SUBJECT: INTERVIEW OF OFFICER JOSEPH POIRIER, EVERETT POLICE DEPARTMENT

- 1. On 04-23-16, this officer interviewed Officer Joseph Poirier of the Everett Police Department at the Everett Police Detective Office, also present was Sgt Scott Stalbaum of the Everett Police.
- 2. Officer Poirier was working the evening shift on 04-21-16, when Mario Mejia Martinez was fatally shot by Officer Joseph Pepicelli at the intersection of Broadway/Chelsea/Norwood Streets in Everett.
- 3. Officer Poirier stated he responded as a backup to Officers Pepicelli and Dusablon who were responding to a call regarding a man with a knife outside the Cancun restaurant. Officer Poirier followed Officer Dusablon to the call proceeding south on Broadway toward the Cancun. While responding to the call, he heard officer Pepicelli over the radio saying "drop the knife, drop the knife"
- Upon arriving at the scene, Officer Poirier parked to the rear of Officer Pepicelli's cruiser, and Officer Dusablon pulled his cruiser toward the intersection. Officer Poirier stated he observed Officer Pepicelli retreating backwards into oncoming traffic, followed by a Hispanic male who was charging at him. Officer Poirier saw the glint of the knife blade in the suspects hand (he believed left hand) Officer Pepicelli discharged his firearm and the suspect went down Officers Sabella and MacGregor arrived and he and Officer Sabella provided cover as Office MacGregor removed the knife from the suspect's hand. Once the suspect was disarmed, first aid was provided to the suspect
