CHAGHOURI: Marcos is the one you 12 interviewed, older guy. Carlos left. He's a young 13 14 quy, 42 years old. He left around 4 o'clock or 3:30 15 maybe today. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Who are the neighbors that 16 you said, their neighbors, Alan's neighbors? 17 MR. CHAGHOURI: Oh, Devel (phonetic) --18 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Devel. 19 MR. CHAGHOURI: -- and Driss. Devel is --20 Devel Range his last name. 21 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Range? 22 23 MR. CHAGHOURI: Range. TROOPER CONNOLLY: R-a-n-g-e. 24

1 MR. CHAGHOURI: R-a-n-g. And another Moroccan 2 guy. His name Driss, D-r-i-s-s. And his last name is 3 Kouther, K-o-u-t-h-a-r. 4 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Was he home? 5 MR. CHAGHOURI: He was home knocked out 6 sleeping from what I understood because all the 7 commotion, he never showed up. He stayed in there. 8 And what I understood later from Devel, his roommate, 9 that he went to sleep after because he opens early in 10 the morning. 11 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Where was Devel? 12 MR. CHAGHOURI: Devel was off today, and he 13 went to visit his aunt at a hospital in Jamaica Pena (phonetic), that area. 14 15 TROOPER CONNOLLY: So he was not home? 16 MR. CHAGHOURI: He was not there. 17 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: And, Joe, they live on 18 the apartment to the right, correct? 19 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes, to the right. 20 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. 21 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 22 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. 23 MR. CHAGHOURI: And the deceased lived at the 24 one to the left.

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15 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. With Devin? 1 2 MR. CHAGHOURI: With Devin. 3 TROOPER CONNOLLY: So what -- did you see Alan, 4 Devin, or Kim at all today? MR. CHAGHOURI: I saw Alan. 5 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Okay. 6 7 MR. CHAGHOURI: I saw Alan after the police 8 came. There were just couple of cruisers in the beginning, and they were talking to him through the 9 10 window. Well, not right away. Right away he was 11 hiding. 12 TROOPER CONNOLLY: So you didn't talk -- did 13 you talk to Alan in between the text you showed me and 14 todav? MR. CHAGHOURI: Yesterday he called me, Alan, 15 16 after that. 17 TROOPER CONNOLLY: I'm sorry. MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. He did call me, and he 18 19 did deny all the charges that Devin accused him of. He said it's the other way around. 20 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah, right, right. 21 22 MR. CHAGHOURI: That's what --TROOPER CONNOLLY: But you didn't talk to him? 23 24 MR. CHAGHOURI: Not today.

16 1 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Okav. 2 MR. CHAGHOURI: But he came out today when the 3 police were surrounding him. He came out from inside door with a big stick and --4 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: When you say "big 5 6 stick," could you describe it for me? 7 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. It's like a table --8 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Like a table leg? 9 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Leg of a table? 11 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. Like that wide maybe, 12 you know, like rectangular. 13 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. MR. CHAGHOURI: And a big piece of wood, and he 14 15 came out from the side door. And he's waving at me. 16 He was like -- you could probably see it on the 17 surveillance later. He says, "What are you doing to 18 me, Joe? Why you calling all the fucking cops on me?" I said, "I didn't call nobody at you." And I said, 19 "What's wrong with you?" I said, "Don't you see all 20 the police outside?" I said, "Get rid of the fucking 21 stick before they shoot you." This is weapon. So he 22 goes inside his apartment, and then I haven't seen him 23 24 after that until he escaped.

17 TROOPER CONNOLLY: I'm sorry. I was writing. 1 What kind of stick do you think it was? 2 MR. CHAGHOURI: It was leg of a table. Like 3 4 you know how table has rectangular legs? TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. 5 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. So it's a piece that 6 7 long, and it's that wide about. 8 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So about three feet long 9 and about --MR. CHAGHOURI: Three or four feet. Yes. 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: -- four or five inches 11 in circumference? 12 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes, yes. And he had it in his 13 14 hand. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Four feet is --15 MR. CHAGHOURI: Not it's not, maybe three. 16 17 TROOPER CONNOLLY: That was a tall table? MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah, maybe three. 18 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Okay. 19 MR. CHAGHOURI: Maybe three feet. But they're 20 all -- you could see the legs in the apartment still on 21 22 the floor. They're broken. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So you thin the leg that 23 he was holding in his hand was from the table that got 24

18 1 destroyed? MR. CHAGHOURI: I'm suspecting that only 2 because I see it now that goes in --3 4 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Sure. MR. CHAGHOURI: -- from one side where it looks 5 6 like it's a table, you know. 7 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yep. 8 MR. CHAGHOURI: I'm assuming that because it does look like a nice round finish. 9 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. 10 MR. CHAGHOURI: Nice wood. 11 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So when he came -- when 12 you saw him again, if you go in your office door there 13 14 \_ \_ MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah, yeah. 15 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: -- there's a door that 16 goes to the right that goes into their apartment. 17 18 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: When you saw him with 19 the table leg in his hand, did he open the door, or was 20 21 the door open? MR. CHAGHOURI: No. He opened it. I can hear 22 23 the door open. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. 24

19 MR. CHAGHOURI: And I said is that Al? I mean, 1 because I knew there was a good 20 minutes hold up, you 2 know. They were waiting for him to come out, and he's 3 4 not coming out. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. 5 MR. CHAGHOURI: And I got surprised by him, you 6 know, coming out, and the officers outside can see him. 7 8 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. 9 MR. CHAGHOURI: Can see him. The tall guy that 10 was there on the scene can see him. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So you think the 11 officers were able to see him with the --12 13 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. When he came at me, I 14 think they saw the stick. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: 15 Okay. MR. CHAGHOURI: For sure. For sure they must. 16 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Did you think he was going 17 18 to hit you? MR. CHAGHOURI: I really was afraid in the 19 20 beginning because he was -- he was not himself. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Yeah. 21 MR. CHAGHOURI: You could see that his eyes 22 were going all direction. He was kind of threatening, 23 but he didn't really come too close to me to the 24

20 counter. Like you know, he stopped like maybe four feet 1 2 away. 3 TROOPER CONNOLLY: Uh-huh (affirmative). 4 MR. CHAGHOURI: But I really don't know. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: And what did he say to 5 6 you again? 7 MR. CHAGHOURI: He says to me, "Joe, why you do 8 this to me? Why did you call the cops on me, man? I 9 just want to watch the Super Bowl tomorrow." 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So once he said that to 11 you, and you said he had the stick raised in the air? 12 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 13 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. Where were the officers? 14 MR. CHAGHOURI: The officers were outside 15 16 across of the door of the apartment. 17 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. 18 MR. CHAGHOURI: They had a little angle from 19 that waiting room window. 20 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Sure. 21 MR. CHAGHOURI: And I think they saw him, and 22 his brother saw him too. Then when he went back 23 inside, he must have not -- forgot to lock the door. 24 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Forgot to lock the door?

21 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. 1 2 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. MR. CHAGHOURI: Because -- because Anthony 3 comes in about five minutes later, and he says to me, 4 "The door is open." I said, "Great, bring the 5 officers. Let them go in." He said, "Dude, I don't 6 want to do that right now because I'm afraid, you know. 7 He doesn't want to come out. Just let me -- let me 8 wait it out. Let me see what we can do." And I guess 9 he was looking for his brother. When he went inside, 10 11 he didn't find him. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: When Anthony went inside 12 to try to look for Alan, were there any police officers 13 14 that went inside with him? MR. CHAGHOURI: No, no. 15 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: No? 16 MR. CHAGHOURI: No. He went by himself --17 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. 18 MR. CHAGHOURI: -- because the officers were 19 still at the other side outside. They were, you know, 20 at the main door area. They were not -- they probably 21 did not have clue that Al walked in for that 10 seconds 22 waving that stick and then went back in there. 23 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. 24

22 1 MR. CHAGHOURI: But I think one officer seen 2 him, the tall guy. 3 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: The tall quy. MR. CHAGHOURI: Tall quy. I think he seen him. 4 5 The one -- one of the first ones that were on the site. 6 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. You think he saw 7 Alan with the stick? 8 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. Probably he did. Probably he did. And I did mention that to them too. 9 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). MR. CHAGHOURI: I did mention that he came at 11 12 me with a stick. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: You told the officers 13 that? 14 MR. CHAGHOURI: Either -- either the officer or 15 Anthony was next to me. I don't know if he heard that. 16 17 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. MR. CHAGHOURI: But it's all on the 18 19 surveillance. Once you pull it, you'll be able to see 20 that. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Okay. So who got -- who 21 22 alerted the police to come into the house? MR. CHAGHOURI: I reckon it was Devin, his 23 roommate maybe, but we didn't know. To be honest with 24

you, we thought there's a warrant because Anthony says, 1 "The cops are here. They got a warrant on my brother." 2 So I say, "Warrant is simple. Just let him go with it, 3 and we'll bail him out, no problem." But he was, you 4 know, in psychic situation where he did not want to go 5 with nobody. Plus he opened the window, and he was 6 telling the officer, "Fuck you." He was talking bad 7 8 language. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Alan was? 9 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: What window did he open, 11 12 upstairs or downstairs? MR. CHAGHOURI: Downstairs, downstairs. And 13 him and the officer were outside like almost the screen 14 between them, and then he -- he closed the window glass 15 again after he told him, "Fuck you. You're not going 16 to get in here. This is my house," blah, blah, blah. 17 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So Alan opened the 18 downstairs window? 19 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. To communicate with the 20 21 officers. 2.2 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. MR. CHAGHOURI: Tell him, why you here? What 23 do you want from me? Blah, blah, blah. 24

24 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Was he yelling, or was 1 2 he just talking? MR. CHAGHOURI: He was -- he was yelling and 3 using foul language and --4 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: And again, if you could 5 just repeat, to the best of your recollection as to 6 what Alan was yelling at them. 7 MR. CHAGHOURI: Alan was telling him, "Fuck 8 you. You ain't going to take me. You want to take me, 9 you come into my house. You come in and arrest me." 10 And then the officer told him, "If I come in here, you 11 going to have some broken jaws and broken ribs and 12 stuff, so you don't want me to come in. You got to get 13 out." Because he did say that. I could -- I could 14 hear him, and Anthony heard that too as well. 15 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: And after that 16 conversation that they had, they're going back and 17 18 forth --MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 19 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: -- and Alan is yelling 20 "fuck you," you know --21 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 22 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: -- you're not taking me. 23 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 24

25 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: And the officer says you 1 don't want me to come in there. 2 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yeah. 3 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Alan closed the window 4 5 at that time? MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. Alan closed the window, 6 and I was assuming that the door was locked between me 7 and him, you know, the office. 8 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. 9 MR. CHAGHOURI: But Anthony comes and he says 10 to me, "He left the door open." I said, "Bring the 11 cops in there, and let's get it" --12 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Right, right. 13 MR. CHAGHOURI: You know, let's get it -- he 14 says to me, "I can't do that to him. Let me see. Let 15 me go in and talk to him." 16 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). 17 MR. CHAGHOURI: He goes inside, and he doesn't 18 find his brother. He calls, "Al, Al, Al," and then he 19 comes out. He says, "Al is not here." He said, "He 20 must have split from the window, from the rear window." 21 I did ask him. I say, "Was there no police behind on 22 the back?" He says to me, "I didn't see anybody 23 waiting behind." 24

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DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay.

2 MR. CHAGHOURI: So -- and then Anthony walks out. I'm still inside the office, sir. So I'm doing 3 -- I'm counting my cash and stuff for the shift. And 4 5 an officer comes in late on the scene, little heavy 6 weight --7 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). MR. CHAGHOURI: -- bald, and he comes running 8 9 out of his car. He parked his car all the way at the 10 end, and he's running. And he's going in the direction 11 where the Hummer is. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Where the Hummer is? 12 MR. CHAGHOURI: As if he knew that this guy is 13 14 going to be in that direction. 15 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. MR. CHAGHOURI: And he was running, and he asks 16 me, "How's this guy looks like?" I said, "Tall and 17 skinnv." 18 19 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yep. MR. CHAGHOURI: And then I go back inside for 20 not even 40 seconds. I come back outside. I see 21 Anthony running, screaming, "Oh, they killed my 22 brother. They killed my brother." So I was inside. I 23 24 didn't even hear the shots.

DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Didn't even hear any 1 2 shots? MR. CHAGHOURI: I didn't even hear the shots, 3 sir. I was just inside. And I came outside to see if 4 they got him or they found him, and then I see Anthony 5 running from that direction screaming and, you know, 6 crying. I was crying too when I heard that. 7 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). 8 MR. CHAGHOURI: He says, "A big pool of blood, 9 Joe," blah, blah, blah, sad. 10 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So did the police ever 11 come in through that unlocked door? 12 13 MR. CHAGHOURI: Never, never did. TROOPER CONNOLLY: Because you were in the 14 office that whole time; you would have known, right? 15 MR. CHAGHOURI: I was in the office. 16 17 Absolutely, absolutely. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: So they did not go in 18 19 Alan's apartment? MR. CHAGHOURI: They could not go, sir, because 20 he didn't give them access. They did not know that 21 this door on the inside was open when he came out at 22 23 me. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Right. Just Anthony 24

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1 went inside?

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2 MR. CHAGHOURI: Just Anthony was the only one 3 that figured that out.

DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah.

5 MR. CHAGHOURI: And he came out, and he told 6 me, "It's open, and nobody is there." I said, "Bring 7 the police in there."

8 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). 9 MR. CHAGHOURI: I said, "This is the time to 10 fucking end it, you know."

11 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Right.

MR. CHAGHOURI: I wish eh listened to me, man.
I wish -- I really wish. I wish he listened to me.
DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: I know. It's
unfortunate. Where was Anthony at the time of the
incident when you said you saw the bald-headed officer
come over and yell? What's he look like?

18 MR. CHAGHOURI: He was on the left side of the 19 building.

20 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Anthony was?
21 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes.
22 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay.
23 MR. CHAGHOURI: He was still talking to that
24 tall officer and a lot of other officers with -- I'm

1 sorry. Just one second.

DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. Go ahead. 2 3 MR. CHAGHOURI: (On phone) I'm almost done, daddy, okay. Yeah. Maybe 10 more minutes. Don't 4 worry. Don't worry about nothing. I'll come home 5 soon, okay. What time now? I don't know. It's 10:37. 6 I have two officers with me. I cannot talk now. Tell 7 mommy everything is fine, okay. Bye, bye. (Off phone) 8 9 Sorry, guys. DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: No. No problem at all. 10 So Anthony was outside near the two bays? 11 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes, yes, yes. Near the two 12 bays, and he was going back and forth to the office 13 and, you know, trying to -- he was calling his cousin 14 also, Macauley (phonetic) was a North Reading Police. 15 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Uh-huh (affirmative). 16 17 MR. CHAGHOURI: He was on the phone with him. I heard him telling him, you know, blah, blah, blah. 18 And just happened so fast. I see the officer, and then 19 I see the lady cop pulling her gun out when I walk 20 outside. I didn't even hear the shots, but I see the 21 beautiful young lady with a gun in her hand and running 22 toward that direction. And then I see another officer 23 with a gun, so they must have heard the gunshots --24

30 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Right, right. 1 MR. CHAGHOURI: -- and went right away to the 2 scene where the guy was. 3 DETECTIVE FITZGERALD: Okay. 4 TROOPER CONNOLLY: So after that officer ran by 5 the -- the bald officer runs by you, you tell him he's 6 7 tall and skinny --MR. CHAGHOURI: Tall and skinny, yeah. 8 TROOPER CONNOLLY: -- you go back to just 9 10 counting out --11 MR. CHAGHOURI: Yes. 12 TROOPER CONNOLLY: -- your cash? MR. CHAGHOURI: I go back inside. 2	He was well, the first thing I noticed, the the
3	lady cop had her gun up, and she was running when I
